Y. E. Submitted. Re C. I. of North has found San Carlos N. station to be infested with lice - Oct. 6 of 1901 as Oct. 6. 217. amended by Ord. 5 of 1922 - and under sect. 29 of the Ordinance he has given the Manager on behalf of the owner notice both verbal and written to dip all sheep on the station within 14 days.

2. In accordance with section 8 of the Principal Ordinance read in the light of the Amending Ordinance there appears to be no alternative but to place the station in quarantine. Re C. I. of North's draft notice of notification may be approved?

3. The First Schedule of Ord. 6 of 1901 has not been amended to correspond with the extension of "infested sheep" to cover lice as well as scab, lice being

a parasitic disease, and in the circumstances
 I think that there is no objection to the
 Chief Inspector of Stock's notice to the Managers
 of San Carlos N. Station taking the admitted
 and corrected form of his draft, and (3)

There were still a large number of dry sheep + ewes to be shorn but I could not inspect these sheep at that time

I had hoped to inspect all the sheep when dipping operations were being carried out (in March), but unfortunately I was on the West Falklands during that time.

4. Mr. Anderson has not yet forwarded the Declaration required in Form 3 (Section 12) of Live Stock Ordinance 1901. It was that the sheep have been dipped ~~and~~ it will be necessary for the Station to remain in quarantine for six months before being released.

5. The sheep will be inspected during lamb marking time in September.


