

RUDD FAMILY

NB: The following is prepared from Falkland Islands Registers and files – there may be other family born outside the Falklands. Unless stated otherwise, all dated births, deaths and marriages occurred in the Falklands and all numbered graves are in Stanley Cemetery. Various spellings of names are recorded as written at the time.

John Rogers RUDD was born circa 1827 in Exeter, England to ? and **Ann RUDD**.

John, age 14, left Teignmouth, Devon in October 1841. [C4; 125:H7]

John RUDD and **Henry BOND** signed a contract as domestics to **John Bull WHITINGTON**, settler at Anson, for a period of twelve months on 1 January 1844. They were to receive £10 per annum paid in monthly instalments of eight shillings ten pence on the first of each month as well as good and sufficient clothing, board and lodging. He was also to provide both boys passage to England at the expiration of their servitude if they then required or desired to leave the Islands. In a certificate dated 5 January 1844 Benjamin Willocks, the acting master of the British Schooner *Princess Royal* certified that the two boys John Rudd and Henry Bunn left the vessel with his consent on 1 January 1844. [H2; 180, 181]

On 25 January 1846 John wrote to his mother in Exeter and told her that he was living in Stanley with **Jacob GOSS** and **William WILLIAMS** who were his only friends there. [C4; 125:H7]

John was recorded in the census taken 12 October 1846 as a labourer and householder. [D2, 232]

On 8 July 1847 and 12 January 1848 John was recorded as a settler entitled to take seal, whale, whalebone and fish. On 30 December 1847 he was a private in the Company of Infantry of Military Force of the Falkland Islands. [E2; 134, 150, 151]

In May 1848 **Anne RUDD**, John's mother and a widow, wrote to the Colonial Secretary from 11 Long Brook Street, Exeter requesting information saying that the last letter she had had from John was dated 25 January 1846. [C4; 125:H7]

In October 1848 John was eligible to serve as a special constable. [C4; 78] On 6 November 1848 John was a private in the Militia Force of the Falkland Islands and required to meet at the Flagstaff, Stanley. [E2; 188]

In the Census taken 22 February 1851 John was recorded as age 23 and a labourer from England.

John was married to **Ellen ROACH** 16 August 1852 in the Parish of the Holy Trinity by Banns with consent of parents by James Leith Moody, Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were John Casey and Sarah Jane Evans.

On 24 July 1857 **Mark** and **Mary RING**, Pensioner and wife of Stanley, granted to **John Rogers RUDD**, warehouseman of Stanley, No 9 Pensioners Cottage Allotments, containing 24 poles, "*and all houses walls fences and erections crops and produce of any kind whatsoever now existing upon the said lands and premises and all allowances in material or money or otherwise that may hereafter be made or granted by Her Majesty's Government in respect to lining said houses*" for £40. NB: 4 Drury Street. [BUG-REG-1; 179]

In September 1858 John was the storekeeper in Stanley for the Falkland Islands Company Ltd. He was described as steady, zealous and competent in his work. [FIC/E1]

In November 1863 John requested that the FIC remitted £7 to his mother **Ann RUDD** of 13 Clifton Road, New Town, Exeter. [FIC/E2; 149, 8]

In June 1859 **John RUDD** paid a postal order of £5 to **Edward ROACH**, pensioner, Swineford, County Mayo, Ireland and £5 to **Mrs Ellen RUDD**, 13 Clifton Road, New Town, Exeter. [FIC/E2]

In a Despatch dated 23 February 1863 James Lane wrote to London "*Rudd & Robson have applied to have their respective Wives' Father & Mother & Sister sent out in the Company's next Vessel. I promised to ask whether they wd be sent for £50 instd of £20 each – as being relatives of steady servants. The Fathers name is Edward Roach, Swinesford, Co Mayo, Ireland. The Daughter is grown up – Roach is an Old Pensioner, formerly here & £10 advance if required may be made to them.*" [FIC/E2]

John, age 37 and Camp Manager for the Falkland Islands Company and a native of Exeter, was murdered 15 October 1864 at San Carlos by **Manuel GILL** and was buried 22 October 1864 in Grave D 381.



Ellen, age 31 and a widow, was married to (2) **William ROBERTS**, age 26, from Devonshire and a private in the Royal Marines Light Infantry, 1 January 1867 at Trinity Church Stanley according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Church of England after Banns by Charles Bull MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were C Blake, Agnes Watson and Jane Sharp. William's father was recorded as William Roberts, carpenter, and Ellen's father was recorded as Edward Roach, pensioner. Both Ellen and William were living in Stanley at the time of the marriage.

