
Dear Sir,

The committee of the above Society is hoping to organise a social evening in the near future, and I am to ask your permission if we may run Tombola and Horse Racing during the evening as means of entertainment. Dear Sir,

We are in receipt of your letter dated 14th. October 1954 concerning the proposed requisitioning of the Gymnasium for billeting workmen expected in the Colony in the near future, and consequent loss of its facilities to the above Clubs. At a Joint Committee Meeting of the three Clubs held on Sept. 16th. it was unanimously agreed that to lose the use of the Gymnasium would cause grievous harm to each Club and that in consequence a protest should be registered. The views of each Club regarding the effect on them of the loss of the Gymnasium and also the prospect of the alternative accommodation suggested were expressed, and these views together with some notes on Club activities are outlined below:

1. Falkland Islands Folk Dancing Society:

This Society has a membership of some 240 regularly each season and enters for persons from 15 years of age upward, using the Gymnasium on one night a week throughout the winter months. It is felt that to be deprived of the use of the Gymnasium would mean the almost certain winding up of this Society's activities. Experience from socials held in the Town Hall has shown that to transfer dancing to this building would prove dangerous owing to the floor being too slippery.

2. Stanley Badminton Club:

The Badminton Club, with a membership of 75 from 11 years upward, uses the Gymnasium on three nights a week for the greater part of the year, one night being devoted entirely for the purpose of providing badminton for juniors of 11-16 years. The floor of the Town Hall again rules out its use for this activity on the grounds of its slippery surface. This Club too, feels that without the Gymnasium the chances of its continuing are virtually nil.

3. Stanley P.T. and Boxing Club:

With a membership of 50 from 11 years upward, the P.T. and Boxing Club uses the Gymnasium two nights a week throughout the winter with much use made of the odd hours prior to the other Club's activities commencing, this being particularly so as the annual tournament approaches, when all available time is utilised. Loss of the Gymnasium would result in the loss of a great deal of the essential equipment (ring ropes, etc.) needed for their activities. As an alternative the Town Hall offers little or no opportunity, it being unsuitable in so far as there could be no provision for the fixed wall and ceiling equipment and no storage space readily accessible for the majority of their moveable equipment which is of necessity heavy and bulky. Some £45 worth of new equipment has already been ordered and would be wasted without the facilities of a building designed for its use. The Club's activities, besides providing physical training and boxing, culminate in the annual Boxing tournament and P.T. display, now a popular and much looked forward to local event in the Town. To restrict the Club's activities in any way would mean its winding up.

It will be appreciated from the above, that the three Clubs cater for some 300 people, taking into account that a number belong to more than one Club. This represents approximately 25% of the population of Stanley. In this membership is found the majority of the teen-age population, who, were they deprived of the Gymnasium's facilities would have little else to turn to in the way of recreation. This, surely is an important consideration. Furthermore, none of the Clubs has been in existence so very long, and it is felt that considerable time would pass before they again reached the status they have at present, if forced to close now.

We would be grateful if this letter was circulated round the council members and also brought before Government. An extra copy of this letter is enclosed for your convenience.

The response was promising, but unfortunately on the days arranged only two of the eight attended, so of course the class was discontinued.

During the year 29 new records have been purchased, and another record case has been ordered, at this point may I add that no purchases are made without the approval of the committee.

We can now boast of a notice board for Society news, which will be placed in the Gymnasium.

I was compelled to issue a warning to the junior members during last season, regarding their unruly behaviour at our dances. A committee meeting was called, and all felt the rowdiness, which was steadily increasing, had to be controlled, so we decided to suspend any member who misbehaved. Some members consider our Monday evening dance is an excellent opportunity to engage in boisterous frolic.

You have learned from the balance sheet we have bought decorations. Some of these were used for our final party, and the committee felt, as we had a balance in hand, we should purchase some large paper decorations for use at any future entertainments.

During the year under review new dances have been demonstrated and learned. The membership and attendance dropped somewhat, but this was due to the 'flu' epidemic, and the chilled condition of the Gymnasium.

