My Lord,

I have the honour to inform Your Lordship that in accordance with programme H.M.S. "Delhi" under the command of Captain Tait, M.V.O., R.N., visited the Colony from the 12th to the 24th of March, 1930. From the 12th to the 14th the warship lay in Port Edgar on the West Falkland where she carried out surveying operations and for the remainder of the visit was moored in the inner harbour of Stanley opposite Government House.

2. I think that I can safely state that the visit was most successful and enjoyable from the point of view of both sides. Social activities and official duties were happily and effectively blended and due attention was given to the use of the occasion for military exercises.