Ellen died 6 June 1902, age 67, of Acihosis of Tibes and was buried in Grave I 645. William died 29 May 1912, age 71, of cardiac failure and was buried in Grave I 746.

FIRST GENERATION

Children of John and Ellen John RUDD:

1. **Anna Maria RUDD** born 5 August 1853 in Stanley and baptised 13 October 1853 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Anna, a domestic living in Stanley, was married to (1) **William JOHNSON**, private, Royal Marines Light Infantry living in the Barracks, Stanley, 11 January 1870 at Trinity Church Stanley according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Church of England by Licence by Charles Bull MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were William Kind, Ellen Rudd and Charles Carey. William's father was recorded as Joseph Johnson, stone mason, and Anna's father was recorded as John Rudd, FIC Camp Manager. William, age 39 and a stonecutter late of the Royal Marines, from Bingley, Yorkolm, England, died 15 May 1876 from heart disease and is buried in Grave Ai198. Anna, a widow living in Stanley, was married to (2) **Ulrick Henry "Harry" CLASEN**, mariner living in Stanley, 18 December 1879 in the Parish Church according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church after Banns by Lowther E Brandon MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Philip Ennenga and Harriet White. Ulrick's father was recorded as Ulrick William Clasen, engine driver, and Anna's father was recorded as John Rogers Rudd, Falkland Islands Co Sub-manager. Anna, age 50, died 11 September 1903 from double pneumonia and is buried in Grave I646. Harry, age 77 and Danish, died 27 August 1930 from cirrhosis of the liver and cardiac failure and is buried in Grave J1008.
2. **Helen Elizabeth RUDD** born 14 October 1855 in Stanley and baptised **Ellen Elizabeth RUDD** 2 December 1855 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Ellen, age 18 and living in Stanley, was married to **Charles CAREY**, age 24 and a private in the Royal Marine Light Infantry living in Stanley, 15 October 1873 in the Parish Church according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church after Banns by H C Lory Act Col Chaplain. The witnesses were William Roberts and Thomas Bradley. Charles' father was recorded as James Carey, shoemaker, and Ellen's father was recorded as John Rogers Rudd, Camp Manager for Falkland Islands Co. According to family history, Charles was born in Northampton to Irish parents and trained as a shoemaker. He ran away to sea and joined the Royal Marines. Charles died 15 April 1898, age 49, from cardiac dropsy and is buried in Grave D344. He was the chief constable at the time of his death. Helen died 29 November 1927, age 72, from diabetes and morbus cordis and is buried in Grave K970.
3. **John Edward "Jack" "Hellfire Jack" RUDD** born 4 March 1857 in Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as labourer. John, a labourer living at Darwin, was married to **Ann McCALL**, a minor and Scottish, 27 June 1878 at Darwin according to the Presbyterian form after banns by Rev A Yeoman Minister. The witnesses were Archibald McCall and Elliot Fell. John's father was recorded as John Rodgers Rudd, overseer, and Ann's father was recorded as William McCall. John finished working for the Falkland Islands Co Ltd in their Camp establishment 8 February 1887 and the family emigrated to Patagonia. [FIC/IW4; 62: FIC/OM/COB/1#2]
4. **Mary Jane RUDD** born 15 September 1858 in Stanley and baptised 7 November 1858 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Mary, age 9 years and 4 months, died in the Soldier's Cottages 23 January 1868 from water on the brain and was buried 26 January 1868 (*no grave record*).
5. **Louisa RUDD** born 14 April 1860 and baptised 10 June 1860 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as butcher, Falkland Islands Company. Louisa, age 1

year 8 months, died in Stanley 11 December 1861 from being accidentally scalded and was buried 13 December 1861 (*no grave record*).

