I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your despatch No. 109, of the 12th October, forwarding for report, a letter from the Admiralty in which it is represented that an Admiralty launch has been retained in this Colony for the use of the Governor, and inquiry made whether, in view of the services for which it is alleged the launch is not being used, the Colony will be prepared to purchase it

- 2. In reply I beg to state that no Admiralty launch has been retained in the Colony for the use of this Government or for the Governor. The launch in question has, for the present, been retained for use on the work of the Admiralty Wireless Station, now in course of construction, and is being employed saily in connection therewith...
 - 3. It is possible that the misunderstanding which has arises is due to the telegraphic correspondence which has passed on the subject of the Admiralty launches in this Colony. On the Elst August I received the following message in cypher, from the Senior Mayal Officer South Fast Coast of America addressed to the Governor:-

"Following received from the Admiralty for Senior Naval Officer Falkland Islands begins Transport Freshfield telegraphis whether three steam launches she brought out are being returned in her or retained for further service at Falkland Islands."
