

Sir,

I have the honour to transmit to you a copy of correspondence with Messrs. Chr. Salvesen and Company relative to the renewal of their licence to take whales in the South Shetlands.

2. You will have learned from previous correspondence that Messrs. Salvesen have been given permission to operate in South Georgia next season with the vessels they ordinarily employ in the South Shetlands. It appears to me that their position can best be regularised if you will issue to them a licence for South Georgia covering the vessels comprised in the South Shetlands licence. No extra charge should be made for the South Georgia licence, and I hereby give the approval for the remission of fees required by sub-section 2 of section 2 of the Whale Fishery Ordinance 1908.

3. It does not appear that the various whaling concessions which have lately been granted will necessitate any amendment of the Ordinances relating to whaling, but it will be necessary for you to take, in Council, suitable emergency powers to cover departures from the existing regulations.

4. These powers should be sufficiently wide to cover the licensing of a greater number of whale catchers than the three contemplated by No. 4 of the Regulations of the 28th July 1915 relating to the

5. As regards fees for next season, in the absence of any special arrangements in an individual case, £100 should be charged for each extra whale catcher, and no extra charge should be made in respect of vessels licensed for the South Shetlands which may be permitted to operate in South Georgia during part or all of the season, nor in respect of auxiliary vessels employed in towing or buoying whales as distinct from catching them.

Sir,

We have received letters from the Colonial Secretary of the Falkland Islands dated 11th and 14th April, stating that our application for the renewal of the licences issued to us to catch whales in the South Shetlands has been granted, and that the licencing documents have been forwarded to the Crown Agents for the Colonies.

We presume that we shall be correct in taking up these licences, which are for our whaling factory ship "NEKO" and for three whale catchers? We ask this question because, of course, the "NEKO" s destination for the coming season is, as arranged with you, South Georgia, and not the South Shetlands.

Whaling Regulations.

1. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the "Whaling Regulations", and the "Whaling Regulations, South Georgia", made by the Governor in Council under the provisions of The Whale Fishery Ordinance, 1908, on the twenty-eighth day of July, 1918, the Governor, with the sanction of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, may during the continuance of the present war authorize the departure from any or all of the provisions of the aforesaid regulations as to him may seem fit and expedient.

2. These Regulations may be cited as the Whaling (Emergency) Regulations, 1916.

Made by the Governor in Council under the provisions of The Whale Fishery Ordinance, 1908, this 13th day of September, 1916.