6. **Eliza RUDD** born 11 December 1861 in Stanley and baptised 29 December 1861 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as Camp Manager to the FI Company. Eliza, living in Stanley, was married to **Walter Benjamin SCOTT**, seaman living in Stanley, 7 July 1878 by Governors Licence by James Foran Catholic Priest at St Mary's RC Chapel Stanley. The witnesses were Charles Carey and Ellen Elizabeth Carey. Walter's father was recorded as Henry Scott and Eliza's father was recorded as John Rudd. Walter, age 30 years & 2 months and a native of Kins Lyon, Norfolk, England, accidentally drowned 9 November 1882, (*no burial record*). Eliza, age 22 and a widow, was married to (2) **Thomas Henry BUTLER**, age 29, 20 March 1884 by Jacob Foran, St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. The witnesses were Charles Scott and Sara Scott. Eliza and Thomas went to Canada circa 1895. Thomas died 5 February 1911 in the Holy Cross Hospital, Calgary, Canada. [FIM May 1911] Eliza died in Calgary, Canada in 1917, age 54. [Obituary FIM Jul 1917]
7. **Louisa RUDD** born 21 July 1863 at Darwin Harbour and baptised 17 April 1864 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as Camp Manager for the Falkland Islands Company. Louisa, age 17 and living in Stanley, was married to **Peter Clausen GELLERT**, age 26 and a steward living in Stanley, 14 July 1880 in the Parish Church according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA, Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Charles Carey and Ellen Carey. Peter's father was recorded as Lauge Clausen Gellert, miller, and Louisa's father was recorded as John Rogers Rudd, Falkland Islands sub manager. Peter was born 28 February 1851, in Hojen, Vejle, Denmark. Louisa, age 60, died in 1923 in Oklahoma.
8. **William Thomas Darwin "Will" RUDD** born 19 May 1865 in Stanley and baptised 9 July 1865 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as deceased Camp Manager for the Falkland Islands Company. William started working for the Falkland Islands Company Ltd in their Camp establishment 1 July 1883. He moved to North Arm in September 1883. William finished working for the Falkland Islands Co Ltd in their Camp establishment 12 June 1887. [FIC/IW4; 136] William was married to **Mary Ann DOUGLAS** August 1892 in Punta Arenas, Chile. [FIM Oct 1892]

SECOND GENERATION

Children of Ann Maria RUDD (1) and Richard ATKINS:

- a. **George RUDD** born 27 July 1869 in his grandmother's house in Stanley and baptised **George ATKINS** 18 October 1869 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as labourer. **George Frederick Rudd JOHNSON**, age 23 & a shepherd living in Stanley, was married to **Mary Harriet LYNCH**, age 19 & living in Stanley, 14 March 1892 in Christ Church according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Thomas Lynch and Mary Lynch. George's father was recorded as William Johnson, mariner, and Mary's father was recorded as Thomas Lynch, hatter. Mary, age 24 & British, died 7 November 1896 from cardiac failure after childbirth. George was married to (2) **Blanche WHITE** (*not in the Falkland Islands*). George, age 64 & a labourer, died 29 May 1934. Blanche, age 75 & a widow, died 14 June 1952.

Children of Anne (1) & William JOHNSON:

1. **John Thomas JOHNSON** born 22 July 1871 in Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as private in Royal Marines.
2. **William Rogers JOHNSON** born 29 March 1873 in Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as private in Royal Marines.
3. **Edward Roach JOHNSON** born 15 March 1875 in Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as late private in Royal Marines, stonemason. Edward, a navy living at Hill Cove, was married to **Elizabeth WHITE**, living at Hill Cove, 21 February 1900 at Hill Cove according to the Rites & Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were George Frederick Johnson and Blanche Johnson. Edward's father was recorded as William Johnson, Royal Marine Light Infantry, and Elizabeth's father was recorded as Alfred White, farmer.

Children of Anne (1) and Ulrick CLASEN:

1. **Ulrick CLASEN** born 25 February 1881 at Camp Mento. His father's occupation was recorded as labourer.
2. **Rupert Ferdinand CLASEN** born 20 October 1889. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd.
3. **Frederick Sigüsmund CLASEN** born 22 June 1891. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Fredrick, a shepherd, was married to **Ann Elizabeth Boyer BUTLER** 29 June 1917 at Crooked Inlet, Hill Cove, West Falkland by Governor's Licence by J Innes Wilson, Registrar. The witnesses were Edward Victor Johnson and Joseph James Williams Butler. Fredrick's father was recorded as Henry Clasen, barber. Ann and Fredrick later divorced.
4. **Adelaide Idina Dagmar CLASEN** born 12 July 1894. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Adelaide was married to **John Coish STEEL**, shepherd, 28 March 1920 at Christ Church Cathedral by Special Licence by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were U H Clasen, H J Jennings and Isabella Short. John's father was recorded as James Steel, mason, and Adelaide's father was recorded as Ulrich Clasen, barber. John

and Adelaide travelled to Punta Arenas in 1920 by the *Orcoma*. Adelaide and two children arrived from Punta Arenas 7 January 1928 returning to Punta Arenas 9 April 1928. In 1944 John was still living in Chile.

5. **Victor Henry Howard CLASEN** born 10 November 1895. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd.

