LLAMOSA FAMILY

NB: The following is prepared from Falkland Islands Registers and files – there may be other family born outside the Falklands. Unless stated otherwise, all dated births, deaths and marriages occurred in the Falklands and all numbered graves are in Stanley Cemetery. Any variations which may occur in the spellings of names are recorded as written in the records at the time.

1847 Jun 06: José LLAMOSAS, age 18, single and Spanish, arrived per Napoleon from

Montevideo to work for Lafone. [H8]

1851 Census: **José LLAMOSA**, age 24, gaucho.

Rosa GUAZARDO, age 29, sempstress, Spaniard

1852 Mar 26: **José LLAMOSA** registered himself as an alien. [H8]

1855 Sep 14: José LLAMOSA, a native of Spain, wife Rosa GALLARDO, and three children

(Mary G, Massiliana & Casimira), resident in Stanley, on list of registered aliens

returned to 14 September 1855. [H8]

1857 Jan 04: José CHAMOSA, Rosa GALLARDO, and three children (Mary G, Massiliana &

Casimira), arrived per Fairy from Monte Video, brought by the Falkland Islands

Company Ltd. [H14, pg 141]

1859 Sep 01: José LLAMOSO, wife and five children (Mary G, Massiliana, Casimira, Marcelina

& José Louis), arrived per Victoria from Montevideo, imported by the Falkland Islands Company Ltd. [D8] He re-rented his cottage (that he had vacated to go to

Monte Video) from the Company at £1 a month. [FIC J Lane]

1866 Mar 05: José CHAMOSA purchases Crown Grant 33, half an acre on the corner of

Fitzroy Road and Dean Street, fronting on to Fitzroy Road, for £28.

1866 Apr 03: José LLAMOSA is granted a licence to occupy a Station South of Elephant

Creek under the first clause of the Proclamation of the 4th April 1861 and paid into the sum of £5 Sterling. The Station bounded on the North by Elephant Creek to the fresh water, on the East by a line running South four miles, on the South by a line running West three and a half miles and on

the West by Station Middle Point in the occupation of Antonina Roxa.

1868 Apr 06: **José LLAMOSA** is granted a ten year lease of the same land at an annual rental

of £10 payable yearly in advance. Prior to this date he has built a house on the

land and stocked it.

1879 Aug 08: José CHAMOSA enters into an agreement with Timothy Robson that he

provides 12,000 acres of land for farming and grazing purposes to Timothy Robson in consideration of him placing upon the land 800 breeding Ewes after next shearing. The land and the ewes both worth £400. Timothy Robson to

manage the land and sheep.

1879 Aug 19:

José LLAMOSA is granted a twenty-one year lease of the same land from the 13 October 1870 at an annual rental of £6 per annum for the first 10 years and of 10 per annum for the remainder of the term, payable yearly in advance. The station is Section No 36 known as "Middle Point" and bounded as follows: On the East by a line running South four miles from the entrance of Elephant Creek on the South by a line running West 2 ½ miles to Smyley's Creek; on the South West by Smyley's Creek; on the West by Middle Bay; and on the North by Foul Bay.

1879 Sep 27: **José CHAMOSA**, farmer of Stanley, appoints James Felton his attorney.

1882 Sep 05: **José LLAMOSA**, late of Stanley, sells through his agent James Felton, the land and stock held in partnership to Timothy Robson for £400.

1882 Sep 20: **José LLAMOSA**, late of Stanley, sells through his agent James Felton, the land and buildings on Crown Grant 33 to James McLauchlan for £282.

1883 Apr 04: **José LLAMOSA** transfers the lease of his land, through his attorney James Felton, to Timothy Robson.

There is no record of when Rosa arrived in the Falkland Islands but a **Severo GALLARDO** arrived in the Falkland Islands per the *Vigilante* 11 November 1847, brought down by Mr Williams from Montevideo to work on Lafone's estate. Severo was brought down again by Mr Williams in the Russian Brig *Maire* in November 1850. [D5, pg 351] In his statement dated Saturday 1 November 1851 Severo states that Mr Williams had allowed him to visit his sister in Stanley. [H8, H13, pg 114, 115] As women and children weren't listed she may have accompanied him.

