It would seem that if permission is granted for the purchase from civilian stocks of the articles required for the running of the proposed Canteen, we would be back where we started, as the required items are practically all essential foodstuffs and would no doubt be in great demand. As the circumstances are exceptional and Army personnel alone stand to gain, I suggest that the requirements at red (1) might properly be supplied on repayment from Army stocks. This, apart from conserving civilian stocks, would probably allow of the serving up of cheaper meals to the troops than would be possible if the stores were purchased in the local shops, and this must be one of the Canteen Committee's chief considerations when catering for the small pocket.
