

MAGUIRE/McGUIRE FAMILY

NB: The following is prepared from Falkland Islands Registers and files – there may be other family born outside the Falklands. Unless stated otherwise, all dated births, deaths and marriages occurred in the Falklands and all numbered graves are in Stanley Cemetery. Various spellings of names are recorded as written at the time.

PATRICK MAGUIRE:

Patrick MAGUIRE was born circa 1813 (*not in the Falkland Islands*) to **James** and ? **MAGUIRE**.

Peter McGUIRE was off the schooner *Alonzo* and refused to proceed on board due to the schooner being unseaworthy March 1846 and was one of the signatures on an address ridiculing the Magistrate dated 27 June 1846 and one of a group of residents who signed a testimonial to the governor, Governor Richard C Moody, complimenting him on his service to the Colony.. [H4; p18: C2; 155] Peter McGUIRE was recorded in the census taken 12 October 1846 as being age 31, a labourer and householder. [Vol D2, pg 233]

Peter MAGUIRE was selected from a List of Constables for the preservation of the Queen's Peace 3 April 1847. Private McGUIRE was recorded as a member of the Company of Infantry of Military Force of the Falkland Islands 30 December 1847. [H5: E2; 150]

Peter McGUIRE was selected from the List of Constables for preservation of the Queen's Peace 10 January 1848; was one of the signatures on a petition to the Governor regarding conditions August 1848; and was private in the Militia Force of the Falkland Islands required to meet at the Flagstaff 6 November 1848. [H6: C4; 35: E2; 188]

Patrick McGUIRE, bachelor of full age, was married to **Douglass GRAHAME**, spinster of full age of the parish Administer, North Broken, 28 January 1850 in the Parish of the Holy Trinity by Banns by James Leith Moody, Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were John Smith and Edward McMurray. Both Patrick and Douglass signed with a X. There is no information found to date on when Douglass arrived but she may have been related to a **John GRAHAME**, a 36 year old upholsterer, who died 13 October 1849 from general debility and was buried 14 October 1849 (*no grave number recorded*).

Patrick McGUIRE was appointed gardener at Government House 1 February 1850 on an annual salary of £52.

In the 1851 census taken 22 February 1851 the McGUIRE family are listed as Peter McGUIRE, age 33, Government Gardener, from Ireland and Douglas McGUIRE, age 26, wife, from Scotland.

On 2 September 1853 Peter McGUIRE holds a licence to keep dogs in Stanley. [E4] On 20 October 1853 Patrick MacGUIRE purchased Crown Grant 21 containing 24 perches for £8 being "*Bounded on the North by a portion of Town Lot number three one hundred links on the west by a portion of Town Lot number two one hundred and fifty links on the South by John Street one hundred links and in the East by a portion of Town Lot number four one hundred and fifty links*". [BUG-REG-1; 130]

In consideration of giving up the house he occupied his gardener's salary was raised from 1st August 1854 from £52 to £60 a year. In 1854 Pat McGUIRE donates 5 shillings towards the upkeep of the orphan Susan Reddie. [H8]

On 11 August 1856 Patrick MAGUIRE, gardener of Stanley, purchased part of Crown Grant 2 for £6 being 12 perches *“bounded on the North by the holding of Arthur Bailey Esquire thirty three feet on the West by the holding of Jacob Napoleon Goss Ninety nine feet on the South having a frontage of thirty three feet to John Street and on the East by a portion of Town Lot Number three Ninety nine feet”*. On 22 December 1856 Patrick purchased Crown Grant 35 containing one acre with a frontage to Fitzroy Road for £26. [BUG-REG-1; 144, 156]

Patrick McGUIRE is reappointed gardener at Government House 11 February 1857 by the Governor on an annual salary of £60.

In July 1859 Patrick sent through the Falkland Islands Co Ltd £5-0-6 to James MAGUIRE care of Wm Fagrus, Grocer, Bishop St, Londonderry. [FIC/E1; 87]

Peter McGUIRE was recorded in the census taken 22 February 1851 as being age 33 and a government gardener from Ireland. Douglas was recorded as being age 26 and from Scotland.

On 26 July 1861 a trust assignment was signed *“Patrick McGuire, with the consent of his wife, Douglas Graham, made over to the said Colonial Chaplain and Colonial Surgeon for the time being the whole of his property in Stanley in Trust for the children, James, Elizabeth and Archibald McGuire, to be by them held till of age. The said Patrick McGuire to have occupation and benefit thereof till the said children are of age.”* [BUG-REG-1; 231] This was later cancelled by order of the court. Duglis McGUIRE, age 35 and the wife of Patrick, died in Stanley 26 July 1861 from water on the chest and was buried 29 July 1861 in Grave D 323.



