Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that on the occasion of the unveiling of the Cenotaph by His Majesty the King on the 11th of November last, it was arranged that wreaths should be laid on behalf of the Governments and peoples of the several Colonies and Protectorates. For this purpose the various Colonies and Protectorates were arranged in four groups; and the following gentlemen, who have for long periods rendered eminent service in the Empire, consented to represent each a group and to deposit a wreath on behalf of the Colonies, etc., included in it:—

- (1) Sir G. R. Le Hurst, G.C.M.G.,  
The West Indian Colonies, Bermuda, Falkland Islands, and St. Helena.
- (2) Sir Frank Swettenham, G.C.M.G.,  
The Eastern and Pacific Colonies and Protectorates.
- (3) The Right Honourable Sir F. J. D. Lugard, G.C.M.G., C.B., D.S.O.,  
The West African and Mediterranean Colonies.
- (4) Sir J. Hayes Sadler, K.C.M.G., C.B.,  
The East African and South African Colonies and Protectorates.

2. My predecessor felt that it was unnecessary to consult the Administrations concerned beforehand, as there was no doubt that all would desire to participate in this tribute to those who had fallen in the War and would be quite willing to share in the moderate expenses incurred.

3. *The cost of each wreath was ten guineas. Photographs of the wreaths were taken before the ceremony, with a view to furnishing each participating Administration with a copy for record, and arrangements have since been made through the Crown Agents for a few lithographic reproductions of the photographs to be supplied with each copy. A copy of the photograph of the wreath deposited on behalf of the group in which the territory under your administration was included, accompanied by a few reproductions, should reach you from the Crown Agents a short time after the receipt of this despatch. The cost of the first photograph of each wreath was one guinea, extra copies being supplied at 8s. 6d. each; and I have authorised the Crown Agents to apportion the cost of these equally between the Administrations concerned. The initial cost of the reproductions, varying quantities having been ordered according to the numbers likely to be welcomed in the first instance, was £6 6s. for 75 copies or £6 11s. for 100 copies, and Colonies are being charged a proportion according to the actual numbers supplied to each Government.*

4. *Should further copies of the photograph be desired, either by your Government or by unofficial bodies or persons, they could no doubt be obtained direct from the London Stereoscopic Company, Limited, 3, Hanover Square, London, W. 1, at the price mentioned above (8s. 6d.). Further copies of the reproductions can be obtained by requisitioning them through the Crown Agents. The prices quoted for further supplies are:—*
