Stanley, Falkland Islands.

I beg to submit that approval be given to allow the Government sanitary horse to graze in the Quarantine Station paddock. At present there is a horse and some sheep belonging to Mr. Hutchinson grazing there.

2. The paddock used by the Government sanitary horse is now being used for the transport of rock for the sea wall. The quarry is just to the south of this paddock and there is a danger of falling stones hitting the horse. The gate is left open during the day, the horse strays and complaints have been made by people in the vicinity that the horse has been eating boxwood etc. over the garden fences.

3. There is a smaller Government paddock to the South and on the hill, but this is too exposed in the winter and there is no shelter there.

Sir,

I trust you will pardon the liberty I take in asking the Government, to allow me to use the quarantine paddock for a holding paddock for sheep.

At various times during the last 3 years I have been granted permission to use the quarantine station paddocks for holding sheep for the sum of 10/- per three months, with notice to clear all stock out in 24 hours if there were any stock arriving from England or else where to be quarantined.

At the present time it is being used as a horse paddock, and I am led to believe that the Government does not receive any payment or some.

I also request that in the event of Paddock No 3, Hookers Point - not being a success by experimental purposes, that the Government will give me the first opportunity to lease it - as a paddock for sheep.