On 13 January 1864 Captain Boyd of the barque *Velocidade* was given permission to “*carry the family of **McGUIRE** to England*” by Governor Mackenzie. [D11, pg 230]

On 31 March 1865 Patrick McGUIRE, gardener of Stanley, sold Crown Grant 21, including the house and buildings, and Crown Grant 2 for £130. [BUG-REG-1; 281]

During 1866 Patrick MAGUIRE was working for £60 a year, pro rata as gardener at Government House. In a letter dated 13 November 1866 5/- a day was to be deducted from the wages Patrick Maguire for each day that he remained away from work without leave. [D12; 327]

Patrick McGUIRE, age 58 and a labourer, died in Stanley 22 January 1871 from a diseased liver and was buried 24 January 1871 (*no grave number recorded; possibly buried in Section D near his wife Duglis and sister Martha*).

MARTHA MAGUIRE:

Martha MAGUIRE was born 1 July 1843 in Londonderry, Ulster, Ireland to **James** and ? **MAGUIRE**. Martha possibly came to the Falkland Islands with her brother after his trip to England in 1864. Martha, age 24 from Londonderry, Ireland, was married to **William COULSON**, age 24 and a sailor from Peterborough, England, 2 July 1866 at Trinity Church Stanley according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Church of England after Banns by Charles Bull MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were John Stephens and Louisa Ann Goss. William's father was recorded as Joshua Coulson, shepherd and Martha's father was recorded as James Maguire, labourer. Martha, age 29, died 8 January 1871 and was buried 10 January 1871 in Grave D342.

FIRST GENERATION:

Children of Patrick (1) and Douglass McGUIRE:

1. **James MAGUIRE** born 19 September 1851 and baptised 19 October 1851 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as gardener. James, age 19 and a shepherd, departed London on board the *Athole* at 6pm on 29 February 1868, arriving Stanley 13 June 1868, under contract to the Falkland Islands Company Limited. [FIC/C1; 361: H26; 25] He received an advance from The Company of £10-10-0 and was earning a monthly wage of £3-6-8. This rose to £3-10-10 a month from June 1869 and £3-15-0 a month from June 1870. James withdrew a cash order for £23-12-5 being the balance of his account with the Falkland Islands Company Limited at the end of March 1871. He finished work with The Company 24 May 1871 with a balance withdrawn of £2-6-10. On 29 September 1887 James MAGUIRE and Eliza WICKMAN, brother and sister and surviving heirs to the property of Patrick Maguire both living in Stanley, towards the performance of his last Will and Testament agreed to the division of Crown Grant 34 and Crown Grant 35 with James to hold :- Crown Grant 34 being the East part of Lot 9 West ½ of Lot 8 bounded On the North by the Fitzroy Road 108 ¾ links, On the South by Crown Land 108 ¾ links, On the West by part of No 9 aforesaid 726 links, And on the East half of No 8 now in the possession of Mr Geo Smith 726 links, also the Cottage situated thereon and one inner pantry in lean-to adjoining. On the same day James appointed William COULSON to be his attorney during his absence. On 30 September 1887 James sold one half of his property in Stanley to William COULSON for £100 to be held jointly. James departed overseas on board the *Herodot* 12 April 1892. On 12 May 1892 William COULSON as attorney for James sold the inner pantry in lean-to adjoining for £10 to the purchaser of Crown Grant 35. [BUG-REG-4; 17, 19, 326] James returned on board the *Neko* 20 Aug 1892. James arrived from West Falkland 10 August 1898 on board the *fair Rosamond* and departed overseas on board the *Theben* 2 September 1898, returning 22 September 1898 on board the *Itauri*. James, age 47 and a shepherd, died on Douglas Station 12 August 1899 from a strangulated hernia and exhaustion and was buried there. On 20 August 1889 William COULSON appointed George TURNER as administrator of the James' estate. [BUG-REG-5; 293] On 15 May 1892 George sold the property for £250. [BUG-REG-6; 14]
2. **Elizabeth "Eliza" McGUIRE** born 22 May 1853 in Stanley and baptised 1 July 1853 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as gardener. Eliza was married to **Matthew WICKMAN** (*not in the Falkland Islands*). On 29 September 1887 James MAGUIRE and Eliza WICKMAN, brother and sister and surviving heirs to the property of Patrick Maguire both living in Stanley, towards the performance of his last Will and Testament agreed to the division of Crown Grant 34 and Crown Grant 35 with Eliza to hold :- that part of No 9 bounded as follows:- On the North by the Fitzroy Road 100 links, On the South by Crown Land 100 links, On the West by land of Mr Dean 726 links, And on the East by land of J Maguire 726 links, also the larger dwelling house situated thereon. On 17 January 1888, Eliza, a widow living in Stanley, sold Crown Grant 35 for £250. [BUG-REG-4; 17, 27] Eliza, widow was married to **Thomas Edward AGUYLAR** (*not in the Falkland Islands*). Thomas was from London, England. Eliza, Thomas and Jessie went to Gloucester, England. Eliza died there and was buried in Saint Mary the Virgin Church Cemetery in Fretherne. (NB: *The Falkland Islands Magazine of October 1904 reported that she died 24 August 1904 in Buenos Aires, Argentina.*)
3. **Archibald "Archie" McGUIRE** born 28 November 1858. His father's occupation was recorded as gardener. Archie, age 20 and a shepherd, died 29 November 1878 (*no grave number recorded; possibly buried in Section D near his mother Duglis and aunt Martha*). The informant was his uncle, William Coulson.

