I am directed by the Governor to inform you that it is His Excellency's wish that as soon as possible after the assumption of your duties as Postmaster you should take such steps as are necessary to ensure that in the absence of your express permission no Government Officials other than those of or assisting temporarily in your Department shall enter the mail sorting room or other rooms of the Post Office and that no member of the public shall be allowed access to any section of the Post Office other than that reserved for the public.

2. I am to add that it is further His Excellency's wish that you should make an order to the foregoing effect which should be posted prominently in the Post Office and in the corridor of the Town Hall.