Children of Ellen (2) & Charles CAREY:

1. **Anne Elizabeth CAREY** born 22 May 1874 and baptised 14 November 1875 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as shoemaker and private in Royal Marines. Ann, age 20, was married to **Peter SMITH**, age 26 and a farmer living at Coy Inlet, Patagonia, 17 May 1895 in the Cathedral, Stanley according to the Rites & Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Edwin Coupland Aspinall Assistant Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were T Carey and C Carey. Peter's father was recorded as Christopher Smith, overseer of gauchos, and Ann's father was recorded as Charles Carey, police constable. Peter's occupation was recorded as farmer, Coy Inlet, Patagonia. Peter and Ann left for Punta Arenas on board the *Tanis*. Peter died of rapid consumption at Sandy Point 18 December 1895 and was buried there 20 December 1895. He had gone into Sandy Point partly on business and partly because he did not feel well and thought the change would do him good. He had been there about a month before his death. [FIM Jan 1896] Ann married (2) **Robert WHITE** in Gallegos in 1901. [FIM Mar 1901]
2. **Theresa CAREY** born 11 March 1876 in Stanley and baptised 5 April 1876 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as shoemaker. Theresa was married to **James ROBERTSON**, inspector of stock, 21 September 1898 in the Parish Church according to the Rites & Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were John /Rodgers Carey and Ella Clara Carey. James' father was recorded as James Robertson, blacksmith, and Theresa's father was recorded as Charles Carey, acting senior constable. Both James and Theresa were living in Stanley at the time of their marriage. James, age 76 and a retired farm manager, died in KEMH, Stanley Tuesday 10 August 1943 and was buried 15 August 1943 in Grave K 1243. [Obituary FI Weekly News 19 Aug 1943; Biography DFB] Theresa, age 76, died 30 March 1952 in Stanley and was buried 3 April 1952 in Grave K 1478.
3. **John Rogers CAREY** born 12 April 1878 in Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as shoemaker. John, age 56 and a labourer, travelled to the UK on holiday in 1936.
4. **Ella Clara CAREY** born 20 April 1880 in Stanley and baptised 23 June 1860 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as shoemaker.
5. **Flora Mary CAREY** born 13 June 1882 in Stanley and baptised 6 March 1883 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as shoemaker. Flora, age 2 years & 4 months, died 15 October 1884 in Stanley from convulsions and was buried 19 October 1884 in Grave I 600.
6. **Charles Alfred James CAREY** born 6 July 1884 and baptised 14 April 1885 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. His father's occupation was recorded as shoemaker.
7. **Lilian Adelaide CAREY** born 2 August 1886 in Stanley and baptised 28 September 1888 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as police constable. Lilian, age 38, travelled to Patagonia via Punta Arenas in 1925 on holiday.

8. **Ellen Maude CAREY** born 24 July 1888 in Stanley and baptised 23 September 1888 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as police constable. Ellen, age 62 and a retired postmaster, died 8 August 1950 in Stanley and was buried 11 August 1950 in Grave Q1432.
9. **Charles William CAREY** born 25 January 1890 and baptised 29 September 1890 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. His father's occupation was recorded as police constable. Charles, a storekeeper, was married to **Mary Ann MORRISON** 29 June 1925 at Christ Church Cathedral by Special Licence by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were R L Robson and A M Morrison. Charles' father was recorded as Charley Carey, deceased chief constable, and Mary's father was recorded as Kenneth Morrison, shepherd. Charles and Mary emigrated to the UK in 1958.
10. **Raymond Falkland CAREY** born 24 February 1893 and baptised 7 November 1893 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as constable. Raymond, a shepherd, was married to **Louisa Annie HALL** 3 July 1919 at South Harbour, Port Stephens, West Falkland by Special Licence by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were J R Carey and Rose H Hall. Raymond's father was recorded as Charles William Carey, chief constable, and Louisa's father was recorded as Lewis James Hall, shepherd. Raymond died 22 November 1950, age 57, and is buried in Grave 1439. Raymond, age 57, died 22 November 1950 and was buried in Grave Q1439.
11. **Horace Lionel Rudd CAREY** born 6 November 1897 and baptised 6 November 1897 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as senior constable.