Children of Martha (2) and William COULSON:

1. **Fanny COULSON** born 28 March 1867 in Stanley. Her father's occupation was recorded as seaman. Fanny was married to **Henrich "Henry" HENRICKSEN**, labourer, 1 June 1889 in the house of William Coulson according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were William Coulson and Henry B L Jameson. Henrich's father was recorded as Henrich Henricksen, farmer. Henry died 9 July 1906 in Essex County Asylum, Brentwood, England. [FIM Oct 1906] Fanny, a housewife, died 30 December 1947 and was buried 1 January 1948 in Grave J1367.
2. **Alice Cecily COULSON** born 27 May 1869 in Stanley and baptised 19 July 1869 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as seaman. Alice, age 26, was married to **Hermann Louis Maximillian DOHERR**, age 25 30 July 1895 by Mario Louis Migone, St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. The witnesses were William J Coulson and Mabel R Roberts. Hermann's father was recorded as Karl Doherr of Germany. By April 1918 Alice was living at Calle Dungeness 1426, Buenos Aires, Argentina.

SECOND GENERATION:

Children of Eliza (1) (2) and Matthew WICKMAN:

1. **Douglas Maria WICKMAN** born 27 June 1884 (*not in the Falkland Islands*) and baptised 28 June 1888 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. Her godparents were recorded as Robert Yates and Anna Drennen. Douglas was known as Dolores in Argentina. Dolores was married to (1) ? **TALLENT**. Dolores was married to (2) **José Maria LORENZO** in Buenos Aires. José was from Spain.

Children of Eliza (1) (2) and Thomas AGUYLAR:

1. **Jessie Elizabeth AGUYLAR** born 26 April 1896 (*not in the Falkland Islands*).
2. **Girl AGUYLAR**

Children of Fanny COULSON (2) (1):

1. **Frederick COULSON** born 12 June 1886 and baptised 25 June 1886 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's name was not recorded. As **Frederick HENRICKSEN**, Frederick was married to **Edvie Margaret HARRIES** 27 June 1917 at The Moro, Douglas Station by Governor's Licence by C McDonald Hoble, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Joseph Harries, Henry Henricksen and Mary Harries. Frederick's father was recorded as Henry Henricksen, deceased carpenter and Edvie's as Joseph Harries, mariner. Frederick, a shepherd at

Mount Pleasant, died at Mount Pleasant 24 April 1932 from carcinomatous metastasif and was buried 29 April 193 in Grave K1031. Edivie died 14 August 1939 from muscular dystrophy, age 44, and was buried 15 August 1939 in Grave K1139.

