MY IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING TELEGRAM (REPEATED SAVING TO BUENOS AIRES , FALKLAND ISLANDS , PROTECTOR) GIVEN PROTECTOR'S PLAN IT WOULD ASSIST ME GREATLY IF WE WOULD AGREE TENTATIVELY BY 6TH DECEMBER (WHEN THE NAVAL ATTACHE EXPECTS TO VISIT HERE) ON A COORDINATED TIME-TABLE FOR THE NAVAL VISITS TO MONTVIDEO NEXT SPRING INCLUDING THE PROPOSED CALL BY ANOTHER OF HER MAJESTY'S SHIPS (YOUR LETTER OF SEPT 7).

2. TO ACHIEVE MAXIMUM IMPACT AND AVOID OVERSTRAINING LOCAL HOSPITALITY IT WOULD BE IDEAL IF VISITS COINCIDE . FROM THE VIEWPOINT OF ANGLO-URUGUAYAN RELATIONS MAXIMUM ADVANTAGE WOULD BE DERIVED IF THE SHIPS WERE IN PORT AT THE TIME OF INAUGURATION OF THE NEW PRESIDENT AND GOVERNMENT ON MARCH 1ST HOWEVER , I RECOGNIZE THAT THIS MIGHT BE INCONVENIENT FOR PROTECTOR . IF OTHER SHIPS WERE TO COME ALONE AT THE TIME OF THE INAUGURATION I WOULD BE PREPARED TO ACCEPT PROTECTOR IN LATE JANUARY OR VERY EARLY FEBRUARY SO AS TO ALLOW AT LEAST SOME GAP . IF NEITHER OF THESE PROPOSALS IS PRACTICABLE I WOULD SUGGEST THAT VISIT BY OTHER SHIPS SHOULD BE POSTPONED UNTIL SECOND WEEK OF 1963 .

3. OTHER DATES TO BE BORNE IN MIND ARE FEB 24. TO FEB 26 (CARNIVAL) AND MARCH 18 TO MARCH 19 (VISIT OF CHIEF OF DEFENCE STAFF) .

4. GRATEFUL TO LEARN YOUR PROPOSALS . YOU WILL NO DOUBT WISH TO CONSULT THE GOVERNOR OF THE FALKLAND ISLANDS ABOUT PLAN FOR PROTECTOR .



My Lord,

I have the honour to report that Her Majesty's Ship "Protector", under the command of Captain R.H. Graham, M.V.O., D.S.C., paid a further informal visit to Montevideo from the 29th of January to the 5th of February 1963.

--- 2. I enclose a summary of the programme of the visit, from which it may be seen that the customary compliments and protocol visits were duly paid. An addition to the normal programme was the ceremony in the British Cemetery when a party of Royal Marines (under Captain T.J. Wills), and of naval ratings, (together with a standard party from the local British Legion) paid honours at seven graves of British servicemen for which new headstones had lately been supplied by the War Graves Commission. The main ceremony centred round the graves of naval personnel killed during the "Grass Spee" action in December 1939. This event (like all the ship's activities) received good press coverage, and I was particularly pleased at this juncture at the implicit reminder (heartening to the British community and salutary for all) of the days when Britain and France together, with little help from others, were trying to ensure that a non-totalitarian Europe would emerge after the war.

3. Visits by H.M. Ships to Montevideo always bring to surface the abundant goodwill of the Uruguayan Navy and people towards Britain; but H.M.S. "Protector's" annual falls into a special category, best summed up in Captain Graham's references (during his Press conference)

etc., etc., etc.

Montevideo as the ship's "southern home port" during her tours in the Antarctic. As usual, a great deal of mutual entertainment was organised outside the official programme by the ship's company and by their Uruguayan and British friends. For example, the President of the Montevideo Municipal Council provided blocks of free seats on three evenings at the Teatro Solis, where by good fortune there was a performance of Latin-American ballet offering no linguistic problems. Another successful feature was the camping party organised, in shifts, at Laguna del Sauce, a pleasant lake-side site near Punta del Este. There is always a risk during naval visits to a not over-large community that fewer private invitations will be forthcoming to the relatively large number of ratings and marines than to the relatively small number of officers and petty officers: but the camping facilities (for the arrangement of which I am indebted on this, as on previous occasions, to Mr. R.A. Lacroze, my Commercial Attaché) ensured that this was not in fact a problem.

4. A further innovation in the programme for this visit which I should draw attention was the very successful banquet party given for Captain Graham and a number of the officers at his own suggestion by the Canadian Chargé d'Affaires, Mr. Francois Houde, which was followed by a performance of Uruguayan folk music by a group of gauchos.

5. I am very grateful to Captain Graham and his Officers and Ship's Company for their admirable contribution to the success of the programme.