Rosa died 18 September 1867 in Stanley, age 48, from disease of the heart and was buried as Rosa GUALIARDO in Grave Ei446. She was recorded as a sempstress and native of Montevideo, South America. The informant was José Llamosa, who signed with an X, occupier of house Stanley.

There is no record found to date of when José Llamosa left the Falkland Islands, although it was presumably sometime after he appointed James Felton his attorney in September 1879. There is also no record found to date of where he went to or when he died.

FIRST GENERATION:

Children of José LLAMOSA and Rosa GALLIADA/LLAMOSA:

- Massiliana/Marsalina LLAMOSA born circa 1850 (no record in Falkland Islands) and baptised 29 December 1850 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as gaucho. Not in 1851 census. Died 3 October 1867 in Stanley, age 17/18 (records are unclear), from consumption and buried in Grave Ei445. Recorded as daughter of Jose Llamosa & Rosa Galliard.
- Maria Januara/Mary Ginababa CHAMOSA born 9 September 1852 in Stanley and baptised 13 January 1853 as Dorotea in Holy Trinity Church, Stanley. Her father's occupation was recorded as gaucho. Her mother was recorded as Rosa Gallardi. Mary was married, age 19, to Claro SUARES, gaucho from the River Plate, 4 October 1871 at Trinity Church Stanley according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Church of England by Banns by Charles Bull MA Colonial Chaplain. Claro was living in Darwin and Mary in Stanley at the time. The witnesses were George Short and Frances Atkins. Claro's father was recorded as Claro Suarez, soldier and Mary's as José Llamosa, farmer. Mary died 30 July 1888, age 36, in confinement at Salvador and was buried at San Salvador. Claro, age 45 and a shepherd, was married to (2) Amelia Jane HOPE née KELWAY, age 23 and a widow, 17 July 1890 in the house of Joseph Alazia according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Charles E Kelway and Edith Alazia. Claro's father was recorded as Mariano Suriez, gaucho and Amelia's as George Kelway, joiner. Claro died, 10 June 1904, age 60, of fatty degeneration of the heart and is buried at Salvador. Amelia married (3) P G CHILDS in Punta Arenas, Chile, 3 December 1910.
- 3. Claudia CHAMOSA born 14 January 1854 in Stanley and baptised 18 April 1854 as Clauria in Holy Trinity, Stanley. Her father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Her mother was recorded as Rosa Gallardi. Claudia died 13 April 1854 from bronchitis. Recorded as daughter of Jose Llamosa & Rosa Galliada. Buried as Clauria Gallarde (no grave number recorded; most likely with the other family members in Section Ei).
- 4. Casimira/Catherine LLAMOSA born circa 1855 (no record in Falkland Islands) and baptised 2 May 1855 in Holy Trinity Church, Stanley. Her father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Her mother was recorded as Rosa Gallarde. Casimira was married, age 19, to James PETALUGA, age 28 and a gaucho, 22 April 1874 in the Parish Church according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Henry C Lory Act Col Chaplain. The witnesses were John Dettleff and Peter Verela. James was living at Port Howard and Cassimira at Smyley's Village at the time. James' father was recorded as Andres Petaluga, circumstance independent, and Cassimira's as Joseph Llamosa, farmer. Cassiemeria died in childbirth 21 June 1881 and is buried in Grave Ei444. James married (2) Maryann BYRNE née PALVIER(?), age 41 and a widow, 21 March 1888 at Stanley at the house of Mr White according to the rites and ceremonies of the Church of Scotland By Governor's Licence by William Hill Philip Minister. The witness was Jane White. James was working as a shepherd in Stanley at the time. James died 2 October 1903 and is buried in Grave I665. Mary Ann died 17 March 1924 and is buried in Grave K897.
- 5. Marcelina LLAMOSA born circa 1856 (no record in Falkland Islands) and baptised 22 January 1858 in Holy Trinity Church, Stanley. Her father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Her mother was recorded as Rosa Gallarde. Baptised into the Catholic Church 2 March 1877. Marcelina was married to Dennis BUCKLEY 5 March 1877 in St Mary's Catholic Church. The witnesses were Martin Johnson and Emilie King. Dennis' father was recorded as John Buckley. Dennis was living in Stanley and Marcelina in Smyley's Village at the time of

