Sir

I beg to make the following suggestion for the consideration of His Excellency The Governor And Commander-in-Chief.

That in future the Colour or Union Jack which is hung in the Cathedral be carried on all Ceremonial Parades, i.e. (a) Guards of Honour

On the occasion on which the Colour is required, The Defence Force and the Colour Party:-(1 Officer, the Company Serjt Major and 2 Other Ranks) would march to the Cathedral and take the Colour over from the Dean. After the parade the colour would be returned to the Cathedral being handed over to the Dean.
