My first reaction was that this suggestion was a good idea, but on more mature consideration, I do not think the matter should be introduced into Legislative Council, until it has the full support of the Sheep Owners Association.

I am not satisfied with the description of a fence being in sound condition and properly maintained. My view is that a boundary should be double fenced, to prevent contact at a fence between sheep on adjoining farms; that each of the boundary fences should be as "sheep-proof" as possible, and should be maintained in sound condition.

I am sure it will be readily admitted that, if a farm like Roy Cove is granted exemption from dipping, every possible precaution will have to be taken to prevent sheep from Hill Cove, (which I suggest, may be ked-infested), getting through the boundary fence.

It would be interesting to know how many Hill Cove Sheep are returned from Roy Cove at dipping time, and how many Roy Cove Sheep are similarly returned from Hill Cove? This would prove the efficacy of the present fences.

I agree with the suggestion that Section 54 of Cap 40 should be deleted, but here again, I think this should first be debated by the Sheep Owners Association.

I see no reason for "rushed" legislation in this matter, and I think Council would be in a better position to vote on this subject, if it was in possession of the considered views of the Sheep Owners Association, on dipping exemptions in general, and boundary fences in particular.

Spray Dipping.

It is understood that you have spray dipping equipment at _____ and you will therefore be interested to learn that a Bill affecting the use of spray dip passed through the Legislature this morning. The new law in effect:

- (i) consolidates section 11 of the Live Stock Ordinance which has previously been amended;
- (ii) provides the Governor in Council with the power to advance or extend the period during which sheep must be dipped for experimental purposes.

2. Under the provisions of the Live Stock Ordinance as it stood, sheep had to be dipped between the 1st day of March and the 30th day of June, subject only to the proviso that the Inspector may advance or extend this period by not more than 30 days.

3. The results of the spray dipping experiments so far have to some extent been a little inconclusive and it is still too early for Government to permit spray dipping to become the normal alternative to dipping by immersion throughout the Falklands. On the other hand the implications and potentialities of this method are so important that it is essential that further experiments and on a larger scale should be permitted and indeed encouraged.

4. It seems now that the spray dipping method may prove to be most effective when the sheep are dipped "off the shears" and the Sheep Owners' Association, with whom Government are of course closely in touch over the question, are anxious too that this method should be tried out as the next step. Unfortunately, however, the law as it stood required any sheep dipped "off the shears" at shearing time to be dipped again during the statutory 1st March - 30th June (subject to the power of the Inspector to advance or extend by 30 days) and this requirement substantially nullified "off the shears" experiments that might be carried out much earlier.

5. A copy of the Bill which will become law as from tomorrow 16th December, 1959, is attached for information. From this it will be noted that the Governor in Council will have power to extend or advance the dipping period for experimental purposes only using the spray method. It is the intention to authorise any farm that so desires, on application, to dip up to 3,000 sheep or lambs by the spray method using an approved emulsion dip and to regard it as complying with the statutory requirement on dipping on the understanding that full reports on results are submitted to the Governor in Council in each case. It will of course be necessary to keep the sheep so treated out of physical contact with other sheep throughout the period of the experiment.

Title Further to Amend the Live Stock Ordinance.

Enacting clause BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the Colony of the Falkland Islands, as follows:-

Short title 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Live Stock (Amendment) (No. 2) Ordinance, 1959, and shall be read as one with the Live Stock Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance.

Cap. 40

Replacement of section 11 of the principal Ordinance. 2. Section 11 of the principal Ordinance is repealed and replaced as follows:-

"Annual dipping compulsory. 11. (1) Between the 1st day of March and the 30th day of June in every year, every owner shall dip or cause to be dipped with an insecticidal dip approved by an inspector all sheep running on land whereof he is the occupier:

Provided that -

- (a) for purposes previously approved in writing by the inspector, the inspector may advance or extend, for not more than 30 days, the period during which sheep must be dipped:
- (b) with the approval of the Governor in Council and subject to such conditions as may be imposed by the Governor in Council, the period during which sheep must be dipped may be advanced or extended for experimental purposes:
- (c) the inspector may exempt the owner on any island from dipping in any one year if the sheep examined by him on that island are found to be absolutely free of tick, lice and scab in that year.

(2) Any person who contravenes the provisions of this section shall be liable to a fine not exceeding two shillings for every sheep."

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

To consolidate the provisions of Section 11 of the Live Stock Ordinance, which relate to the compulsory annual dipping of sheep, with a further provision empowering the Governor in Council to vary the period within which sheep must be dipped for experimental purposes.



REPORT ON SPRAY-DIPPING EXPERIMENT CARRIED OUT AT SAN CARLOS
DURING SEASON 1960/61.

