I would also bring to your notice the fact that another vehicle of mine - namely my motor invalid tricycle - was maliciously overturned while parked outside the Town Hall last right. When discovered at approximately 12.15 am the matter was immediately reported to the police at the police station The vehicle would appear to have been overturned for a considerable time as a quantity of gear oil had run out of an almost oil-tight gear case. The light outside the main door of the Town , Hall has for some time fermitted a certain amount
