Const J J Lawlor Drunk on duty

Stanley 13<sup>th</sup> November 1922

The Colonial Secretary

I beg to state to my Authorities that on Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> inst Const J J Lawlor was detailed for duty from 5 to 10 pm he came on duty at 5 pm regular. I saw him again at 6 35 pm he was then regular. I saw him again at 8 30 pm when I observed he was well under the influence of drink

At about 9 30 pm I met him near the Ship Hotel he was then staggering and unfit for duty, his wife & I brought him to his lodgings I advised him to stop at home and go to bed.

On Sunday morning his wife reported to me he was sick and unable to come on duty

I took up duty for the day and reported the matter to The Colonial Surgeon