=====

1. Details of Experiment.

Permission was obtained from the Agricultural Dept. under the conditions of the Live Stock (Amendment)(No.2.) Ordinance 1959 to dip up to 3000 breeding ewes in March/April 1960 using a spray-race to apply the insecticide as opposed to the plunge-dip in popular usage. These sheep were to be depastured separately and insofar as it was possible kept apart from all other sheep until the following shearing.

Accordingly on the 11th April 1960, 2947 breeding ewes were spray-dipped. Of this total, 700 were 4-tooth ewes which had been shorn the previous December with snow-combs, the balance of the flock was older ewes which had been shorn with standard combs in January.

2. Insecticide used.

COOPERBELL was used, being an insecticide specially designed by the firm of Cooper, MacDougall, Robertson of Berkhamstead for use with spray-dip races.

292 gallons of spray were used at a concentration of 75 : 1. One gallon of spray therefore treated 7.7 sheep. It appeared at the time that there was adequate coverage. The spray was applied at a pressure of 120 lbs to the sq. inch.

3. Equipment Used.

The type of race used, was the Holton Spray Race. This is a high pressure/low volume spray race applying the spray through 20 high pressure nozzles arranged so as to give the maximum coverage. This equipment was supplied by the firm of Cuddon & Stewart of Christchurch New Zealand and is recognised as being one of the more successful types of spray-race used in the Dominion.

4. Examinations. These sheep were depastured in a camp some distance from the settlement and it was difficult for various reasons to carry out any detailed examinations between April 1960 and January 1961. However, at ram-lifting and lamb-marking the incidence of keds did not seem to be significant. In passing it should be noted that hitherto this camp has been extremely clean and the ked infestation in previous seasons has been negligible.

5. Results at Shearing 1961. It became apparent when drafting this flock for shearing on 27th January that the ked infestation was relatively high. A test pen of lambs was closely examined and 63% were found to be infested with live keds.

Item 5. (con).

Accordingly with the help of the assistant from the Agricultural Dept., N. Farrin, a tally was kept on the shearing floor of all sheep showing any signs of ked infestation.

The following results were obtained:

4-tooth Ewes: 591 shorn - 286 Ked-infested. = 48.3%

Older Ewes: 1137 " - 191 " " = 16.8%
(part only)

Older Ewes dipped in Gamatox through plunge dip, present in flock
65 shorn - 23 Ked-infested. = 35.3%.

6. Conclusions.

It is admitted that on the showing of these figures it must be assumed that this experiment has been a failure insofar as ridding the flock of keds is concerned.

The following conclusions may be drawn however:

- a) It is quite obvious that the concentration of the spray was too weak to kill the keds present and to guard against further infestation, on the 4-tooth ewes. These ewes were obviously too heavily woolled at the time of spraying.
- b) The results for the older ewes is much more encouraging, bearing in mind the fact that the 4-tooth ewes were proving such a heavy source of reinfestation. Indeed this result speaks highly for the residual effect of Dieldrin.
- c) It becomes quite apparent that for best results this insecticide should be applied either off the shears or at least within three months of shearing. For sheep shorn with snow-combs it would be best to spray them off shears.
- d) A side result which cannot really be considered conclusive is the high rate of reinfestation amongst the sheep which had been plunge dipped hitherto considered the acme of dipping perfection.

Note. It must be borne in mind that we may not be using the right type of chemical. I have had considerable correspondence with one of the leading Agricultural Chemical Firms in New Zealand who inform me that they no longer use Dieldrin in their sheep sprays for use in the South Island of the Dominion, due to the fact that the chemical does not combine readily with the lanolin in the wool at low temps. They recommend that we use a chemical called Aldrin which is basically the same as Dieldrin only more volatile at lower temperatures.

Dear Sir,

Spray Dipping.

With reference to the Spray Dipping trials that have been carried out at this Farm over the past two years. We now feel that it would be advantageous both to us, and to the Colony in general, if we could carry out trials on a very much larger scale than has been permitted previously. I therefore ask permission for all sheep on this station, with the exception of the wethers on the mountains, to be excluded from complete immersion dipping this season.

In support of this application I should like to draw your attention to the undermentioned facts:-

- (a) All ewes were sprayed off the shears.
- (b) All other sheep were sprayed 4-6 weeks after being shorn.
- (c) All lambs were sprayed at weaning.
- (d) The above sheep (about 16,000) were sprayed with an 0.4% strength solution of Dieldrin - double the recommended strength.
- (e) Sheep are not put back on to the same camps after being shorn, hence we can have 100% clean gathers.
- (f) The sheep will be sprayed again at normal dipping time if permission is granted.