2. **Albert COULSON** born 22 March 1889 in the house of William Coulson in Stanley and baptised **Albert HENRICKSEN** 23 June 1889 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's name was not recorded in the birth register but was recorded as Henrich Henricksen in the baptism register. As **Albert HENRICKSEN**, Albert was married to **Lilian Mabel PECK** 4 August 1915 at Christ Church Cathedral by C McDonald Hobley, Chaplain. The witnesses were W Peck Senior, Fred Henricksen and M S Henricksen. Albert's father was recorded as Henry Henricksen, carpenter and Lilian's as John Peck, gardener. Albert died 4 March 1942 and was buried 7 March 1942 in Grave O1209. Lilian married (2) **Herbert Hugh HARDY**, shoe-repairer, 2 September 1947 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by J E Hamilton, Registrar General. The witnesses were Priscilla Mabel Henricksen and Andrew Roger Peck. Herbert died 30 September 1960 at Stanley and is buried in Grave S1679. Lilian emigrated to the UK in 1961.
3. **Leslie Williamson "Martin" HENRICKSEN** born 10 February 1909 and baptised **Leslie Martin HENRICKSEN** 18 February 1915. His father's name was not recorded in the birth register but was recorded as Andres Williamson, occupation navy, in the baptism register. Martin, a farm worker, died 20 January 1972 in Stanley and was buried 22 January 1972 in Grave U2182.

Children of Fanny (2) (1) and Henrich HENRICKSEN:

- i. **Ann Elizabeth "Annie" HENRICKSEN** born 23 November 1890 in Stanley and baptised 26 December 1890 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Annie was married to **George PERRY**, police constable, 22 February 1916 at St Mary's Roman Catholic Chapel, Stanley by Mario Louis Migone. The witnesses were D J O'Sullivan and S Mary Ussher. George's father was recorded as Hugh Perry, labourer. George, a retired caretaker from England, died 5 April 1963 in Stanley, age 72, and was buried 7 April 1963 in Grave S1736. Ann died 8 May 1985 and was buried in Grave V3034.
- ii. **Louisa HENRICKSEN** born 9 March 1892 in Stanley and baptised 3 May 1892 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Louisa was married to **Kenneth John McDONALD**, shepherd, 17 May 1916 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were John Coish Steel and Maria Henricksen. Kenneth's father was recorded as Roderick McDonald, deceased labourer.
- iii. **Margaret Lilian "Lily" HENRICKSEN** born 7 August 1893 and baptised 10 November 1893 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Margaret was married to **William Charles BROWNING**, labourer, 31 March 1931 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by Fredk S Vaughan, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Fred Browning and Kathleen Perry. William's father was recorded as Frederick Browning, farmer. William, retired foreman and BEM, died 18 May 1966, age 65, and was buried 20 May 1966 in grave T2050. Margaret died 15 September 1980 in Stanley and was buried 19 September 1980 in Grave T2051.
- iv. **Maria Sylvia HENRICKSEN** born 29 October 1894 and baptised 17 March 1895 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Maria was married to **Frederick ALLAN**, labourer, 30 January 1932 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Registrar General's Licence by M Craigie Halkett, Ag Registrar General. The witnesses were Charles

Goss Allan and Martin Henrickson. Frederick's father was recorded as Robert John Allan, deceased. Frederick, a mason, died 16 November 1960, age 65 and was buried 19 November 1930 in Grave O1684. Maria died 31 July 1964 in Stanley and was buried 4 August 1964 in Grave T2013.

- v. **Henrick Arnold "Toby" HENRICKSEN** born 11 January 1899 and baptised **Henry Arnold** 8 February 1899 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as carpenter. Employee of Dean Brothers. Toby drowned himself while of unsound mind 28 December 1935 and is buried on Pebble Island.
- vi. **Isabella Helena "Lena" HENRICKSEN** born 8 February 1900 and baptised 2 May 1900 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Isabella was married to (1) **David Noah KIDDLE**, labourer, 9 May 1929 at Christ Church Cathedral by Special Licence by S E E Aylward, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Martin Henricksen and Maria Sylvia Henricksen. David's father was recorded as Noah Kiddle, labourer. David, a gardener, died 15 April 1931, age 54, after an operation and was buried 19 April 1931 in Grave J1019. Isabella, a widow, was married to (2) **David George GOODWIN**, widower and shepherd, 5 September 1937 at Chartres, West Falkland by Registrar General's Licence by William Henry Luxton, Justice of the Peace. The witnesses were E Rutter and B Hardy. David's father was recorded as John Goodwin, shepherd. David, a retired farmworker, died 4 June 1975 in Stanley, age 65, and was buried 30 May 1975 in Grave U1849.
- vii. **Cyril William HENRICKSEN** born 11 May 1904 in Stanley and baptised 22 February 1905 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Cyril, a labourer, was married to **Agnes LEHEN**, certified nurse, 19 November 1929 at St Mary's Roman Catholic Chapel, Stanley by Banns by Mario Louis Migone, Priest in Charge. The witnesses were E J McAtasney, D Lehen and J Lehen. Agnes's father was recorded as Dan Lehen, head carter, Colonial Government. Agnes and Cyril retired to the UK in 1963.
- viii. **Lester Charles HENRICKSEN** born 7 July 1906 and baptised **Charles Leicester** 17 October 1906 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Lester, a labourer, went to Montevideo, Uruguay on holiday in 1944.

