In reply to His Excellency's minute of 22/I0/20. para 2.

- The sum of £13-11-10 represents labour in connection (a). with the removal of soil from the frontage of the Quarters to anable clay and rubble bottom to be laid and rammed in front of plinth: part laying of concrete pavement: tracing of old drain at the west end of building.
- The items £49-2-8 and £25 have no connection one with the other.

The sum of £49-2-8 is for clearing of ditches in lownship, stone cracking and quarrying for road metal generally: and coninuation of pavement round Quarters.

The sum of £25. Contract for the removal of bushes and also to dig and clear all ditches buried and overgrown by the bushes. Also cutting of steps in face of bank. (e)

Duildings, as the largest part of the contract was in connection with the removal of the bushes, the other work arising from the first. The bushes were removed owing to the danger to the building should they catch fire,.

The sum of £I3-I5-6 "Rock Cottage" is labour in connection with the removal of surface concrete: lowering of back yar removal of old drain from under the house: opening up new drain on north side of bank: removing soil from under back portion of house: and cutting back bank to enable back porch to be placed to the south of building with door facing the east.
