With reference to my despatch No. 146 of the 25th November, 1913, I have the honour to submit herewith for your consideration, a copy of a telegraphic application received from Mr. M. Fugge, on behalf of the Nektor Whaling Company, renewing their application for a third whaler at Deception, South Shetlands.

2. In view of the requirements of the *Imperial* Government for an increased supply of whale oil, and of the plentiful supply of whales in the South Shetland waters, I submit Mr. Fugge's application for a third whaler might be allowed for next season.