Although last year we were able to do one flock of 3,000 sheep with the Spray, this did not prove all that easy - in our own case it meant that our only flock of 3,000 was the

hog flock, all the other flocks are either bigger or we are unable to keep them apart, because of trying to do as much rotational grazing as possible.

To Spray Dip 'off the shears'; and then to put all the sheep through a complete immersion bath to my mind ~~would~~ prove nothing, and I am not sure would warrant the extra cost. I am sure that the benefits to be gained by spraying are many, the two most noticeable here were (a) the sheep were in much better condition and (b) the wool was much cleaner and brighter.

The success of any dipping, whether it be spray or complete immersion, depends on 100% clean gathers. The only way to get the ideal is to sub-divide camps and spray 'off the shears' - which is what we have endeavoured to do.

Finally I should like to mention our boundary fences. The one with Port San Carlos was renewed last year. The Salvador fence is now Stock-proof and the Teal Inlet one is being renewed. If permission is granted to us to spray these sheep, we feel we would not be a danger, or a source of infestation to our neighbours.



DETAILS OF SPRAY-DIPPING EXPERIMENT CARRIED OUT AT SAN CARLOS DURING SEASON 1961/62.

1) General Description.

Under the Livestock (Amendment)(No.2) Ordinance 1959, permission was granted to spray-dip up to 3000 breeding ewes in March/April. This was to be considered sufficient under the terms of the Ordinance to constitute an annual 'dip'.

Bearing in mind the result of our experiment in 1960/61 (Fully reported to you in my report dated 29/2/61 and to which I would ask you to refer) only 2166 ewes were sprayed on March 25th. The balance of the flock being composed of young maiden ewes carrying a greater length and weight of wool being plunge dipped in Gammatox wash.

- 4) Examinations.)

5) Results at Shearing 1962.

On preliminary investigation tick infestation did not appear high. On the lambs it was negligible. However, when shearing commenced, it became evident that there was some degree of infestation through the flock, though not as apparent as in the previous season.

The Agricultural Dept. observer (H.Farrin) tallied the following results:

Sprayed Sheep: 1815 Shorn of which 73 had live ticks in the fleece.
27 " tick stain " " "
49 " tick eggs " " "
Total: 149 = 8.2 % tick infested.

Plunge Dipped Sheep.
756 were shorn of which 97 had live ticks in fleece
38 " tick stain " " "
59 " " eggs " " "
Total: 194 = 25.6 % tick infested.

6) Conclusions.

Again the result has not been entirely satisfactory and it is difficult to trace the causes of reinfestation. The poor residual effect of Gammatox (DDT/BHC Base) is again strikingly demonstrated. It is proposed this year to plunge and spray the young ewes to see what result this will have.

It is my firm opinion that Dieldrin based insecticides are at least as efficient as Gammatox (DDT/BHC Base) and would have no hesitation in using it throughout my flocks despite the result of this experiment.

Report on Spray Dipping carried out at Douglas Station 1961.

When using a Cooper-Allman Spray Race in position (a) (see diagram), six trial runs showed an average of 190 sheep per $3\frac{1}{2}$ minutes (i.e. to each 40 gallon drum of solution) or 2280 sheep per hour, to have been sprayed, at an approximate cost of 3d per head. A further six runs, using the race in position (b), showed an average of 220 per $3\frac{1}{2}$ minutes, or 2640 per hour, at an approximate cost of 2.6d per head. In each case a 2% (double strength solution) of Cooperdiel was employed, with a pressure reading of 14 pounds p.s.i.

Using a Holton Spray Race in position (a) on previous occasions, an average of 2900 per hour were put through, but when the race was used in position (b), five trial runs showed an average of 420 sheep to each 40 gallon drum of solution, or 2100 per hour. The sheep ran much steadier when the race was used in position (b), as compared with position (a), and seemed to have a better covering of solution. The approximate cost per head for the five trial runs was 1.4d, a 2% (double strength solution) of Cooperdiel again being employed, with a pressure reading of 150 pounds p.s.i.

The main spraying was carried out on the 25th March, the temperature ranging from 48° to 55° - when the majority were sprayed, a temperature of 50° was recorded.


A careful examination of as many sheep as possible was made at the second spraying and there were a few hoggets, also some younger sheep, which had not been sprayed directly "off-the-shears" and which showed a very small infestation of keds. All other sheep were 100% ked free.



Livestock Insecticides.

