According to your request we have today remitted to the Crown Agents for the Colonies the sum of

£250.- in payment of the lease at South Georgia for the Beason 1921-1922.

As you will be aware we have now operated at South Shetlands with S/S "THOR I" and her catchers from 1917 and until now, and by the friendly settlement which we arrived at in the negotiations with the Ministry of Food at London last year, we made it a condition, that we also in future should be granted licence at South

Shetlands for the "THOR I" and 3 catchers. Governor of the Falkland Islands, Port Stanley has also last year informed our Captain A. Hamsen Vermeli of Chu human fumille S/S "THOR I", that our Company was placed quite at the mame footing as the other Whaling Companies which are operating at South Shetlands with regard to obtaining licence there, and according to request from the Governor the Captain Vermali has in letter of 22nd March 1921 applied for licences at South Shetlands last season. Captain A. Hansen Vermeli will also this year deliver to the Governor at Fort Stanley usual application for "THOR I" and 3 catchers to operate at South Shetlands during the season 1922-2923, which we hope will be in full order.

> With regard to the lease at South Georgia we understand your letter to the effect, that you in future also will grant us licence to operate at South Georgia with whaling factory and 3 catchers against payment of the usual fees.

We should be much obliged for your confirmation that we in future will be allowed to carry on whaling operations both at South Shetlands and at South Georgia.
