

CARROLL FAMILY

NB: The following is prepared from Falkland Islands Registers and files – there may be other family born outside the Falklands. Unless stated otherwise, all dated births, deaths and marriages occurred in the Falklands and all numbered graves are in Stanley Cemetery. Various spellings of names are recorded as written at the time.

Hugh CARROLL was born ? (*not in the Falkland Islands*).

Hugh was married to **Catherine McCANNA** (*not in the Falkland Islands*).

The 150-ton British Brigantine *Amelia* arrived 14 days out from Montevideo 10 September 1853 with four passengers, mails and 50 barrels of flour. The passage of **Catherine CARROLL** and children was £7. [FIC/ZO2; 69]

FIRST GENERATION

Children of Hugh and Catherine CARROLL:

1. **Mary CAROL** born circa 1845 (*not in Falkland Islands*). Mary, age 10, was on the return of the Government School 1 April 1855, could read and write and had missed 26 days Feb-Apr as she was kept by her parents to work. [H8].
2. **James CAROL** born circa 1847 (*not in Falkland Islands*). James, age 8, was on the return of the Government School 1 April 1855, could read but not write and had joined the school 9 April. [H8]
3. **Michael CAROL** born circa 1850 (*not in Falkland Islands*). Michael, age 5, was on the return of the Government School 1 April 1855, couldn't read or write and had joined the school 9 April. [H8]
4. **Thomas CARROLL** born 30 December 1855 in Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as tailor. Thomas, age 2 years and 4 months, died 15 May 1858 from inflammation of the bowels and was buried 16 May 1858 in Stanley Cemetery.
5. **Elizabeth CARROLL** born 18 November 1857 in Stanley. Her father's occupation was recorded as tailor.
