Sir,

19 Aug., 1899. *With reference to my predecessors' Circular despatches noted in the*
 15 Sept., 1900. *margin, I have the honour to inform you that in view of the services rendered*
 23 April, 1901. *by the Forces of the Dominions and Colonies during the Great War it has been*
 20 Sept., 1902. *decided to amend the Royal Warrants governing the issue of the Colonial*
 6 Oct., 1906. *Auxiliary Forces Officers' Decoration and the Colonial Auxiliary Forces Long*
 Service Medal to permit of service during the Great War counting two-fold
 towards qualifying service, on the lines recently laid down for the Territorial
 Force.

Copies of the amending Warrant in regard to the Colonial Auxiliary Forces Officers' Decoration are enclosed herewith. The terms of the corresponding Warrant in regard to the Colonial Auxiliary Forces Long Service Medal are still under the consideration of the Army Council but I hope to be in a position to address a further communication to you in regard to it at an early date.

It will be observed from the seventh and eighth Articles of the Territorial Decoration Warrant of the 13th of October, 1920, which was published in the London Gazette No. 32130 of the 19th of November, 1920, that in the case of that decoration the privilege of counting service during the Great War as two-fold is confined to officers who were serving in the Territorial Force on the

4th of August, 1914, and actually served overseas or signed a written agreement to serve overseas, on military service, before the 11th of November, 1918.

These limiting dates are not set out in the ninth and tenth Articles of the enclosed Warrant but it is desired that in this respect there should be identity of practice as between the Territorial Force and the Auxiliary Forces of the Colonies and Protectorates, and Regulations should accordingly be prepared for His Majesty's approval under the twelfth Article of the Warrant defining the application of the ninth and tenth Articles of the Warrant to the Auxiliary Forces of the Territory under your administration in the following manner :—

(a) The words in the ninth Article "who during the late war actually served, or accepted the obligation of serving" should be read as meaning:—
"who was serving as such on the 4th day of August, 1914, and did, before the 11th day of November, 1918, actually serve, or accept the obligation of serving."

(b) The same words in the tenth Article should be read as meaning:—
"who was serving in such Forces on the 4th day of August, 1914, and did before the 11th day of November, 1918, actually serve, or accept the obligation of serving."

The Regulation as to forfeiture, etc., of the Decoration should be based on Article 12 of the Territorial Decoration Warrant referred to above.

With reference to the second paragraph of my predecessor's Circular despatch of the 30th of July, 1921, I have the honour to transmit to you the enclosed copies of a Royal Warrant promulgating new rules, in substitution for those contained in previous Royal Warrants governing the issue of the Colonial Auxiliary Forces Long Service Medal.

2. As regards the terms "Territorial Army" and "The Territorial Efficiency Medal" in the 3rd, 6th and 7th Articles of the Warrant, I have to explain that, subsequent to the issue of the Warrant governing the Colonial Auxiliary Forces Officers' Decoration, the title of the "Territorial Force" was changed to "Territorial Army" by the Territorial Army and Militia Act, 1921, and that following upon this change of title, the name of "The Territorial Force Medal" was altered to "The Territorial Efficiency Medal."

3. It will be observed from Section 523(h) of Army Order 322 of 1919 (of which a copy is enclosed), that in the case of the Territorial Efficiency Medal the privilege of counting service during the Great War as two-fold is confined to men who were serving in the Territorial Army on the 4th of August, 1914, and were embodied under the Royal Proclamation of that date, and who before 11th November, 1918, signed an Agreement to serve outside the United Kingdom. These limiting dates are not set out in the 5th Article of the enclosed Warrant, but it is desired that in this respect there should be identity of practice as between the Territorial Army and the Auxiliary Forces of the Colonies and Protectorates. Regulations should accordingly be prepared for His Majesty's approval under the 8th Article of the Warrant defining the application of the 5th Article of the Warrant to the Auxiliary Forces of the territory under your administration in the following manner:—

The words in the 5th Article "who during the late war actually served, or accepted the obligation of serving" should be read as meaning "who was serving in such Forces on the 4th day of August, 1914, and did before the 11th day of November, 1918, actually serve or sign an agreement to serve."

