In our letter of the 27th April in reply to your letter No.0283 of the 18th March we suggested several subjects which might be used for commemorative postage stamps to be issued by Falkland Islands.

H. E. the Governor discussed general stamp matters with us during a recent visit to this Office and he expressed interest in a further suggestion for a stamp issue made by us at the time.

This suggestion is that a commemorative issue of stamps should be released in 1968 to mark the 25th anniversary of the establishment of the first British bases in the Antarctic. Further, we advocate that South Georgia and British Antarctic Territory should also participate in this issue.

We are aware that the subject of the issue has political implications but in our view stamps to mark this occasion have such collector-appeal and potential good revenue that the idea is too good to be dismissed summarily. Also, this does present an opportunity for South Georgia and British Antarctic Territory, two postal administrations which in the normal course of events have little opportunity of issuing "domestic" stamps, to release an attractive set.

If Falkland Islands, South Georgia and British Antarctic Territory were each to issue a set of stamps commemorating the same subject it would become, in effect, a small "omnibus" issue. Omnibus issues such as those released in recent years for Sir Winston Churchill, International Co-operation Year, World Health Organisation etc., now have little appeal to collectors or the philatelic trade and we feel that the Commonwealth Office is not likely to promote large-scale omnibus issues in future. The main objection raised against omnibus issues such as those mentioned above is that the collector is asked to purchase a set of stamps of the same, not always attractive, design for thirty or more countries. The cost of purchasing the whole is daunting and when acquired the mased

stamps hardly embellish the collection. However, such criticism is not likely to arise in respect of an omnibus issue limited to three participant administrations and with a subject as attractive to collectors as that under discussion. In fact, we are of the opinion that most collectors would welcome it.

H.E. the Governor suggested that we should put the idea to you for your consideration. Perhaps you will kindly let us know your decision in due course.

During the discussion H.E. the Governor mentioned that you are thinking of having an issue of stamps in 1969 to commemorate the centenary of the Anglican Diocese in the Falkland Islands and that you have, in fact, prepared preliminary designs for the issue. If we can provide any assistance we will be pleased to do so.

The B.A.S. in their telegram to the High Commissioner of 20 July suggested a commemorative issue of stamps to mark the "continuous British occupation of the B.A.T." and the acting High Commissioner's telegram of 25 July welcomed this suggestion. *(207)*

*(Snoey)* 2. Lacey's (of the Crown Agents) letter to Thompson of 19 July, suggested, after having talked to you about it, that a commemorative issue of stamps to mark the "25th anniversary of the first British base in the Antarctic" should be made by South Georgia, the Falkland Islands and the British Antarctic Territory. We have considered an issue of this sort and think that it would run counter to our policy of divorcing United Kingdom activities in the Antarctic from the political disputes outside it and that we therefore believe that any commemorative issue should be confined to the B.A.T. We have, incidentally, been told that there is an American proposal coming up at the 5th Antarctic Treaty Consultative meeting for the issue of special stamps, by the 12 nations concerned, to mark the tenth anniversary of the working of the treaty. If this issue comes to anything it would be made in 1971. We will, of course, let you know as soon as a definite proposal about this is made. *Agreed*

3. There would seem to be no reason why you should not have an issue to commemorate "the 25th anniversary of continuous scientific work by the B.A.S." (possibly a more appropriate phrase) as originally proposed by the Survey and this would not clash with a 1971 issue by the nations concerned in the Antarctic Treaty.

4. If you do still wish to go ahead with a commemorative issue next year, as originally proposed and confined to B.A.T. possibly you would formally request our approval in principle so that we can get on with designs and production. *||*

I am sorry it has taken so long to reply to your letter H2/1010/20 of the 19th July 1967 about commemorative stamps. (208)

After much consideration we have decided against a joint Falkland Islands, South Georgia and British Antarctic Territory 25th Anniversary commemorative for 1968. With our new definitive set, the Human Rights issue and, perhaps, a short set at the tailend of the year for the 20th anniversary of the Falkland Islands Government Air Service the year ahead promises to be full enough. It is also a matter of local pride that our capital, Stanley, is the same number of degrees South of the Equator as London is North of it. We are never happy about perpetuating the common myth that the Falkland Islands are in Antarctica.

