Sir,

With reference to your letter of the 14th March, I am prepared to authorise the issue of an Exit Permit on compassionate grounds to enable you to visit your wife and children in Punta Arenas. Expenditure by you of foreign exchange must, however, be limited to £10 a week to a maximum of £40. Presumably you intend crossing on the next voyage of the Fitzroy and unless you return by her immediately you are unlikely to be able to get back for several months. Provided you leave the necessary money here, your quarterly remittance of £25 to your wife could be continued. I wish, however, to make it clear that you yourself will not be allowed to export more than £40 from the Colony.