THE COLONIAL AUXILIARY FORCES LONG SERVICE MEDAL.

GEORGE, R.I.

GEORGE THE FIFTH by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India: To all to whom these Presents shall come Greeting:

WHEREAS Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, did, by Royal Warrant dated the 18th day of May, 1899, institute and create a medal entitled "The Colonial Auxiliary Forces Long Service Medal" (hereinafter referred to as "the Medal") to be awarded to members of Our Colonial Auxiliary Forces in recognition of long and meritorious service, and did lay down rules and ordinances for the governance of the same, which rules and ordinances were subsequently amended by Royal Warrant dated the 3rd day of August, 1902:

AND WHEREAS We desire to recognise specially the meritorious service of members of Our Dominion and Colonial Auxiliary Forces during the late war:

AND WHEREAS We also deem it expedient to promulgate new rules and ordinances in substitution for those contained in the aforesaid Royal Warrants:

NOW THEREFORE We do declare that the rules and ordinances heretofore in force shall be abrogated, cancelled and annulled, and We are pleased to make, ordain and establish the following rules and ordinances in substitution for the same which shall from henceforth be inviolably observed and kept:—

Firstly.—It is ordained that the Medal shall be awarded to duly qualified members of all authorised Auxiliary Military Forces (*i.e.*, other than Permanent Forces) of Our Dominions, Colonies and Dependencies (except India) and of countries under Our protection (hereinafter referred to as Protectorates), whether designated as Militia or Volunteers or otherwise.

Secondly.—It is ordained that the period of service requisite to qualify for the Medal shall be 20 years; and that service on the West Coast of Africa shall reckon two-fold as qualifying service.

Thirdly.—It is ordained that service rendered wholly in the Auxiliary Forces of one or more of Our Dominions, Colonies or Protectorates; or partly in the Auxiliary Forces of one or more of Our Dominions, Colonies or Protectorates; partly in the Territorial Army of Great Britain, or partly in any Naval or Military Volunteer Force of any part of Our Empire (except service since 4th August, 1914, in the Volunteer Force of Great Britain raised under the Volunteer Acts, 1863-1916), shall be reckoned as qualifying service for the Medal.

Fourthly.—It is ordained that service on the Permanent Staff of the Auxiliary Forces of Our Dominions, Colonies, Dependencies or Protectorates by members of the Permanent Forces shall not reckon as qualifying service for the Medal.

Fifthly.—It is ordained that a member of the Auxiliary Forces of one of Our Dominions, Colonies, Dependencies or Protectorates who during the late war actually served, or accepted the obligation of serving, beyond the boundaries of the Dominion, Colony, Dependency or Protectorate, shall reckon all such embodied service on the active list two-fold as qualifying service towards the requisite 20 years, whether such service was in Our Naval Forces, Our Military Forces, or Our Air Forces.

PROVIDED that nothing in this Royal Warrant shall permit service to count more than two-fold towards the award of the Medal.

Sixthly.—It is ordained that service qualifying for the Medal shall also count towards the qualifying service necessary for "The Territorial Efficiency Medal," and *vice versa*.

Seventhly.—It is ordained that an officer who has served in the ranks of the Territorial Army of Great Britain, or of the Auxiliary Forces of a Dominion, Colony or Protectorate, but who is not qualified for the Colonial Auxiliary Forces Officers' Decoration, shall, on completing twenty years' service in all, be eligible to receive the Medal, but, should the aforesaid Decoration subsequently be conferred upon him, he shall not be called upon to surrender the medal, but

shall not be permitted to wear it until such time as he has completed the full periods required for both Decoration and Medal.

Eighthly.—It is ordained that the Medal shall be conferred under such regulations as to grant, forfeiture, restoration, and other matters, in amplification of these Our rules and ordinances, as may with Our approval signified through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, be issued from time to time by the Governors-General, Governors or officers administering the government of Our Dominions, Colonies or Protectorates, as the case may be.

Lastly.—We reserve to Ourselves, Our Heirs and Successors full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting, or dispensing with these rules and ordinances, or any part thereof, by a notification under Our Royal Sign Manual.