Children of Alice (2) and Hermann DOHERR:

- 1. **Alice Marie Augusta DOHERR** born 6 May 1896 and baptised 23 June 1896 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as painter. Alice was married to **Pedro PEREZ** 1 April 1918 in Buenos Aires. [Account of wedding FI Magazine Dec 1918]
- 2. **Flora Caroline Martha DOHERR** born 21 June 1899 and baptised 1 August 1899 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Flora died 4 August 1899 from inanition and was buried 4 August 1899 in Grave D343.
- 3. **Stella Ann Clara DOHERR** born 8 December 1900 and baptised 13 January 1901 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as mariner.

THIRD GENERATION:

Children of Frederick (2) (1) (1) and Edvie HENRICKSEN:

1. **Edvie Gladys HENRICKSEN** born 16 December 1917 at the Estancia and baptised 23 December 1917 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Edvie, a domestic servant, was married to **Stanley Donald George McASKILL**, mineral plant operator, 11 June 1951 at the United Free Church (Tabernacle), Stanley by Walter Forrest McWhan, Minister. The witnesses were Donald McAskill and Mrs E Andreasen. Stanley's father was recorded as Donald William McAskill, labourer. Stanley, a clerk, died 15 July 1973 in Stanley from chronic renal failure and diabetes mellitus, age 43, and was buried 19 July 1973 in Grave 1810.

1. **John Henry HENRICKSEN** born 6 December 1915 at Teal Inlet and baptised 21 August 1916 by Christ Church Cathedral.
2. **Albert James HENRICKSEN** born 12 January 1918 at San Carlos South and baptised 28 January 1918 by Christ Church Cathedral. Labourer. Albert was married to **Winnifred Mary Elizabeth HANSEN** 27 September 1947 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by J E Hamilton, Registrar General. The witnesses were Mrs Lilian Hardy and Herbert Hugh Hardy. Albert died 29 July 1979 at Stanley and was buried 1 August 1979 in Grave U1946. Winnifred died 29 September 2002, age 78, at Stanley.
3. **Priscilla Mabel HENRICKSEN.**
4. **Neil Stanley HENRICKSEN** born 21 June 1933 and baptised 9 July 1933 by Christ Church Cathedral. Neil, a seaman, died 2 December 1962 at Stanley from diabetes mellitus and was buried 5 December 1962 in Grave Q1727.

Children of Ann (2) (1) (i) and George PERRY:

1. **Kathleen Gladys PERRY** born 17 July 1916 in Stanley. Her father's occupation was recorded as police constable. Kathleen was married to (1) **Maurice Wright McGILL**, farmer, 22 August 1938 at St Mary's Catholic Church, Stanley by Special Licence by Hugh F Drumm, RC Priest. The witnesses were E J McAtasney, L V Perry and M Duffin. Maurice's father was recorded as William McGill, shepherd, and Kathleen's father was recorded as George Perry, hotel proprietor. Kathleen, a widow and town clerk, was married to (2) **William Blyth BERNTSEN**, divorced handyman, 24 December 1971 at No 10 Fitzroy Road, Stanley by Harold Bennett, Registrar General. William's father was recorded as Alexander Berntsen, deceased handyman. Kathleen's father was recorded as George Perry, deceased caretaker. Bill died 17 April 1997

Children of Maria (2) (1) (iv) and Frederick ALLAN:

1. **John ALLAN** born 8 November 1932. John, a donkeyman on sv *John Biscoe*, was married to **Joyce Ena McCARTHY** 6 May 1953 at St Mary's Roman Catholic Church, Stanley by J Ireland (Right Rev Mgr) Prefect Apolostic. The witnesses were Neil Stanley Henricksen and Ellen McCarthy. John's father was recorded as Frederick Allan, mason, and Joyce's father was recorded as Charles McCarthy, storekeeper. John died 5 February 2013 and was buried 16 February 2013 in Grave W3487.