the marriage. From 1877 until 1889 Dennis Buckley was involved in the buying of land then selling on after building houses on it. His various occupations over the years included mason, bricklayer, builder & contractor. In September 1894 he was landed with his son, Joseph, on Beauchene Island by the *Earl* to seal. He arrived back from Beauchene Island with his son 22 October 1894 on the *Chance*. Dennis was remanded to Stanley Gaol circa 1897 under Ordinance No 4 of 1894 – lunacy. Dennis died at 4am on 2 October 1897 in Stanley Gaol, age about 40, from aging (creeping) palsy and is buried in Grave A306. He left his wife and children destitute and dependant on public charity. The Falkland Islands Magazine of July 1898 asks for a subscription to purchase a sewing machine for Mrs Buckley so she could support her four children. Marcelina died 13 September 1903, age 46, from phthisis and is buried in Grave I664.

- 6. José Louis LLAMOSA born circa 1859 in Montevideo and baptised 13 October 1860 in Holy Trinity Church, Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as employed by Falkland Islands Company. His mother was recorded as Rosa Gallardi. He died 22 May 1875 at Smyley's Village, Smyley's Creek, age 16, from paralysis and was buried 3 June 1875 in Grave Ei442. He was recorded as a native of Montevideo.
- 7. Peter LLAMOSA born 3 April/May 1862 (some confusion over month in records) in Stanley and baptised Pedro 29 December 1862. His father's occupation was recorded as employee of the Falkland Islands Company. His mother was recorded as Rosa Llamosa. Peter was married, age 27 and a gaucho, to Elizabeth GOODWIN, age 16, 1 May 1889 in the house of Dennis Buckley according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Michael Dettleff and Elsie Kiddle. Both Peter and Elizabeth were living in Stanley at the time. Peter's father was recorded as Joseph Llamosa, sheep farmer and Elizabeth's as John Goodwin, shepherd. Elizabeth died 6 February 1926, age 53, from cancer of the uterus and was buried 9 February 1926 in Grave J934. Peter died 1 September 1944, age 82, and was buried 3 September 1944 in Grave J1281.

SECOND GENERATION:

Children of Mary (1) and Claro SUARES:

- Peter (Pedro) SUARES born 3 June 1872 at Port Sussex. His father's occupation was recorded as gaucho. Came in from San Carlos 25 June 1893. Departed for Montevideo on the *Denderah* 19 July 1893. Died 1 August 1893 in the English Hospital, Montevideo. [CM Sep 1893]
- 2. **Claro SUARES** born circa 1873 *(no record in Falkland Islands).* Died 28 March 1892, age 19, from phthisis and is buried at Salvador.
- 3. **Nicholas SUARES** born 28 September 1874 at San Carlos River and baptised 16 January 1875 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as gaucho. Nicholas started work for the Falkland Islands Company Limited in the Lafonia area 12 February 1911 on a monthly wage of £5-10-0. Nicholas, age 45 and a shepherd, died 11 December 1921 from a cerebral haemorrhage and is buried at Darwin.
- 4. **Elias SAURES** born 22 October 1875 at Salvador and baptised 21 January 1877 by St Mary's Church. The godparents were Alexander Pitaluga and Estanislada Paralta. Elias started working for the Falkland Islands Company Limited in the Lafonia area 19 October 1903 as a labourer on a monthly wage of £5-0-0. Elias, a shepherd, finished working for the Falkland Islands Company Limited in the Lafonia area 19 October 1907. Elias, age 33 and a shepherd living in Stanley, died 12 January 1909 from pulmonary phthisis and is buried in Grave 1699.
- 5. **Estanislada "Tiney" SUARES** born 14 September 1876 at San Salvador and baptised 21 January 1877 by St Mary's Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as gaucho. Estanislada died 6 January 1889, age 12, from phthisis and was buried in Grave A78. The family were living at Salvador at the time.
- Louisa SUARES born 7 October 1877 at San Salvador and baptised 16 May 1879 by St Mary's Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as gaucho. Louisa died 9 December 1879, age 2 years and 2 months, (no cause of death entered) and was buried at Salvador.
- 7. **Mary Ann (Marianna) SUARES** born 26 November 1878 at San Salvador and baptised 16 May 1879 by St Mary's Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as gaucho. Mary died 22 December 1888, age 9, of phthisis, and was buried in Grave A79. Her family were living at Salvador at the time.
- 8. **Louisa SUARES** born 10 February 1880 at San Salvador. Her father's occupation was recorded as gaucho. Louisa died 25 November 1888, age 9, from measles and convulsions and was buried at Salvador.
- 9. **Martina SAURES** born 2 September 1881 and baptised 20 December 1881 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as gaucho. Martina died 21 November 1888, age 7, from measles and subsequently bronchitis and was buried at Salvador.
- 10. Isabella "Bella" SUARIZ born 16 March 1884 and baptised 27 November 1884 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Bella left 23 June 1899 for England on the *Modestia* with Mrs Greenshields. Bella was taken to London. Bella was married to Frank BROCKHURST in 1906 in St Stephen's Church, Parish of Ealing and they then lived in Surrey. Frank was a dairyman and they owned a dairy shop in Church Street, Godalming. In 1912 Frank emigrated to Australia and Bella followed in 1913 with their two children. Bella became a nurse and midwife. Bella died in 1954 in Melbourne and her ashes are interred in the columbarium wall at St John's Anglican Church, Maffra, Victoria, Australia.

