With reference to His Excellency's memo of the 8th of September, 1930, I have the honour to inform you that His Excellency's kind offer to present prizes at the Fancy Dress entertainments arranged for the 3rd and 24th October was intimated to the Executive Committee of the Zachariah Fee Revue at a meeting held on the 11th inst.

While greatly appreciating His Excellency's kindness, the Committee considered it would be better to dispense with prizes at both entertainments for the reason that it might lead some who were not too well-off to spend more than they could afford on their costumes. The opinion expressed was that where a prize was offered there was always a certain amount of rivalry which tended rather to detract from than to add to the enjoyment of the occasion.

The Committee desired me to say, when putting this view before His Excellency, that they were deeply grateful for his generosity but that they felt that it was in the best interests of the play and those taking part that prizes should not be given.



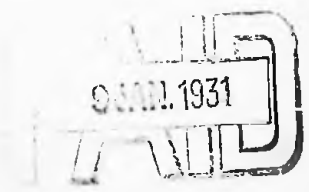
