On behalf of the Committee of the Stanley Flower Show and Industrial Exhibition, I beg to make application for the use of the first floor of the Town Hall on Friday and Saturday, the 24th and 25th February, for the purpose of holding the annual Exhibition. The Committee would be grateful if special terms of hire could be arranged.

It is desirable that the Committee should have the use of the Hall for several days before the Exhibition, as there will be a good deal of time and labour ~~expended~~ expended in preparing for the actual Show. The stalls have to be erected and decorated, and the Exhibits are generally received two days before the Exhibition is opened to the Public to give the necessary time for judging the Exhibits, and arranging the Stalls.

The Committee would also be glad if some assistance could be given them in the supply of material for the erection of the Stalls. They are given to understand that various material used during the War for "Red Cross" Sales of Work, was carefully preserved for use on future occasions.
