14A DRURY STREET OR 3 LOWER ROW NB: There is no 13 Drury Street; instead 14 and 14A Drury Street

This house is one of the original "two roomed kit houses worth £50 each" that were shipped down on board the Victory which arrived in Stanley 13 October 1849. Twelve cottages were built on Drury Street (or Lower Row as it was originally called) for the military pensioners who also arrived on the same ship. This house was originally 3 Lower Row and was allotted to **James BROWN**, a private and military pensioner from Ireland, who had arrived 13 October 1849 on board the Victory.

James departed for England as a confirmed invalid in October 1854 and the property escheated to the Falkland Islands Government. In May 1855 it was being rented by **Henry PETTIT**. In 1858 the cottage was allocated to a member of the newly arrived detachment on the *Ealing Grove*. [B10]

On 8 September 1879 Crown Grant 243 was issued to **Manuel RODRIGO** for £66, being Pensioners Cottage Allotments 3 containing 24 poles and measuring 60 links x 250 links. [CG 243]

On 12 July 1883 **Manuel RODREGO**, seaman of Stanley, granted to **James ANDREWS**, carpenter of Stanley, Pensioners Cottage Allotments No 3 containing 24 poles bounded "on the North by Drury Street 59 ½ links on the East by Lot 2, 250 links on the South by a Road 59 ½ links and on the West by allotment No 4, 250 links. Together with all buildings and erections thereon" for £110. [BUG-REG-3; 179]

On 20 July 1887 **James ANDREWS**, carpenter of Stanley, granted to **John Henry WILLIAMS**, carter of Stanley, Pensioners Cottage Allotments No 3 containing 24 poles bounded "on the North by Drury Street 59 ½ links on the East by Lot No 2 250 links, on the south by a Road 59

1/2 links and on the West by Allotment No 4, 250 links. Together with all buildings and erections whatsoever thereon" for £140. [BUG-REG-4; 11]

In 1891, for tax purposes, 3 Lower East Pensioners Row was valued at £18. [FI Gazette]

On 30 March 1922 **John Henry WILLIAMS** of Stanley granted to **Nathaniel Thomas Paice** of Hill Cove, Pensioners Cottage Allotments No 3 containing 24 poles bounded "on the North by Drury Street 59 ½ links, on the East by Lot No 2, 250 links on the South by a road 59 ½ links and on the West by allotment No 4, 250 links. Together with all buildings and erections whatsoever thereon" for £350. [BUG-REG-9; 63]