- 11. **Anna SURIEZ** born 2 August 1886 and baptised 3 August 1888 by Holy Trinity Church. Her godparents were William and Helen Bonner. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Anna died 16 June 1892, age 5 years and 10 months, from hip disease and is buried at Salvador.
- 12. **Joseph SUARES** born 30 July 1888 at San Salvador and baptised 2 August 1888 by Holy Trinity Church. His godparents were Fruitosa Miranda and Helen Bonner. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Joseph died 11 November 1888, age 3 months and 10 days, from measles and convulsions and is buried at Salvador.

Children of Casimira (4) and James PETALUGA:

- 1. Rosa PETALUGA born 5 May 1875 at Port Purvis, West Falkland. Rose was married to Andreas Donald PITALUGA (first cousin), sheep farmer, 22 September 1926 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Special Licence by M Craigie-Halkett, Registrar General. The witnesses were M Kelway and A I Fleuret. Andreas, age 52, died 25 February 1936 and was buried 28 February 1936 in Grave A1091. [Obituary Penguin 26 Feb 1936, pg 1; 27 Feb 1936, pg 1; 3 Mar 1936, pg 1-2] Rose emigrated to England in 1937 but her ashes were returned to the Falkland Islands and buried in her husband's grave.
- 2. James Andrew "Jim" PETALUGA born 29 July 1876 at Port Purvis, West Falkland. Navvy at Hill Cove. Jim was married to Ellen Stanbury LYES, age 19 of Hill Cove, 22 May 1899 in the house of Mr J Halliday according to the Rites & Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Edwin Coupland Aspinall Canon of Christ Church & Camp Chaplain. The witnesses were John Jardin Halliday and Rose Pitaluga. Jim died circa 1976 after turning 100 in Devon, England.
- 3. Mary Ellen PETALUGA born 6 March 1878 at Shag Cove, West Falkland. Mary was married to (1) Gaston Nicholas FLEURET, butcher age 22, 15 October 1894 in the house of Mr Richard N Goss according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Edwin C Aspinall Assistant Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Richard Goss and Rose Pitaluga. On 16 June 1903 Gaston went as a guide to three men belonging to the sealing schooner *Beatrice L Corkum* on a shooting trip in one of the schooner's boats. The boat overturned in Port William and Gaston and two others drowned [CM JUL 1903]. He is buried in Grave C261.
 - Mary was married to (2) **John George KELWAY**, mechanic, 22 July 1924 at Christ Church Cathedral by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Douglas Fleuret and Gladys Fleuret. John died 15 December 1920, age 64, and is buried in Grave Q1590. Mary died 20 November 1958 at Stanley and is buried in Grave Q1622.
- 4. Ada Margaret PETALUGA born 14 September 1879 at Shag Cove, West Falkland. Ada was married to Charles Henry SHORT, shepherd at New House, Douglas Station, 31 May 1899 in the house of Mr Blakeley at Sierra Montevideo according to the Rites & Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Richard Francis Short and Annie Maude Atkins. Ada was living at Sierra Montevideo, Douglas Station at the time. Ada died 23 October 1903 from peritonitis and is buried in Grave D321. Charles, manager of a sheep farm, died 1 June 1951 and is buried in Grave 1453.
- **5. Henry John PITALUGA** born 21 June 1881 at San Carlos. Died 20 January 1882 in Stanley from convulsions (*no burial record*).