Information has been obtained from the October 1961 issue of the New Zealand Journal of Agriculture that the use on livestock of preparations containing aldrin, dieldrin, benzene hexachloride (BHC), lindane, DDT and methoxychlor is prohibited because extensive investigations and testing of livestock products have shown that active ingredients in some insecticides tend to leave residues in the products from treated livestock and that alternative chemicals now available are much safer to use and do not leave residues.

Aldrin and dieldrin are used here for spray dipping of sheep.

I should be glad of advice as to whether the use of these chemicals should be discouraged or prohibited and if so what would be the alternative safer chemicals.

Preliminary Report on Result of Spraying Wethers ex Mountains.

These Wethers were examined whilst being shorn, and of 4,188 shorn from the 10th to 14th December, the majority were found to be infested with ticks, with a few very slightly tick-stained fleeces, particularly amongst the oldest wethers. The younger ages, although they were all run together with the old wethers, carried a much lighter infestation, but though no count was taken very few sheep could be said to be free of ticks.

A further more full report on the whole years results will be submitted on the completion of shearing.



- (4.) The New Zealand 'Holton' Sheep Spray Unit with Hypo N.700 Pump, powered by Model D.B.S.A. Engine in Portable Unit Form.
- (5.) Dieldrin as formulated by Cooper, McDougall & Robertson Ltd., and sold under the name of Cooperdiel.
- (6.) (a) For the wethers 1 gal. Cooperdiel to 74 gals. rainwater.
(b) For the ewes 1 gal. Cooperdiel to 80 gals. of rainwater.
- (7.) 150 lbs. per square inch at all times.
- (8.) Not calculated.
- (9.) Considered highly successful but for various reasons given below complete eradication of keds was not achieved.
- (10.) (a) I attribute the good results to the fact that spraying with Dieldrin is quicker and easier to perform than plunge dipping, and the actual control of spraying, or in other words, making sure the sheep are thoroughly covered, is the responsibility of one man only.
(b) The high working pressure and the efficient but simple arrangement of the Holton Spray equipment.
(c) The use of Dieldrin as an insecticide which in my opinion is far more effective than the products which are in current use for plunge dipping.
(d) That rainwater for dilution has been used throughout, so eliminating the hard water problem.
(e) The fact that clean fresh solution is used at all times. At present all surplus solution runs to waste.

Factors considered to have thwarted complete success.

- (1) The abnormally high infestation of keds. The infestation here was gradually increasing in spite of all efforts to control it. We have been hampered recently by a badly leaking dip bath which has caused loss of solution and uncertainty of solution strength.
 - (2) The unpredictable climate. It would seem desirable to spray only when there is no possibility of rain, at least until the sheep have had time to dry. This is not always possible and portions of our ewe and wether flocks had rain within a few hours of spraying. Warm weather is most desirable but seldom coincides with the work.
 - (3) Incomplete mustering. This is always a risk and very few infested sheep need be left in the camp to cause even a mild spread of keds through a flock before the following season.
 - (4) The occasional escape of sheep from pens and paddocks while awaiting spraying.
- (11) The spray race was used strictly according to the makers instructions. Nozzle frame width and top nozzle height were adjusted to suit the average size of sheep in each particular run. The unit has a semi permanent installation at the woolshed and is enclosed at the sides with flat iron and on top with corrugated perspex.

REPORT ON SPRAY DIPPING CARRIED OUT AT GIBRALTAR STATION

(12) Although all sheep were sprayed off the shears last season, and all lambs were sprayed at weaning, observations so far indicate that the young sheep which were all plunged in March have the highest percentage of keds.

In the wethers, which are being shorn this week, the number of keds seen so far is extremely low. No result can be stated for the ewes, but at lamb-marking only one ked was seen and this was on a lamb.

The very low infestation has resulted in cleaner and better grown wool from all classes of sheep so far shorn.

FUTURE INTENTIONS

To continue experimenting and to improve still further the installation of the spray unit.

To request Government permission to use the spray only during the main dipping in March 1964.

All sheep are again being sprayed off the shears and lambs will be sprayed on weaning.

Until even more satisfactory results are achieved, permission to spray off the shears only and to eliminate the main dipping will not be sought.

I refer to your letter of 14th April 1972 in which you state that you have in fact already spray-dipped the Lorenzo flock.

2. I note that the reason given for this action is the delay in Government answering your letter. The following facts are relevant: Your application dated 31st January was received in the office on 6th February and the last reply from neighbouring farms was received on 26th February, thus this is the earliest date on which action could commence in the Secretariat. The relative Executive Council Memorandum was issued on 3rd March and the subject was in fact taken at the following scheduled meeting for Council on 17th March. Three days later the information was conveyed to you that your application was unsuccessful. I think you will agree that short of calling an Extraordinary Meeting of Council to discuss this one subject it would have been virtually impossible to have processed your application earlier.

