With reference to the recent correspondence in connection with the purchase of Shale oil from the Naval Stores at the Camber, I have to advise you that the whole consignment of shale oil - 464 gallons complete in 232 steel cans - is now available for 2/6 a gallon including container.

As before reported the oil is ver well suited for the engines at Fox Bay and represents sufficient for more than one years service.

I seek your authority to purchase this oil now by S.W. at the value of £58. the estimate for maintenance of Fox Bay W/T Station in 1948 being correspondingly reduced.

Dear Dr. Johnson,

I refer to your letter 17302/47 of the 27th October enclosing a copy of Falkland Islands telegram No.573 of the 6th October 1947.

The value of the paints stated by the Naval Authorities in the Falkland Islands to have been supplied to the Government of the island, based on prices which will appear in the new Rate Book, and for some items, particularly linseed oil, on later contract prices which will appear in the first errata to the new Rate Book, is £1,136. Including oncosts at the home rates (and excluding the freight factor) the repayment value would be £1,311.

The present value of the balance of the paint, valued at 1943/44 prices at £806 would be in the region of £1,400.

It thus appears that the Falkland Island Government's offer is £1,512 for approximately £2,700 worth of paint. If, however, the linseed oil content of the paint (1,000 gallons) is being replaced free of charge to the Admiralty the offer is equivalent to about £2,500.

It should be emphasised that the paints in question are not surplus to Admiralty requirements; on the contrary, they are in very short supply and we only agreed to their transfer in order to assist the Falkland Island Government. In these circumstances we do not consider that the paint could be sold other than on a full repayment basis.

We suggest you inform the Falkland Islands that they can retain the paint which has already been handed over, but which they describe in their telegram No.400 as of "doubtful use", for £1,300. Alternatively, they can have the whole lot for £2,700.

If either of these two offers are accepted, it would be understood that the oil content of the paint would be replaced in kind in the United Kingdom out of the Crown Agents quota and that the value of the oil would be set against the prices mentioned in the last paragraph.

Should the Falkland Islands Government decide they do not wish to take over any of the paints on the terms mentioned, the local Navil Authority will be instructed to return it to the United Kingdom.

- 40 Your Saving Pelegran No. 122 of the 22nd of December 1947. Admiralty Surplus Stores.
- This Government accepts the first suggestion in the sixth paragraph of the enclosure in your saving Telegram i.e. it will retain the paint already hunded over for \$1,300.
- 2. I would observe however that my telegram No.400 of 1947 did not refer to any point as of "doubtral use": and that the paint referred to as such in my telegram No. 573 of 1947 was some of the remainder of the stock which this Government does not require. To save time the Maval Officer-in-Charge has been requested to arrange for the return to the United Kingdom of the paint not required, in view of the Torthcoming closing down of the Royal Maval Station here.