Children of Marcelina (5) and Dennis BUCKLEY:

- 1. Joseph Dennis BUCKLEY born 13 March 1878 in Stanley and baptised 5 April 1878 by St Mary's Church. His father's occupation was recorded as a bricklayer. In September 1894 Joseph was landed with his father on Beauchene Island by the *Earl* to seal. Joseph arrived back from Beauchene Island with his father 22 October 1894 on the *Chance*. Had gone to the front prior to September 1915? (see Peter Buckley). Joseph, age 37 and a butcher living in Havelock, Marlborough, was married to Kathleen BLACK, age 22 and born in Hastings, living in Christchurch, 15 January 1916 in the Registrar's Office, Christchurch, New Zealand. Joseph's father was recorded as John Dennis Buckley and his mother as Mazeline Buckley formerly Chamosa. Kathleen's father was recorded as William Black and her mother as May Black formerly Macarthy.
- 2. **Mary Frances BUCKLEY** born 13 October 1879 in Stanley and baptised 26 October 1879. Her father's occupation was recorded as a bricklayer. Mary was married, age 25, to **James MUISE**, age 28 and a cook, 5 July 1905 at St Mary's Roman Catholic Chapel, Stanley by Special Licence by Mario Louis Migone. The witnesses were Carlos Ovrlettd and Ada Buckley. James' father was recorded as Joseph Muise, cook. James gave his notice to the FIC Ltd that he wished to quit at Darwin Harbour at the end of April 1907. Mary died 28 January 1911, age 30, of puerperal fever and pneumonia and is buried in Grave I731. James, who was born in Yarmouth, Nova Scotia, 11 September 1874, left for England in 1924 to continue a seafaring life.
- 3. Rosa Martha BUCKLEY born 8 December 1881 in Stanley and baptised 10 December 1882 by St Mary's Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as a bricklayer. Rosa was married to Charles Marien MELIN 31 January 1900 at the Registry Office, Fox Bay by G Hurst, Registrar. The witnesses were John Fawkes Bird and Charles Michael Long. Charles' father was recorded as Daniel Melin.
- 4. **Andrew John BUCKLEY** born 11 March 1883 in Stanley and baptised 12 March 1883 by St Mary's Church. His father's occupation was recorded as a bricklayer. Had gone to the front prior to September 1915? (see Peter Buckley).
- Kathleen (Catherine) Anne BUCKLEY born 6 October 1884 in Stanley and baptised 23
 December 1884 by St Mary's Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as a bricklayer.
 Died 22 August 1885 in Stanley, age 10 months, from cold and convulsions and is buried in
 Grave A93.
- 6. **Ellen Dorothy BUCKLEY** (*twin*) born 17 December 1885 in Stanley and baptised 17 December 1885 by St Mary's Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as a builder. Died 27 January 1886, age 5 weeks, from inanition and is buried in Grave A93.
- 7. **Rachel Lucy BUCKLEY** (*twin*) born 17 December 1885 in Stanley and baptised 17 December 1885 by St Mary's Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as a builder. Died 26 June 1888, age 2 ½, from acute bronchitis (*no burial record*).
- 8. Ada Alice BUCKLEY born 14 December 1886 in Stanley and baptised 24 December 1887 by St Mary's Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as a contractor. Ada, a domestic for Mrs Cameron at San Carlos, was accidentally drowned in the Rio Pedro near Douglas Station 14 July 1905, age 18, when returning home on horseback from her sister's wedding in Stanley. Her body was recovered Sunday 16 July 1905 and she was buried 21 July 1905 at Douglas Station. [CM Aug 1905 pg 3]