Given at our Court at St. James's, this 25th day of January, 1923, in the thirteenth year of Our Reign.

A.O. 322. Territorial Force Regulations—Amendments.— 68
1919. 1. Paragraph 515. *Delete* from “No” in line 23 on T.F.
page 128 to “Decoration” in line 25 and *substitute*— 1417

“An officer already in possession of the Volunteer Officers’ Decoration will be eligible to receive the Territorial Decoration and to wear both, provided that he has completed the full periods of qualifying service for both awards and that no qualifying service towards one decoration is permitted to count towards the other.”

2. *For* paragraph 526A *substitute*—

526A. An officer who has been previously granted the Volunteer Long Service Medal, the Imperial Yeomanry Long Service and Good Conduct Medal, or the Territorial Force Efficiency Medal, may be subsequently awarded the Territorial Decoration and wear both medal and decoration, provided that the full periods of qualifying service for both awards have been served and that no qualifying service towards one award is permitted to count towards the other.

3. *For* paragraphs 523 and 523A (promulgated by Army Order 470 of 1915) *substitute*— 68

Efficiency Medal.

523. A medal designated the “Territorial Force Efficiency Medal” will be granted to warrant officers, N.C.Os. and men of the Territorial Force who complete 12 years’ continuous service,* with a minimum of

* No break in service, however short, in the Territorial Force, is allowable except as provided in sub-paragraphs (h), (j), and (n).

12 trainings, and who are recommended by their C.O., subject to the conditions mentioned below :—

Qualifying
service.

(a) Service in the Imperial Yeomanry or the Volunteer Force,* before the formation of the Territorial Force, will be admissible for every year in which a man was returned as efficient, provided that he was serving on the 31st March, 1908, and enlisted in the Territorial Force before the 30th June, 1908.

An Imperial Yeoman who enlisted into the same arm of the Territorial Force may be awarded the medal after 10 years' service and 10 trainings in that arm.

(b) Men in the possession of the Imperial Yeomanry Long Service and Good Conduct Medal or the Volunteer Long Service Medal, in respect of their services in the Imperial Yeomanry or Volunteer Force, may also be granted the Territorial Force Efficiency Medal, provided that they have fulfilled the required conditions for award of that medal, and that no particular period of service is counted for more than one medal.

(c) Men already in possession of the Efficiency Medal, who either received it in respect of their past Imperial Yeomanry or Volunteer service on enlistment into the Territorial Force, or have earned it subsequent to such enlistment, and who have served for a further period which would qualify them for the award of a second Efficiency Medal, may be awarded a clasp to be worn with the original medal.

No particular period of service will be allowed to count as qualifying service for both medal and clasp.

(d) Service qualifying for the Colonial Auxiliary Forces, or the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, Long Service Medals, will be admissible provided that the last 5 years have been served in the Territorial Force.

(e) Commissioned service will be admissible in the case of those men who were commissioned after service in the ranks of the Territorial Force during the period of embodiment of the force subsequent to the Royal Proclamation of the 4th August, 1914, and who within 3 months of

* In the event of difficulty being experienced in obtaining the date of discharge of an applicant from the old Volunteer Forces, the officer submitting the claim should call upon him to produce for inspection the discharge certificate awarded to him under Army Order 130 of 1908.

the date of relinquishing their commissions re-enlist in the ranks of the Territorial Force. Such officers who relinquished their commissions owing to wounds, or sickness contracted on service during the above-mentioned period of embodiment, will also be allowed to count such commissioned service as qualifying service towards the award of the medal.

(f) Service in a Cadet unit will not be admissible except when rendered in the ranks of a Cadet Corps or Cadet Battalion which belonged to the organization existing prior to the 21st May, 1910, and then only provided that a Cadet enlisted into the Territorial Force within 6 months of leaving his Cadet unit, and that no service rendered before the age of 15 or after the age of 17 is permitted to count.