One social evening was organised in May, and 136 members attended. We hoped to arrange another, but as the attendance dropped, this was not possible. I think you will all agree our socials are a wonderful source of entertainment. We were very fortunate in being able to hold our final party in the Town Hall again last year. The cost, which is fairly high, comes from the general funds collected during the year. If the present membership continues I can see no reason why the final party cannot always be held in the Town Hall.

To conclude my annual report, I would like to emphasise our aim is to improve the Society. If anyone has any suggestions or ~~criticisms~~ criticisms, please take them to a committee member or write to the Secretary.





### CIRCULAR TO COMMITTEE MEMBERS.

RECORD CASE. On 12th. July, 1955 a record case to hold 50, 10 in. records was ordered from Falkland Store. To date this has not arrived. We could order a case to hold 50, 16in. and another to hold 36, 12in. records for the sum of £2 19 6 plus postage, direct from England. Do you agree we cancel our order from Falkland Store, and order two cases ourselves?

ROOM IN GYMNASIUM. We have had requests from persons having wedding dances in the Gymnasium if they can use our room to prepare refreshments. Ken and I are of the opinion we should assist these people as the catering facilities are rather limited. We have, without your permission, let the room on two ~~one~~ occasions. On the first occasion it was used as a "boozing den", so we asked them to leave, and on the second occasion the room was left in a very untidy condition. We are, more or less, obliged to let these people use the room, as we do not want to have it taken from us. If you agree we let them use the room for wedding and birthday dances only, do you agree the following "rules" be posted on the wall?

## CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 1957.

In presenting my Report I must, first of all, make reference to the excellent work done by the committee, Miss H. Bernsten, Miss. D. Jennings, Mr. B. Shorey and Mr. R. Roberts. Miss Z. Goss, our joint Hon. Secretary and Treasurer, has again placed us all in her debt by the careful attention she has given to this duty. Mrs. Pallini also deserves a word of thanks for the efficient way she so willingly, year after year, undertakes the duty of doorkeeper. At this point it is fitting to thank Mr. J. King and Mr. W. Coutts for providing the excellent lighting effect at our final social evening, and Mr. Tony Hardy for providing a very interesting film show during this social. There are also many non-members who take such an interest in the society, far too numerous to thank by name, who present gifts for prizes, etc.

The Demonstration Team worked very hard last year learning new dances. They also found time to learn the "Lancers". This was danced for members entertainment during our final social, and judging by the applause, was appreciated by all. Our thanks are due to Mr. & Mrs. Pallini for helping us put on the exhibition. We all appreciate the team's willingness, and on behalf of you all, I wish to thank them for their assistance. Miss M. Enestrom and Mr. E. Roberts, who recently left the Colony were members of the team, and they take our best wishes for their future happiness and success.

A class for seniors was held last year. The few who attended found it most beneficial and interesting.

The junior class was again held. The attendance was disappointing, but the class was beneficial to those who were really keen and attended regularly. I do not think people did not attend because there was a lack of interest, but because there are so many other organisations functioning at the same time. Too many organisations are inclined to defeat their own aim in the long run.

During the year under review, three social evenings were held in the Town Hall. Two of which members were charged a nominal fee, and the third was provided free of charge for members. It is fortunate the Society is in such a good financial state to permit us run the final social from the funds. These cost quite a lot of money, and this was the third year we have been able to hold this party in the Town Hall. More records have been ordered to replace worn ones, also a few new ones. We also bought two more record carrying cases, so we now have three. These will prevent damage and breakage.

You will notice fromt the Balance Sheet we have bought some decorations. The committee selected these with great care, and were ordered through the F.I.C. They are of excellent quality, and will prove most useful for future social evenings. You will notice that more than half of the cost was paid from the Entertainments Fund. Another purchase we made was a rubber stamp.

During the year it has been my privelage to take the Girls Life Brigade for Folk Dance Classes. This is beneficial to the Society, for when they become 13 years old and join the Society, they have already mastered the steps etc., and learnt quite a few dances.

In bringing my Report to a close, may I say how grateful I am personally to all members who have helped me during the past year. It would be impossible to thank everyone individually in this report. I would nevertheless assure each of them I deeply appreciate their work.