3. The law requires that all sheep must be dipped by immersion between the 1st day of March and the 30th day of June in every year, unless special approval is given by the Governor in Council. In this case the Governor in Council did not issue such approval and I am formally to advise you that you are required to comply with the requirements of the Live Stock Ordinance and ensure that the Lorenzo flock is plunge-dipped not later than 30th June 1972. You are also required to advise the Oi/c Agricultural Department of your plans in sufficient time to allow him to arrange for an inspector to be present on your farm to witness the gathering of the flock and the dipping operation.

Dear Sir,

I refer to our telephone conversation of this morning in which you so rudely suggested that no action had been taken on your application to spray-dip your Lorenzo flock.

2. My file contains copies of correspondence between yourself and the Inspector, Mr. W. Felton in which you seek permission from him to spray-dip your Lorenzo flock of ewes. The Inspector replied that although he had no objection to your using a spray-dip he made it quite clear that this in itself did not absolve you from plunge dipping the same flock before 30th June.

3. You later wrote back to the Inspector claiming that your earlier letter in fact requested exemption from plunge dipping this particular flock. The Inspector reiterated his previous instruction and since there is no provision in the law to exempt a particular flock on any one farm, he suggested you make formal application to the Governor in Council through the Chief Secretary for consideration to be given to amending the law to suit this purpose. To date I have seen no such application.

4. I confirm that as the law stands at present you are required to plungedip your flocks before 30th June 1973.




Dear Sir,





Thank you for your letter of 2nd. March regarding our application for exemption from plunge dipping our flocks.

I do not consider ~~either~~ the circumstances or the contents of Mr. Greenshields letter at all reasonable. I received my copy of his letter whilst in Stanley last week and immediately booked an appointment with the Chief Secretary to discuss the problem. However ~~the~~ Chief Secretary was about to go into conference and could not spare me much time, but he did intimate that Mr. Greenshields was not on very strong ground and that he would ~~discuss~~ have a discussion with yourself and Mr. Bennett. M

By the date on your letter I would guess that no discussion had up to then taken place so I would be most grateful if you could reopen this question and advise me as soon as convenient. I would like to point out that Douglas Station have already once deliberately flouted the Law so I would not think that their opinions should carry very much weight.

If we are not granted full exemption would you please consider exemption for all flocks except those along the Boundary fence. This has been done in the past for us. We have been free of keds ~~ourselves~~ ourselves for some years and have only had some on sheep from our neighbours at times when they themselves were fairly seriously affected.

Exemption from Dipping - Port San Carlos Ltd.

We discussed the Port San Carlos dipping problem this morning and I attach herewith copies of recent correspondence. Contrary to Mr. Miller's suggestion the matter was discussed with Mr. Layng prior to the issue of my letter dated 2nd inst. The partial exemption mentioned by Mr. Miller was probably during the rather lax period of spray dipping experiments. Certainly the law, as it stands at present, makes no provision for partial exemption. Furthermore a condition of any exemption is the approval of neighbouring farmers.


Exemption from Dipping

I refer to your memorandum AG9 of 13th March regarding an application from Port San Carlos Ltd. for partial exemption and confirm that since there is no provision in the law for such action it will not be possible to approve the Manager's request. It is true that exceptions were made to this ruling during the period experimental spray dipping of certain flocks was being encouraged but as this method has not been accepted as a satisfactory exercise on its own, it would be wrong to continue to permit isolated cases.

2. The following farms have now complied with the requirements of the law and favourable reports have been received from the Inspector. These may now be given exemption from dipping of all flocks during the current dipping season:

- Sea Lion Island
- Bleaker Island
- Lively Island
- Moody Valley
- Salvador
- Carcass Island
- Roy Cove
- Pebble Group
- Johnson Harbour
- West Point Island

Exemption for Rincon Grande may also be given provided the necessary written consent is received from the Manager, Green Patch.





Dear Sir,

As you may or may not be aware I shall be returning to the U.K. on Monday 21st May, therefore there will be no Dog Inspector on the farm for the July and October dosings. I trust you will make the appropriate arrangements for an inspector to be appointed or one of the many in Stanley to come out and supervise.

While recently clean gathering one of our summer camps we came across 12 unshorn K.C. Wethers, which were left on a Stanley mutton drive last winter. This makes a total of 31 sheep left on this farm from that drive. When shorn two of the wethers were found to have keds on them and one of the fleeces was extremely badly tick stained. I took the liberty of showing this fleece to Mr. R.M. Pitaluga when he recently passed through on his way to Stanley. This Company will, therefore, be raising strong objections if Port San Carlos Limited apply for exemption from plunge dipping next year.