Children of John (3) and Ann RUDD:

1. **Agnes RUDD** born 3 November 1878 at Darwin. Her father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Agnes, living in Gallegos, was married to **William FELL**, sheep farmer living in Gallegos, living in Gallegos, 15 February 1910 in the Hotel Londres, Gallegos according to the rites of the Church of England after civil marriage the same day by Edwin Coupland Aspinall. The witnesses were John Rae Fell and Annie Maria Rudd. William's father was recorded as James Fell, sheep farmer and Agnes' father was recorded as John Edward Rudd, sheep farmer. Agnes died 14 July 1929 at sea en route to Buenos Aires, Argentina. On 21 March 1934 William, farmer on North Arm Station, Magallanes, sold Crown Grant 266 (*purchased by his grandfather in 1897*) on James Street to James Willison Miller, farmer of Estancia Punta Loyola Ter, Santa Cruz, Argentina for £550. [BUG-REG-10; 333] William died 26 February 1950 in Gallegos.
2. **Ellen RUDD** born 2 September 1880 at Darwin. Her father's occupation was recorded as labourer.
3. **Mary Jane RUDD** born 27 October 1882 at Egg Harbour and baptised 10 February 1883 by the United Non-Conformist Church in the house of Mr Kyle, Darwin. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Mary, daughter of John and Ann Rudd of Cape Fairweather, East Patagonia died 4 June 1906 age 23 years 7 months while in Exmouth and was buried in Exeter, Devonshire, near her kinsfolk. [FIM Sep 1906]
4. **John Rodgers RUDD** born 15 December 1884 at Egg Harbour and baptised 25 July 1885 by the United Non-Conformist Church, Darwin. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd.

5. **William Gallegos RUDD** born 27 August 1887 at Cape Fairweather, Gallegos North and baptised 13 December 1895 by J Williams. His father's occupation was recorded as farmer.
6. **Thomas Rae RUDD** born 18 October 1889 at Cape Fairweather, Gallegos North and baptised 13 December 1895 by J Williams. His father's occupation was recorded as farmer.
7. **Edward RUDD** born 29 November 1893 at Cape Fairweather, Gallegos North and baptised 13 December 1895 by J Williams. His father's occupation was recorded as farmer.
8. **Ann Maria RUDD** born 20 August 1891 at Cape Fairweather, Gallegos North and baptised 13 December 1895 by J Williams. Her father's occupation was recorded as farmer.
9. **Edgar RUDD** born 23 June 1896 at Cape Fairweather, Rio Gallegos and baptised 8 November 1896 by J Williams. His father's occupation was recorded as farmer.
10. **Maud RUDD** born 22 September 1898 at Cape Fairweather, Rio Gallegos and baptised 29 November 1898 by J Williams. Her father's occupation was recorded as farmer.
11. **Ethel Bridget RUDD** born 22 November 1900 at Cape Fairweather, Rio Gallegos and baptised 24 January 1901 by J Williams. Her father's occupation was recorded as sheep farmer.
12. **Fitzroy James McCall RUDD** born 5 February 1903 at Cape Fairweather, Patagonia and baptised 25 May 1904 by Edwin Aspinall. His father's occupation was recorded as sheep farmer.
13. **Gerald Rueben RUDD** baptised 22 November 1907 at Gallegos by Edward Quin Coles. His father's occupation was recorded as farmer.

Children of Eliza (6) and William SCOTT:

1. **Mary Ellen SCOTT** born 28 March 1879 at Port Stephens and baptised 25 April 1879 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as seaman. Mary Ellen was married to **John Joseph SULLIVAN** 7 July 1902 in Stanley by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. [Notice of marriage CM Jul 1902]
2. **Walter Ripplingale SCOTT** born 20 June 1881 at Port Stephens and baptised 3 December 1882 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. His father's occupation was recorded as seaman.

Children of Eliza (6) and Thomas BUTLER:

1. **Kathleen Louisa BUTLER** born 1 February 1885 and baptised 19 March 1885 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. Her father's occupation was not recorded.
2. **Ann Eliza BUTLER** born 21 October 1886 and baptised 9 October 1887 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Ann was then baptised 21 April 1890 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. Ann, age 10 years, died 5 May 1897 from acute gastritis and was buried on Weddell Island.

Children of Louisa (7) and Peter GELLERT:

1. **Peter Clausen GELLERT** born 18 January 1882 in Stanley. His father's occupation was recorded as labourer.

Children of William (8) and Mary Ann RUDD:

1. **William RUDD** born 16 October 1893 at Cape Fairweather, Gallegos North and baptised 13 December 1895 by J Williams. His father's occupation was recorded as farmer.
2. **Ann Maria RUDD** born 13 January 1895 at Cape Fairweather, Gallegos North and baptised 13 December 1895 by J Williams. Her father's occupation was recorded as farmer.
3. **Ellen Laura RUDD** born 14 September 1896 at Cape Fairweather, Rio Gallegos and baptised 8 November 1896 by J Williams. Her father's occupation was recorded as farmer.
4. **Eric Thomas RUDD** born 28 April 1902 at Laguarde, Argentina and baptised 5 April 1907 by Edwin Aspinall. His father's occupation was recorded as sheep farmer.
