Submitted :- Subject Bullet stop and protection of floor on miniature range in drill hall.

I find it necessary to have erected a bullet stop for the miniature range in drill hall, at present it is not safe to fire as the lead splinters ricochet from the iron on the stop butt down on the floor and back up the hall.

In addition to being unsafe from the splinters, the lead is destroying the floor and in a short time this would entail heavy expenses in replacing the floor inside the miniature range.
