There is correspondence with SOG's relative to the "claim of the Falkland Islands Volunteer Corps for war medal" which contains decision of Army Council that members of the Corps are ineligible for the award of the British War Medal. The final letter from the War Office to C.O. is dated 10th July 1923 bears number 68/121/2344/5. I do not know whether a copy of this letter was sent to the Colony or not but this is immaterial: it was written after the Colonial office had passed the claim so far as that was possible in official correspondence.

2. I took up the matter when I was in England & made representations personally both to the Duke of Devonshire & Mr. Amery who was at the time Secretary of State for the Colonies & Foreign and of the Admiralty respectively. They were both sympathetic but the terms of the warrants awarding the medal make it clear that members of the Falkland Islands Volunteer Corps are not eligible for the British War Medal in respect of the valuable services which they rendered in the latter part of the year 1914.

3. At a parade on 3rd Jan 1924 I informed the Defence Force of the decision of the Army Council + at the same time stated that the Government of the Falkland Islands desired to present a badge to the members of the Corps who were mobilized for active service in 1914.

4. Before proceeding further in the matter it is desirable that I should have a definite opinion from the O.C. Defence Force that a badge would be acceptable to the members of the Volunteer Corps who were mobilized for active service in 1914 + that they will regard the presentation of a badge as an honour. I should like to find if O.C. Defence Force would take steps to ascertain the feeling on the matter of those who served in 1914.

5. A badge was awarded by the Government of Jamaica to the Militia members of the Colony who were mobilized for the British War Medal. The attached letter from Sir Leslie Popham gives information about the ^{badge} and he was good enough to send a specimen.

Arms of the Army in silver + enamel. On the reverse should be engraved "Falklands Islands Volunteer Corps 1914" + the rank + name of the member of the Corps.

7. All officers + other ranks should be eligible for the badge who were called over for action service (under the Proclamation dated 16th August 1914) previous to the 31st of December 1914 + who actually served between the two dates given above provided that the officer or volunteer has not been awarded a medal by the Imperial Government + has not been discharged from the Corps for misconduct.

8. If reply of O.C. Depone Free to para 4 above should prove satisfactory he can proceed with preparation of nominal roll of officers + other ranks who are eligible for the badge.

Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter dated the 14th. of April, asking for information in regard to the Badges distributed to the men of the Jamaica Militia Artillery who served in the Forts of the Island during the War.

2. The Badge was designed locally, the "Grenade" design being selected on account of the men being of an Artillery Unit and Messrs: Mappin and Webb of 158 Oxford Street, London, carried out the work. The mens' badge is of silver and the officers' of 9 carat gold, with blue enamel inscription. The cost of the former was 5/- each and of the latter £1.17.6. each.

3. The conditions for the award of the Badge were :-

"The Special Silver Badge presented by the Government of Jamaica for War Service, will be awarded to all ranks of the Jamaica Militia Artillery, who were actually mobilized for Service at the Forts for a period of not less than one month between 4th. August 1914 and 11th. November, 1918.

Provided that the Officer or soldier has not been awarded a medal or badge by the Imperial Government, and or, has not been discharged from his Corps for misconduct".

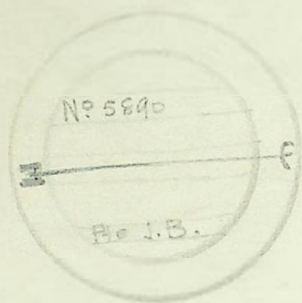

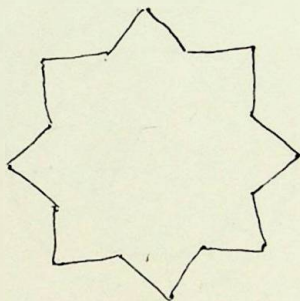
