Sir,

I have the honour to submit herewith a copy of a telegraphic application received from Mr. F. Egeen, of the Sandefjord Whaling Company, South Georgia, announcing the purchase from the Sociedad Ballenera de Magallanes, South Shetlands, of the floating factory Gobernador Berias and four whale catchers, and applying for the approval of the transfer to himself and his partners of the whaling licence granted to the Magallanes Company in respect of these vessels.

2. In view of the inability of the Magallanes Company to carry on whaling operations as reported by my despatch No. 148 of the 13th November, 1915, I considered Mr. Egeen's application might be granted, and I have to-day telegraphed to you recommending the same.

3. Mr. F. Egeen has been associated with the Whaling Industry of this Colony for the last 8 to 9 years and has always borne a good reputation.



Very probably if Mr. Bogen is allowed to take over

he will run it as a separate company with a
