NOTE.—Section 4 of the Customs (War Powers) Act, 1915, requires that "where a licence to export any goods being goods subject to any prohibition or restriction outwards, authorises the exportation thereof to a particular person or place or to a particular person at a particular place named in the licence, the name of the person or place, or both as the case may be, shall be inserted in all invoices, bills of lading, manifests and other documents, relating to the goods."

Penalties are imposed for any failure to comply with this provision.

A penalty is also imposed by section 5 of the same Act for any failure to produce evidence as to the ultimate destination of goods exported.