South Georgia has never been an Antarctic base and barely comes within the general scope of such an issue.

We are, however, writing to Sir Vivian Fuchs who might like to commemorate the 25th anniversary of the establishment of the first permanent British base in Antarctica.

Your splendid list of possible commemoratives is acting as a spur and our interest has certainly been stimulated.

I have just heard that there may be some objection to an issue in 1969 to celebrate the centenary of the Bishopric of the Falkland Islands. The issue may have to be held back for a year, but the 40th anniversary of our Broadcasting Service could provide a reasonable replacement.

Would you please refer to our telephone conversation of last Friday. I have now been able to speak to the Director who has asked me to reply to you on his behalf.

We are a bit limited in the ideas for designs for the stamp issue commemorating the "25th anniversary of continuous scientific work by the British Antarctic Survey". There are two reasons for this. Firstly, we do not wish to compromise a definitive issue which requires a greater number of designs with a common theme. Secondly, the Antarctic does not lend itself to a great number of ideas which may be aesthetically and meaningfully displayed on postage stamps. (2/3)

The ideas we have are as follows:

a) The Elements

- Fire - volcano.
- Air - lenticular or other spectacular cloud formation commonly seen in the Antarctic.
- Water - icebergs and sea ice.
- Land - there are a great number of spectacular and well known features which could be displayed upon postage stamps, e.g. the Lemaire Channel, Sierra du Fief, Twin Peaks at Cape Renaud, and so on.

b) Phenomena

- Solar or selenic haloes.
- Aurora.
- Icebergs.
- Lenticular cloud.
- Snowflakes.

There are other possibilities for a series of four stamps - plant, fish, bird, mammal. The difficulty of this lies with the plant; primitive lichens, mosses and grass do not readily display themselves to advantage on postage stamps. A second series might be titled "early explorers", for instance, Bransfield, Weddell, Ross, Biscoe, Bruce, Charcot, Gerlache, Nordenskjold. There are two possible objections to these men being used in a stamp series. Firstly, it may not be politically acceptable to display the heads of foreigners on "British" stamps and secondly, we think it would be difficult to find suitable portraits on which to base the designs.

Shackleton could also be included in this series but he was purposely omitted because South Georgia may wish to use his portrait. Furthermore, Shackleton and Scott along with Amundsen and Cook tend to be considered as the fathers of Antarctic exploration and have a more acceptable international image which could be used on a more appropriate occasion later on.

Ideas, which we have thought of and rejected, are designs incorporating the work of the Survey for reason of the difficulty of portraying anything remotely intelligible to the general public. A tellurometer or a radar set reproduced on a reduced scale does not significantly convey much nor would the design be attractive. We also thought of selecting four of our more important bases and illustrating the map, or the scene, with a typical bird of the area.

Perhaps you would care to peruse the foregoing and let us know which design or idea you consider to be the most appropriate. We can then provide you with photographs to help the artists.



Dear Sir,

Following our telephone conversation of the 12th February, I now outline briefly the background to the suggestion of withdrawing the £1 values of the British Antarctic Territory and South Georgia definitive issues, and also give an approximate costing for the preparation of new stamps.

Immediately following devaluation it was suggested to us by many stamp dealers, from all quarters of the world, that we should suggest to our Principals that they withdraw their current definitive issues from sale in order to stabilise the existing catalogue prices; which could possibly fall with a bad effect on future issues. For us to have suggested the withdrawal of a complete definitive issue would have been impracticable, but after much consideration we did suggest in our Circular letter of December that consideration might be given to the withdrawal of the top value only. We offered this suggestion with the knowledge that the top value controls the catalogue price of the complete set and its withdrawal would firmly fix the catalogue price for the complete set.

The production of new £1 stamps for both South Georgia and British Antarctic Territory would cost about £800 each, printed in the recess process as the existing stamps. The income from philatelic sales in the first three months should be in the region of £15,000 for each issue. Furthermore we would expect to sell a few hundred more of the existing £1 values just prior to the withdrawal of the stamp.

