If it has been definitely decided that the Stone House and outbuildings will never be used as a Government Quarantine Station, then I would suggest that approval be granted.

2. The question of quarantining arrangements will be dealt with separately. In any case now that the stone cottage is required for Admiralty use the former arrangement by which this was a quarantine station cannot be renewed.

3. On ref 492/24 attached the D.C./ Naval Works offers living quarters at Navy Point for sale and the C.E. advises that they are worth buying at the price given for re-erection in Stanley. Mr. Challin is I understand prepared to transport the quarters to Stanley and to re-erect them and also to line them with felt and match boarding for £70. Subject to the concurrence of the C.E. I recommend that this offer be accepted and that Mr. Challin be so informed.