(g) Continuity of service in the Imperial Yeomanry, Breaks in Volunteer Force, Colonial Auxiliary Forces, or service. Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve must not have been broken for periods of more than 12 months at a time, and in the case of the Imperial Yeomanry and Volunteer Force such breaks must have been prior to the 31st March, 1908. (See sub-paragraph (l).)

(h) Men of the Territorial Force (including the Territorial Force Reserve) who were serving in the force on the 4th August, 1914, and were embodied under the Royal Proclamation of that date, and who before 11th November, 1918, signed an agreement to serve outside the United Kingdom, will be allowed to count embodied service (including service specified in sub-paragraphs (e) and (j)) double towards qualifying service.

Continuity of qualifying service will be admitted in the case of any of these men, who, having been discharged from the Territorial Force subsequent to the 4th August, 1914, by reason of wounds or illness contracted on service, subsequently during the period of embodiment re-enlisted into the force voluntarily after recovery.

(j) Men of the Territorial Force who are permitted to enlist in the Royal Navy, the Regular Army, or the Royal Air Force, for the period of a war may count such service as qualifying for the award of the medal, and if within 3 months of the date on which they ceased to be required for service with such force, these men re-enlist into the Territorial Force, their service will be deemed to be continuous.

(k) A period of embodied service of not less than two months in each calendar year, reckoned from 1st January to 31st December, will be allowed to count as the equivalent of the training for that year, or, in the case of the men referred to in sub-paragraph (h), as the equivalent of two trainings. In no case, however, will more than one such qualifying period (whether training or the alternative minimum period of embodiment) be allowed to count in any one calendar year.

Inadmissi-
ble service.

(l) Service in the Regular Army will not be considered as qualifying service, except as provided for in sub-paragraph (j), but will not be reckoned in the breaks mentioned in sub-paragraph (g).

(m) Commissioned service is not admissible as qualifying service, except as specified in sub-paragraph (e).

(n) Service in the Territorial Force Reserve, the Technical Reserve or the National Reserve, is not admissible, but if a man were actually serving in the Territorial Force Reserve on the date on which embodiment was ordered and was called up and held to serve, the period of his service in the Territorial Force Reserve, although not counting towards the qualifying period, will not be considered to be a break in the continuity of the qualifying period.

(o) Men of the Territorial Force who are released from military service for the purpose of being employed on work of national importance* during the continuance of a war, will not count the period of such release as qualifying service for the medal, but they will not be considered to have broken their continuity of service.

* Note.—To be defined as occasion arises.

- (e) No service shall count more than two-fold towards the award of the Medal.

Applications.

- 3. Applications for the medal shall be made in writing by Officers Commanding Volunteer Units through the usual channel of correspondence to the Administrator and they shall in each case be supported by a statement of the applicant's service on Form D.

Nominal Rolls.

- 4. Officers Commanding Volunteer Units will forward with Form D a nominal Roll arranged alphabetically

Restoration.

8. A medal forfeited by a member of the Auxiliary Forces under the provisions of paragraph 7 may be restored to him by the Administrator and notice of forfeiture or restoration shall in every case be published in the Government Gazette.

Loss.

9. When a Medal has been lost and it is desired to replace

replace it, a declaration shall be made before a Magistrate stating the circumstances under which the loss occurred, and the rank, name and unit of individual to whom the Medal belonged. With reference to Mr. Churchill's Circular despatch of the 30th of July, 1921, I have the honour to transmit to you copies of a Royal Warrant dated the 22nd of June, 1927, amending the Warrant of the 9th of June, 1921, governing the issue of the Colonial Auxiliary Forces Officers' Decoration.

2. This Warrant has been issued primarily in order to rectify an error in the Warrant of 1921 in regard to the width of the riband from which the Decoration is suspended. Under the second rule and ordinance of the 1921 Warrant, it was ordained that the riband in question shall be $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches in width, but the riband which was approved by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria for this Decoration was $1\frac{1}{4}$ inches in width, and so far as can be ascertained, no Decorations have been issued having a riband $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches wide. It has therefore been prescribed by the new Warrant that the riband shall be $1\frac{1}{4}$ inches wide.

3. The opportunity has also been taken to provide for the size of reproductions of the Decoration in miniature.


