- (a) Active Members of the Force, ✓
- (b) Retired Members, ✓
- (c) Temporary Members, ✓
- (d) Long Service Members,
- (e) Ex-service Men.

2. The management of the property, finances and civil affairs of the Club shall be under a Committee composed of the Officer Commanding the Defence Force and six members to be elected at the Annual General Meeting. The elected members of the Committee shall hold office in the following manner. Two members shall retire each year in rotation, the order for retirement during the first three years to be decided by ballot. Retiring members shall be eligible for re-election. Casual vacancies during the course of a year may be filled by the Committee until the next Annual General Meeting. The Committee shall appoint two of their number to act respectively as Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer, and any four of the Committee shall form a quorum. The Commanding Officer shall be President and Chairman *ex officio* of all Committees.

3. A Club Steward shall be appointed by the Committee, subject to the approval of the Commanding Officer, and acting under the orders of the Committee, the Steward shall be responsible for the due orderly conduct of the Club.

4. Anyone who is or has been a Long Service Member of the Force or who has served in any of His Majesty's Forces is eligible for membership of the Club and, if he applies, may be elected by the Committee under Rule 1 (d) or (e). Two adverse votes shall exclude.

5. The following may be admitted as Temporary Members of the Club:

- (a) Warrant and Petty Officers of His Majesty's Navy, Officers of His Majesty's Colonial Ship "Afterglow," N.C.O's of the Army and the Royal Marines and Royal Air Force, being on full pay whilst in Stanley.
- (b) Persons not resident in the Town of Stanley, with the approval of the Committee and on payment of a fee of 5/- per month or any part thereof.

6. The Club rooms and property shall be for the use of the Club members only, but any member who is in full privileges may bring in one guest, who, however, shall not be permitted to purchase any article of refreshment. Such member shall be responsible for the good behaviour of the guest introduced. Notwithstanding, no one shall be introduced as a guest more frequently than once within a period of thirty days, nor shall any member be entitled to introduce more than one guest within a like period. The "Guests' Book" shall be kept by the Steward and all names duly entered therein. No guests shall be admitted to the Club on Sundays.

7. Any member who is a defaulter, or who misconducts himself shall be deprived of the privileges of the Club if and for so long as the Commanding Officer directs.

8. During the months from March to September, inclusive, the Club rooms shall be open from 6 p.m. to midnight, and for the remainder of the year from 7 p.m. to midnight on weekdays and from noon to 6 p.m. on Sundays, subject to any extension made by the Committee or with the approval of the Commanding Officer and subject to any restriction that may be made by order of the Governor. 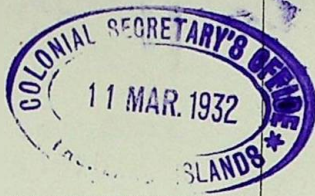

9. The Committee shall have power to deal with and decide upon any matter relating to the Falkland Islands Defence Force Club not embodied in these Rules.

10. The Rules of the 10th of April, 1923, made under the provisions of the Defence Force Ordinance, 1920, are hereby superseded.

Submitted ; with reference to rule 2., of the attached rules of the Falkland Islands Defence Force Club I submit for the approval of His Excellency The Acting Governor that the title, Honorary Secretary and Treasurer respectively contained therein be amended to read Secretary and Treasurer.

2. At the Annual General Meeting of the Club held at Stanley on 23rd October 1931 the Commanding Officer suggested that the Honorary Treasurer should be paid a small salary. At a Committee Meeting held on 10th March 1932 the subject was brought up and was agreed to that the Honorary Treasurer would receive a remuneration for his duties as Treasurer in the sum of £18 annually.

3. At an Extraordinary General Meeting held on 9th October 1933 it was recommended that the Honorary Secretary should receive a small salary. The recommendation came before a Committee Meeting held on 10th October 1933, and it was agreed that the Honorary Secretary would receive a remuneration for his duties as Secretary in the sum of £12 annually.
