## **Port Louis Settlement**

NB: Prepared from available records. There are likely to be more burials for the period 1764 to 1832

On 8 March 1865 Arthur Bailey, the Surveyor General, reported that the wall enclosing the old cemetery and graves outside the same at Port Louis was in such a dilapidated state that he recommended an entirely new fence be put up, the old one removed and the new wall to be built on the foundations of the remaining portion of the old fence as he believed that there was a clause in Captain Packe's lease reserving the cemetery. He required a wall 6 feet high, 6 feet bottom and 3 feet at the top and recommended stone to be used in the place of turf at the angles. Also, a ditch 6 feet wide, 4 feet deep and 3 feet at the bottom. The extent of the fence required 162 yards with a ditch of 188 yards. Wood required was about 200 feet of scantling, 150 feet of wood for posts and about 600 battens to enclose them. At that time there were four graves with head boards of persons who belonged to the public service including Mathew Brisbane.

On 15 July 1865 Arthur Bailey measured the wall and ditch around the cemetery at Port Louis and the peat wall was 177 yards and the ditch 185 yards.