Dear Sir,

In our mail yesterday I received a letter from Mr. H. L. Greenshields of Douglas Station Limited referring to a letter of mine in which I complained about the state of the section of the Boundary fence, for which Douglas Station are responsible. He now assures me that arrangements are being made to repair the extensive damage shortly.

However he also states; quote-" While straggling recently a summer camp we came across 12 mutton which apparently had been left from one of your mutton droves last year. Of these we found two with keds, one fleece completely stained and I took the liberty of showing this fleece to Mr. Pitaluga when he passed through on Sunday last, and I am informing the Agricultural ~~Exp~~ Officer that if Port San Carlos apply for dipping exemption next year we will be objecting. "-unquote.

Whether or not Mr. Greenshields did pass on this information before he left the Colony, I would like this matter investigated now whilst this is still fresh in peoples memories rather than wait until our application next February is vetoed. Also, this is the second occasion on which Mr. Greenshields has attempted to slander my honesty and management policies. The first being in his letter to you of 21st. February, quote-" I understand Mr. Miller has already plunge dipped his lambs this year, and I therefore assume that he is not 100% sure he is free of keds."- unquote. Your letter to me of 2nd. March takes this assumption as reasonable !

I here and now state categorically- that no keds whatsoever have been seen on any sheep during this past shearing season at Port San Carlos, and all my employees are agreed on this. There have been no keds on our wethers at all for the past EIGHT years. The only keds seen during that period of eight years were in one flock of x young sheep, which owing to the topography we find difficult to gather cleahly. However 15 months ago we gathered this area no less than five times to make quite sure that not one single sheep was left.


Having made that point, I hope, quite clear, I should now like to point out that no 'wooled' sheep have been taken across ~~his~~ Douglas Station property since 18th. August 1972 when we sent 450 mutton wethers over to Douglas Station ~~settlement~~ ~~for~~ en route for the Stanley Butchery. These particular mutton to which Mr. Greenshields is referring have therefore been on his property for at least EIGHT months, plenty of time to pick up an infestation. I would also add that the camp in which they were found either is, or the one next to it, the camp which Douglas Station deliberately omitted to plunge dip last year. And, since he does not consider that the state of the boundary fence is deplorable, (any sheep could walk through it blind-fold in some places !) one wonders at the state of his internal fences. One of my shepherds last weekend saw some woolly sheep still in one of Douglas Camps which they are supposed to have 'clean' gathered.

Following this, it is quite possible that Douglas Station have ~~had~~ some of our wethers for over a year, since we have had wethers in the Camp alongside the broken boundary fence, and if the state of Greenshields gathering methods are such that they miss sheep, I cannot ~~by~~ any stretch of the imagination see how he can claim that the keds came from us and not from his own sheep which he cannot claim to be ked free.

Therefore, I would ask that Government ignore this particular gybe of Mr. Greenshields and anyone from your department is fully welcome to come out here now and study all the skins that we have in the woolshed, including some from the 'supposedly' infected area. And also to question whoever they like who lives here about the subject of 'keds'.

I might add that my reason for plunge dipping the hoggets is that (and I have said so at SOA meetings), there is no point just spray dipping all the woolly sheep out of the woolshed if the lambs are allowed to be weaned away and go straight back to camp, since A. lambs are notorious for getting through the best of fences anywhere they should not be. and B. lambs are the most prone to ked infestation. This is why I plunge dipped my lambs and I will do so again this year even though we have no keds. Also supposing we can get exemption this next year from plunge dipping I will still be spray dipping the summer after that. I am cautious, and I personally am the only loser if I claim exemption before we are ready to do so. My company would not be very pleased with me if I allowed us to get re-infested.





On 4th May of this year, I wrote to THE CHAIRMAN & MANAGING DIRECTOR of Douglas Station Ltd., asking him if he had any plans for the repair or renewal of any part of our mutual boundary fence. This concerned the fence from the Douglas Creek to the East end of the Bombillia paddock.

In his reply of 16th May which I did not receive until after Mr Greenshields had left the Colony, he stated that at present he had no plans for renewing any of the fence. He goes on to say that as part of the fence concerned encloses our paddocks at Hope Cottage, and this is the part that gets the most 'ware and tare' (his spelling not mine) that a more equitable arrangement should be mutually agreed as to the maintenance or rather the renewal of this section of fence.

The Directors of Teal Inlet Ltd., see no reason to change an arrangement that has been in operation to their certain knowledge for thirty years, and probably a lot longer, concerning the maintenance of this particular fence.

