Sir,

The Admiralty inform me that it is not proposed to take any action to replace or repair the damaged 5 ton Coaling Crane at the Naval Camber, for the present, in view of the small amount of coaling likely to be carried out at the Falklands in the future.

2. I am directed to obtain tenders for the purchase of the damaged Crane, and forward same to the Admiralty for decision.

3. It is therefore requested that you will please cause the following notice to be exhibited in Port Stanley -