- Emily Malvina BUCKLEY born 8 May 1888 in Stanley and baptised 15 June 1888 by St Mary's Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as a contractor. Died 18 June 1888 from inanition (no burial record).
- 10. Peter Frederick BUCKLEY born 13 May 1889 in Stanley and baptised 28 July 1889 by St Mary's Church. His father's occupation was recorded as a builder. According to the Church Magazine of September 1915, he passed through Stanley on the *Orissa* on his way to the front and his brothers had already gone. On the 1914-1918 Roll of Honour.
- 11. **Bertha Agnes BUCKLEY** born 15 October 1890 and baptised 16 November 1890 by St Mary's Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as a builder. Died 11 August 1898, age 7, from tubercular meningitis and is buried in Grave A80.
- 12. Louis Mark BUCKLEY born 13 June 1892 in Stanley and baptised 17 July 1892 by St Mary's Church. His father's occupation was recorded as a builder. Died 10 December 1892, age 6 months, from tabes mesenterica, and is buried in Grave A93.
- 13. **Bernard Ernest BUCKLEY** born 7 January 1894 and baptised 25 February 1894. His father's occupation was recorded as a builder. According to the Church Magazine of May 1915, he was living on the Coast and passed through Stanley recently to enlist in England for the front. On the 1914-1918 Roll of Honour. In May 1921 Bernard advertised for sale a large brick building in the centre of town with the reason for selling that the owner was going to Europe. He gave his contact address as Casilla 267, Punta Arenas. [FIM May 1921]
- 14. **Philip Edward BUCKLEY** born 7 August 1895 and baptised 3 November 1895 by St Mary's Church. His father's occupation was recorded as a builder. Philip, a labourer, was in October 1921 engaged to work on the ss *Falkland*. Philip was married to **Eveline Lily PECK** 6 September 1926 at St Mary's Roman Catholic Chapel, Stanley by Banns by Mario Louis Migone, Priest in Charge. The witnesses were Andrew Roger Peck, Mary Peck and Bertram Hogan Peck. Eveline's father was recorded as William Peck, constable. Philip and Eveline emigrated to the UK in 1949.
- 15. Child BUCKLEY born 24 June 1897. Died, age 6 days, 29 June 1897.

Children of Peter (7) and Elizabeth LLAMOSA:

- Peter CHAMOSA born 31 July 1889 in Stanley and baptised 20 August 1889 by Holy Trinity Church. Peter died 22 September 1890 at Dunbar Harbour from meningitis and buried in Grave Ei447.
- 2. William John "Bill" LLAMOSA born 26 August 1891 in Quile Ake, Argentina and baptised 12 March 1893 by Christ Church Cathedral, Falkland Islands. Bill first worked on Saunders Islands for 3 ½ years before working for Port Howard Farm for 56 years, over 50 of them alone at the Warrah. [Account of retirement from Port Howard FI Monthly Review 6 July 1964] Bill, a shepherd, retired to Australia in 1966. [Account of leaving FI Monthly Review 6 June 1966]
- 3. George Alexander LLAMOSA born 1 July 1893 in Patagonia, Argentina and baptised 3 December 1893 by Christ Church Cathedral. George worked for Port Howard Farm for 55 years, 25 of them at Purvis. [Account of retirement from Port Howard FI Monthly Review 6 July 1964] George, a farm worker, died 29 May 1979 in Stanley and is buried in Grave U1944.

Elsie was married to James Watson Cranmer PECK, shepherd, 6 August 1925 at Pebble Island, West Falkland by Special Licence by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were William D N Betts and Hyacinth Emily Betts. James' father was recorded as John Peck, gardener. [Account of wedding FI Magazine October 1925] James died 19 January 1980 at Stanley and is buried in Grave U1952. Elsie died 20 May 1989, age 88, and is buried in Grave U1953.

Arthur was married to **Rosina Winifred LEE** 22 April 1929 at Port Howard, West Falklands by Special Licence by S E E Aylward, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Edwin Thomas Lee and Ellen Elizabeth Smith. Rosina's father was recorded as Edwin James Lee, shepherd.
- 8. **Beatrice Maud LLAMOSA** born 4 June 1907 on Saunders Island. Beatrice was married to (1) **Francis George "Frank" PERRING**, shepherd, 19 May 1928 at Port Howard, West Falkland by Special Licence by S E E Aylward, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Frederick George Berntsen and Ellen Elizabeth Smith. Frank's father was recorded as George John Friend Perring, mariner. Frank died 30 October 1948 at Port Howard, age 47, from natural causes (no burial record). Beatrice was married to (2) **Robert Petrie CRAIG**, shepherd, 23 February 1951 at Port Howard, West Falkland by D M Pole-Evans, JP. The witnesses were S P Johnson and G M Peck. Robert's father was recorded as Andrew Petrie Craig, farm labourer. Robert and Beatrice emigrated to the UK in 1951.