I would therefore like to make application under the Livestock (Amendment) Ordinance 1973, Section 8. New Section 11A. Sub section (b) (iii), for an Inspector to be appointed to come out and inspect the fence in question.

The sections of fence I would like inspected are about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles East from the corner of the boundary on Bombillia hill and about 1 mile starting at the crates in the Douglas Creek. 
I wish to bring to your notice the following situation regarding Teal Inlet Ltd., Douglas Station and Port San Carlos.

On the 30th October I received an application from Teal Inlet Ltd. for an Inspector to be appointed to inspect a boundary fence between Teal Inlet and Douglas Station. The application was made under the Livestock (Amendment) Ordinance 1973 Section 8 - new section 11A sub section (b) (iii). I wrote to the Manager of Teal Inlet on the 9th November pointing out that the section of the Ordinance he referred to only applied if an exemption from dipping was requested and as neither Teal Inlet or Douglas Station had applied for an exemption I was unable to request you to appoint an Inspector. I have now received a letter from Teal Inlet Ltd. requesting an exemption from dipping and the appointment of an Inspector to visit Teal Inlet to ascertain that their sheep are free from Ked and reiterating their request for the boundary fence to be inspected.

Under section 11A sub-section (b) (i) of the Livestock (Amendment) Ordinance 1973, agreement for exemption must be obtained from the owners of every station that has a boundary with the station occupied by the applicant - in this case Douglas Station, Green Patch, Bluff Cove and Mr S. Goss. Up to the present I have not received agreement from any of these Farms.

Last year Port San Carlos applied for an exemption from dipping but Douglas Station objected on the grounds that while clean gathering one of their summer camps they came across unshorn Port San Carlos sheep which were left on a Stanley mutton drive. After shearing, two of the sheep were found to have Keds on them. In a letter reporting the above fact the Manager of Douglas Station stated that if Port San Carlos applied for an exemption this year (1974) he would raise strong objection. I have not as yet received an application from Port San Carlos.

In view of the bad feeling that exists between the Managers of these Farms I should be grateful for your guidance on this matter. My knowledge of dipping is very limited and I would suggest that perhaps a Committee should be formed of persons who have a good knowledge of dipping to advise on these matters.

Further to my note dated 26th February relating to section 11A (b) (i) concerning the prior agreement of adjacent owners I have to-day received the benefit of advice from Mr. L.A. Blake, member of Exco and Legco, who has been closely concerned with amendments to the Ordinance.

Mr. Blake advised me that it was the intention of the legislature that

- (a) the words "Provided that the owner of an adjoining station shall not unreasonably withhold his consent" should appear in the 1973 amending ordinance but were accidentally omitted.
- (b) The word "dispute" in section 11A (b) (i) was intended to mean the situation created by an owner withholding his consent and the section was intended to empower an inspector to grant exemption despite an owner's withholding of consent, if the inspector considered the withholding to be unreasonable.

In view of this assurance of the legislature's intentions I am happy to change my opinion and now to advise that section 11A (b) (i) may be interpreted in the sense in which the legislature intended it to be interpreted.

2. With regard to an appeal against an inspector's decision it would appear in the light of advice from Mr. Blake that if and when the ordinance is amended it should be made clear that the inspector's decision is final and not appealable instead of creating an avenue for appeal as I first suggested. Providing for an appeal would, Mr. Blake informs me, create practical difficulties and uncertainties concerning the actual dipping.

I have sent a copy of this note to Mr. Blake.

CIRCULAR LETTER TO ALL FARM MANAGERS FROM THE COMMITTEE
APPOINTED AT THE JULY MEETING OF THE ASSOCIATION.

Dear Sir,

Your appointed Committee has met on four occasions and taken some trouble to arrive at recommendations to Government for the amendment of The Livestock Ordinance, and also to draw up the requirements for Government to produce an Order in Council in connection with the emphatically expressed majority views at the July Meeting of The Association to compel station owners to become completely free of ked infection within a reasonably short period.

LIVESTOCK ORDINANCE. After a close study of the main Ordinance and the various Amendments made over the last 15 years we have come up with the following two amendments only:-

1. Insert at the end of Section 11A, 1, (b), (i), the following proviso :

"Provided that the owner of an adjoining station shall not unreasonably withhold his consent"

2. Insert in Section 11A after (3), the following:

"This subsection shall not apply to those owners who were granted exemption from the previous autumn dipping".

The above two amendments appear to your committee to be self-explanatory and need no definition.

We show on a separate sheet the proposed Order in Council for the Clearance of Keds from the Colony. There are seven paragraphs in this and where we thought it necessary we have added explanations.

CONSOLIDATED LIVESTOCK ORDINANCE

We have proposed to Government and Government has accepted the following task.