We would prefer not to use devaluation as the announced reason for changing the stamps and I gather from our telephone discussion that the Blue Whale on the South Georgia stamp is nearly extinct and also it might be an advantage not to have a map on the British Antarctic Territory stamp.

Dear Sir,

We have pleasure in enclosing four colour transparencies of designs for a proposed special issue of British Antarctic Territory postage stamps to commemorate the twentyfifth anniversary of continuous scientific work. These designs have been approved by both the Commonwealth Office and Sir Vivian Fuchs. In fact, both are most pleased with the designs.

They have asked that colour transparencies be sent to you to "keep you in the picture" and also for you to let us know the value of each stamp. You will see at present that each design contains a 2/6d value tablet, but this was done purely for purposes of the rough designs. It has been suggested by the Commonwealth Office that the Lemaire Channel stamp should have the widest circulation and should, therefore, carry the lowest denomination. After that, the order in increasing values could be :-

- 2 Radio Sonde
- 3 Muskeg
- 4 Surveyors

The values will need to include charges for surface letter mail, Commonwealth airletter form and international air mail letter ( $\frac{1}{2}$  oz).

We would very much appreciate your early reply concerning the values of these stamps and any comment you may have to make regarding them.

Grateful you pass following to Crown Agents Stamp bureau department H Sutton telephone 01-643-3311 quote reference your H1/BAT.8/02260 dated 9th May addressed Colonial Secretary Falkland Islands subject postage stamps commemorating 25 years scientific work, transparencies received and considered very suitable but two comments regarding LEMAIRE Channel design (a) iceberg appears very architectural in conception and some doubts expressed whether iceberg as depicted would remain upright (b) doubts as to what species penguin depicted. (226)

2. Values suggested are two shillings, one shilling for international airmail letter weighing five grammes, sixpence for worldwide airletter form and threepence halfpenny for surface letter mail from British Antarctic Territory to all destinations other than Falkland Islands and South Georgia. For these two places surface letter postage is only twopence.

3. You may consider twopenny value would sell better than threepence halfpenny to philatelic dealers and your comments would be appreciated.

4. Regarding choice of Lemaire design for lowest value, would sixpenny worldwide air letter form value not perhaps have wider circulation query

5. Reason for two shilling value is to cover cost of rather heavier air mail letter as five grammes not particularly generous.

6. <sup>Falklands</sup> Please note ~~Colony~~ <sup>Falklands</sup> Human Rights issue due for release 4th July and ~~Colony~~ <sup>Falklands</sup> new definitive issue October 1968. To allow Colony post office to plan ahead grateful ~~for~~ suggestions for Antarctic release date unquote

Dear Oakden,

Further to our telephone conversation of the 19th June, I enclose two photographs of Adelie Penguins. I have marked one of these photographs with two arrows to indicate the bird which I consider illustrates best the characteristic posture of an Adelie Penguin. You will note the peculiar way in which the feathers on the head rise up to a slight ridge. The tail of the bird should point slightly downwards - if the tail points upwards, it only means that the bird is being disgusting! The colour of the penguin is black and white with the exception of the feet which are a fleshy, slightly mauve, pink. Unfortunately, I have not got a colour photograph, but the colour I am trying to describe is very elusive and I don't think it matters, as the feet will be so small on the actual postage stamp. The beak is an orangey brown.

I don't think you need worry over-much about the ice-berg, as the berg depicted in the design is almost an exact replica of the one in the photograph which we sent you in the first place. Perhaps the arch is a bit regular and looks somewhat artificial.

I am glad you agree that the value of the stamps should be set at  $3\frac{1}{2}$ d. This gives the impression that the issue is meant to be a "working" issue and not merely one put on the market for the benefit of fleecing collectors.

The first day of issue should be the 6th February, and owing to the fact that the Antarctic is only open to communication with the outside world for a short season, the stamp should be on sale until the end of the following Antarctic open season, 30th April, 1970. We would require issue of the stamps in time for shipment on R.R.S. JOHN BISCOE which sails about the middle of October.

Ninety thousand of each of the four values I agree should be printed and I hope you will be able to deal with first-day covers as you have done in the past.
