#### DISTRIBUTION OF OIL FUEL AND DIESEL OIL AT FALKLAND ISLANDS.

H.M.S. "CUMBERLAND" arrives Port Stanley, Saturday 9th December 1939, takes in oil fuel from 011 Barge, then cleans it ready for Diesel Cil and leaves it clean and empty.

- R.F.A. Oiler "OLYNTHUS" arrives about Saturday, 9th December, disembarks stores to the Store-sheds at the Admiralty Oil Fuel Depot and takes 1500 tons Oil fuel from oiler "SAN CASTO" when latter ship arrives.
- Oiler "SAN CASTO" arrives Thursday, 14th December with about 2000 tons of oil fuel. She discharges 1500 tons to "OLYNTHUS" on arrival, and the remainder not required for her own bunkers to the Admiralty tanks.
- 4. Oiler "CAPULET" arrives Thursday, 14th December, discharges 500 tons Diesel to the Oil Barge O.C. 62 and about 1000 tons of Diesel to "SAN CASTO". She discharges all her cargo oil fuel to the shore tanks. "SAN CASTO" will do the ferrying of this oil fuel, and must clean tanks sufficient for about 1000 tons of diesel before she embarks it from "CAPULET"
- 5. If "SAN CASTO" cannot hold 2500 tons, her capacity is to be adjusted so that she has at least 1500 tons of cil fuel on board at the end of these transfers, the remainder of her stowage being filled with Diesel.
- If "CAPULET" arrives with more than 1500 tons of Diesel on board, the surplus is not to be dis-embarked.
- If "CAPULET" arrives with less than 1500 tons of Diesel oil, the necessary amount of Diesel is to be taken from "OLYNTHUS" to make up the total to be left at Port Stanley, i.e. 500 tons in Oil Barge plus about 1000 tons in San Casto".
  - Final distribution will therefore be:-Oil Puel. . . 1500 tons in "SAH CASTO", remainder in Shore
