


1. - Gommittee considered and approved the Applications to Incur Supplementary Expenditure detailed in the Schedule attached hereto.

Appointment of 2. ctrician

The Superintendent Power Station explained that due to Additional Ele- the increased demand on maintenance and renewal of power cables and the recent loss of two electricians it would be necessary to recruit an additional electrician from the United Kingdom and if possible appoint a second apprentice locally. The Committee confirmed the written approval of members to this proposal.

Equipment for Purification of Fuel Oil

The purchase of suitable equipment for the purification of fuel oil at the Power Station at an estimated cost of £600 was approved.

F.I.D.F. Uniforms

The Committee approved the expenditure of £400 to cover replacement of uniforms for the Falkland Islands Defence Force.

Status and Salary of Mr. H.D.Jones

5. The Committee confirmed the written approval of members that Mr. H.D. Jones' salary scale be extended into and stop at the first step of Scale A 1 i.e. £720 and that his present post be redesignated Second Engineer.

Headmaster Darwin School

The post of Headmaster, Darwin School was considered suitably placed at the maximum of Scale B £660 and free board. Regarding the appointment of a Matron, it was decided that this post should be offered at £200 and in any event should not exceed £250 plus free boxrd.

Model of "Discovery" I presented to Museum



SUBJECT :-

Gift in kind to The Falkland Islands Branch of the British Red Cross Society.

To The Honourable

It has been brought to my notice that no authority is on file for the gift of some serviceable Faikland Islands Defence Force uniforms to the Red Cross.

- 2. The Adjutant has submitted a list of the uniforms showing the alproximate value, and has informed me that the uniforms were given with the consent of the Officer Administering the Government, during His Excellency the Governor's official visit to the United Kingdom.
- 3. Written approval was not given at the time the goods were issued and the Adjutant now requires authority to support the relevant issue voucher.
- 4. Authority may be given under Colonial Regulation No 280 which reads:

"Serviceable Government stores or property, not exceeding £100 in value and not required for Government purposes, may be given to institutions or organisations in the Colony at the discretion of the Governor. Where the value exceeds £100 the approval of the Legislature will be necessary."

5. I should be grateful if the required authority could be sought and transmitted to the Adjutant.

We refer to your memorandum of the 22nd December No. 0838/K to the OC Royal Marines, Stanley regarding your requirement of 40 R.M.Pattern blue Uniforms. Copies of the correspondence have been passed to us with confirmation from the Director of Victaulling that uniforms may be supplied on repayment providing (a) Stock sizes only are requested and (b) Royal Marine buttons and badges are not worn.

In the circumstances, we are ordering 40 uniforms according to the sizeroll dated 29th December. The 27 uniforms for which you have given individual measurements will of course be supplied in the nearest stock sizes. Although we have had no confirming indent, we are taking your memorandum referred to above as authority, since the suggestion is made that payment should be made through us.

With regard to the buttons and badges, we assume that the M.O.D. will be detaching the Royal Marine buttons before despatch and you will therefore require buttons for sewing on locally. In this connection we assume that there would be no objection to general service buttons being used and we can obtain these from a commercial source. Alternatively, do you require buttons to your own design? In this case you must realise that there would be a delay of some 10-12 weeks because it would be necessary to cut new dies. For your information, the cost of buttons for quantities of four gross would be 32/6d. per gross dependent upon size and finish. No die charges would be made because we have a standing arrangement with a manufacturer who supplies all new dies free of charge.

We note that you have ordered ceremonial uniforms but no mention has been made to head wear. Do you wish a quantity of either blue No. 1 dress caps or the white ceremonial helmet to be ordered. If so, we will enquire of the M.O.D but we shall of course need to know the sizeroll required. We assume that you have a stock of cap badges which we have supplied in the past.
