I am directed by the Acting Governor to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 20th instant asking that you may be acquainted, in your capacity as agents for the Admiralty, with the views of this Government in regard to an act of alleged trespass on Admiralty property at the Naval Oil Depot by Mr. Michael Robson and Mr. Ernesto Rowe on the 19th of March, and to inform you that on the information available Mis Excellency is advised that no case lies for the immediate prosecution by the Police of the persons named. It remains open to you, however, as agents for the Admiralty to bring a private action for trespass in this connection before the Courts of the Colony.

2. I am to add that enquiry has shown that no notices as to trespass are displayed at the Naval Oil Depot at present and to suggest that your position in the event of the recurrence of an incident of this nature might be strengthened by the prominent display of warning notices at the entrances to the property/
