

<u>20th October</u>. His Majesty has approved of following arrangements observance in this country Armistice Day 11th November

- (1) Short service will be held at Cenotaph on the lines adopted in previous years including Hymn
  "O God Cur Help In Ages Past" His Majesty the King will be present and will lay a wreath.
- (ii) 2 minutes silence will be observed at 11 a.m. Local authorities in this country will be asked to arrange suspension all vehicular traffic for 2 minutes from 11 a.m. but rail and water transport will not be suspended.

I propose to lay wreaths on behalf of Colonies and Frotectorates.

# NOTICE.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Stanley, Falkland Islands. 39th October, 1924.

It is notified, for general information, that the Geremony which took place at the Cemetery on Armistico Day, 1923, will be repeated as closely as possible this year, on Euceday the lith of Hovember.

The Governor accompanied by Members of the Executive and Legislative Councils, Heads of Departments and members of the public will proceed to the Cometery leaving the Yown Hall at 10.50 a.m.

A detachment of the Defence Force under the Commanding Officer will also attend in parade order.

Upon arrival at the Comstery wreaths will be laid by His Excellency, by the Officer Commanding the Defence Force and by private individuals on the Maval and Volunteer graves.

The Gathedral bell will be rung from 10.55 to 11 a.m. precisely, after which two guns will be fired in rapid succession from Victory Green. On the firing of these guns 2 minutes silence will take place after which one gun will be fired. The Hymn "O God Our Help In Ages Past" will then be sung and the proceedings terminated.

CIRCULAR.

With reference to my predecessor's telegram of the 20th of October, I have the honour to inform you that a ceremony was held on the 11th of November, the Anniversary of Armistice Day, at the Cenotaph, on the lines which have now become usual.

2. His Majesty the King, accompanied by Their Royal Highnesses the Prince of Wales and the Duke of York, was present at the Cenotaph and the Royal party laid wreaths thereon.

3. Wreaths were also laid by the High Commissioners of the self-governing Dominions or their representatives. As I was unable, through indisposition, to be present in person, I requested the Right Honourable Sir William Joynson-Hicks, the Secretary of State for Home Affairs, to lay a wreath on the Cenotaph on my behalf as from the Governments and Peoples of the Colonies and Protectorates.

4. The expenses incurred in the purchase of the wreath, including a contribution to Earl Haig's Fund for Distressed Ex-Service Men, will be apportioned as on the last occasion.