The Secretariat will produce a Consolidated Livestock Ordinance document which will take some six weeks to make available and this will consist of a reprint of the original Livestock Ordinance as shown in the LAWS OF THE FALKLAND ISLANDS, and re-issued in 1953, together with all the Amendments which have been added or even altered in the intervening 21 years.

This consolidated pamphlet will be updated to June 30th 1974.

Members are therefore recommended to order from the Chief Secretary their own copies, which will thus enable all farmers to possess a complete and up to date Livestock Ordinance.

It is estimated that this pamphlet will cost about £1.00

PROPOSED ORDER IN COUNCIL.

LIVESTOCK ORDINANCE.

(Chapter 40)

CLEARANCE OF KEDS ORDER 1974.

No. of 1974.

E.G. Lewis,
Governor.

1. This Order may be cited as the Clearance of Keds Order 1974.
2. Every owner shall clear his sheep of all ked infection.
3. After February 14th 1976, any owner who has keds upon his station as certified by an inspector, shall be liable to a fine of one half penny per sheep put out the previous autumn and as then entered in the Annual Stock Return. This fine shall be increased to one penny per sheep the following year, and in subsequent and successive years the fine shall be increased by one penny per sheep per year until that station shall be certified to be clear of keds.
4. Any owner whose sheep have been certified free from ked infection but who can show to an inspector's satisfaction that a subsequent re-appearance of ked in his boundary flocks to be from a neighbour's sheep, shall be exempted from a fine, but only where the infection is confined to sheep running on his boundary. Where the inspector is satisfied that this ked re-appearance is only in that flock from the owner's boundary, the owner may be exempted from dipping in the succeeding autumn all sheep on his station other than the boundary flock so re-infected.
5. If any owner, in the opinion of the inspector, is not making any appreciable effort to rid his sheep of keds, the inspector may put that station into quarantine so that no sheep may be moved from it or through it.
6. Any owner who finds a re-infestation of keds upon his sheep shall notify the Agricultural Authority immediately. Failure to do so will incur the liability of a penny per sheep put out the previous autumn and as then entered in the Annual Stock Return.
7. When an owner does not apply for exemption from the regular autumn dipping by plunge dip by February 14th in any one year the Agricultural Authority shall conclude that that owner's sheep are not clear of keds, and that owner shall then be liable to the fine prescribed in Section 3 of this Order.

Explanatory notes on the proposed Order in Council for the Clearance of Keds.

An Order in Council does not require presentation at a normal meeting of the Legislative Council. After the final approved draft is submitted to Executive Council for study, it is then signed by the Governor and becomes law.

It is thus hoped to have this Order passed into law during October in order to give the maximum time for those farms where ked infection exists at present to commence steps to clear their station of infection before fines become high.

An Order in Council like all Ordinances automatically gets sent to London for legal scrutiny.

Your SOA committee makes no attempt to assert that the proposed Order in Council for the Clearance of keds, is entirely proof against some opinions of experts in agricultural law, but we feel that given a spirit of co-operation from all farm owners, it is probably as lawyer proof as many other Government laws, and we feel that the Sheep Owners Association can expect such co-operation.

Para. 3. We feel that the fines that may be incurred are not too heavy, but at the same time, being accumulative, are sufficient inducement to get our farming industry entirely ked free.

Para. 4. This paragraph, to be fully effective, will depend upon the owner or manager of the re-infected station taking careful notice in the first set of available yards as to whether there are any sheep that belong to his neighbour amongst his own sheep; if he finds this to be so and in addition such strangers carry ked infection, he must immediately summon an inspector from Stanley to view the situation and give his opinion. Failure to effect this could well lead to the full fine for his station.

We appreciate that this full operation is not simply carried out but we also feel that some proven allowance must be made for the owner who becomes re-infected through no fault of his own.

Para. 5. This penalty of being put into full quarantine is unlikely to happen for about four years, or in 1978. There is always the future possibility of preventing Butchery mutton reaching their destination but your committee felt that the surmounting of this problem could wait until the occasion was likely to occur.

Para. 6. This would appear to us as self-explanatory and is intended to help Government in the whole eradication programme.

Para. 7. This was considered necessary by your committee so that the Agricultural Authorities would know where they stood in any autumn with regard to the whereabouts of ked infection.

N.B. Please let the committee have your views on this proposed Order in Council, not later than September 10th, 1974.

If any station does not reply by that date we shall then conclude that that station is in full agreement.

We have gone to some considerable trouble in this preparation and though we would welcome any good suggestion we feel that the time for argument is past and we must press on if infected stations are to have time to consider future plans. You appointed us and we have completed the task we think.
