The exportation of ~~goods~~ the following goods

domestically produced foodstuffs and all raw materials or their shipment as ship's stores on vessels proceeding to the destinations or ports in question is prohibited as follows To all ports and destinations abroad, other than ports and destinations in any part of His Majesty's dominions, or any territory under His Majesty's protection or in respect of which a mandate is exercised by one of His Majesty's Governments. Provided that this order shall not apply to any exportation (or shipment as ships stores) which shall be expressly permitted by a license given by you

EXTRACT FROM LETTER FROM Mr W.J.HUTCHINSON
of SEPTEMBER 29th 1939. .

I have been advised by Mr.J.W.Miller to ask you if he would be permitted to make a call at the Falkland Islands with the s.s. "Patagonia", a Chilian vessel, for the purpose of embarking the wool from Mr. John Hamilton's Islands on the West Falklands to Chile and then tranship same to England the same as he has done in former years.

LICENCE TO EXPORT WOOL TO THE UNITED KINGDOM VIA CHILE.

(Proclamation No. 7 of the 7th September, 1939.)

Mr. W. J. Miller, acting for and on behalf of Mr. John Hamilton, is hereby authorised to export wool belonging to the said Mr. John Hamilton from the Falkland Islands to the United Kingdom via Chile.

The Exporter will in due course file the necessary Landing Certificate in respect of all wool so exported signed by His Majesty's Customs in the United Kingdom.
