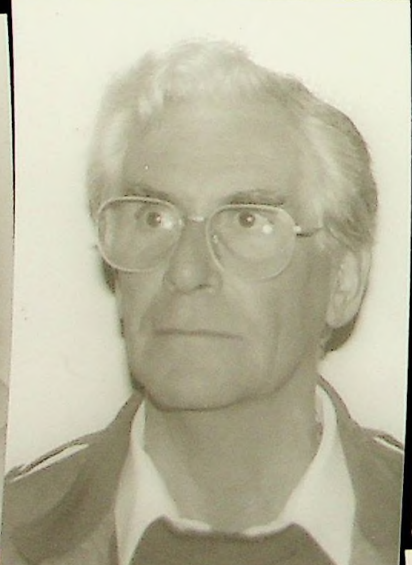

John said his name was Mennem and got hit with a jar

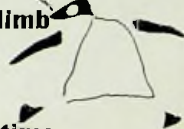


Nine little thespians to clinic took their mate
Cris found anaesthetic - and then there were eight



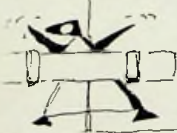
Eight little thespians felt traumatised and grim

Aaaaah!



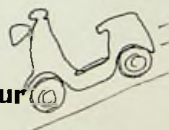
Seven little thespians felt better for the crime

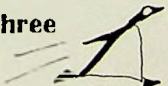
Six little thespians devised a silly prank

Rene rode down past Reflections - and then there were four

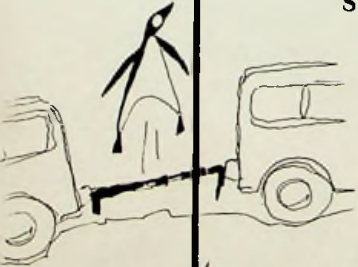


Four little thespians to Fitzroy took a spree
Steph couldn't pass the Roadside Inn so then there were three

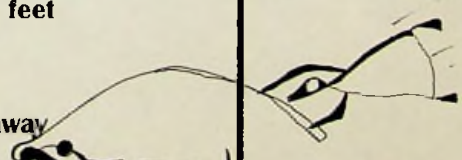
