Sir,

With reference to my telegrams of the 27th of October and the 6th of November I have the honour to inform you that the Ceremony held at the Cenotaph on the 11th of November last on the anniversary of Armistice Day followed closely the lines of the Ceremony last year, and that it was my privilege to lay a wreath at the foot of the Cenotaph on behalf of the Governments and Peoples of the Colonies and Protectorates.

2. The entire expenses involved in connection with the wreath, including a contribution of £5 5s. made to Earl Haig's Fund for distressed ex-service men, will be apportioned as on the last occasion. I felt that those whom I represented would again wish to be associated with the effort which was being made on behalf of this Fund by means of the sale of Flanders Poppies.

3. The wreath was photographed by Mr. F. C. Stodate, 11, Harewood Place, Hanover Square, W. 1, from whom copies can be obtained if desired at a cost of 5s. each.
