



(NAV PURPOSES.)

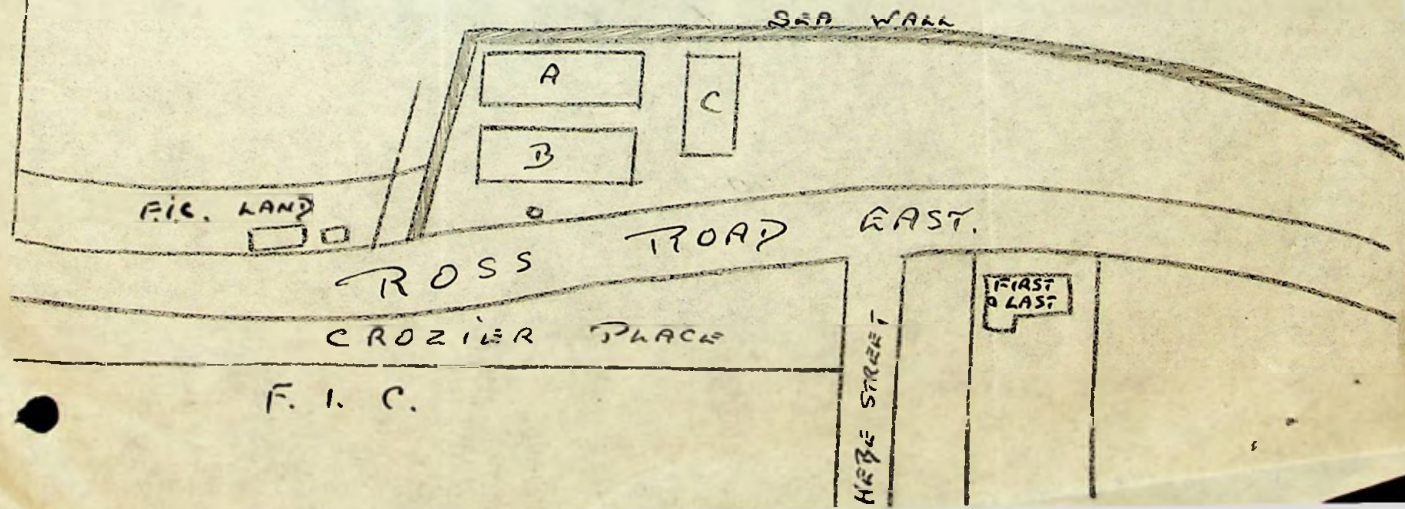
Subject to the approval of the Falkland Islands Government, the Admiralty propose to erect three Nissen Huts on the foreshore east of the Falkland Islands Company's East Jetty (vide accompanying sketch). These huts will be built on brick piles and floored with timber. They will take the place of the First and Last for storage of Naval Stores.

With reference to your E 1/T 6 of the 20th July, the Colonial Government has no objection to the use of this site by the Admiralty for erecting Nissen huts, on the understanding that the land be restored or that mutually agreed compensation be paid in lieu at the end of the war. This is the arrangement made with the Military Authorities for similar purposes. Your confirmation will be sufficient, but I should be grateful if you could provide us with an accurate scale plan of the land required. The Executive Engineer will no doubt co-operate in producing this, if necessary.
