With reference to my Confidential (2) despatch of the 11th June, I have the honour to transmit to you for your information copies of a despatch to His Majesty!: Representative at Buenos Aires and of the note which he has been instructed to address to the Argentine Government with regard to their claim to sovereignty over the South Orkney Islands.

2. For the purpose of a fuller answer to the

Argentine Government, in case this controversy should develop further, the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has asked for a statement setting forth in convenient form and chronological order any facts relating to the grant of permits covering the use of the South Orkney Islands for whaling purposes or otherwise, the issue of which would indicate the exercise by His Majesty' Government of sovereign rights in the South Orkneys. shall be glad of you will furnish me, for incorporation in the enclosed draft of such a statement, with figures showing the total revenue derived in each season from the whaling industry since 1912/13, which I assume is the earliest season in respect of which separate figures are available, down to the present date. I shall also be glad to know whether you have any other additions or any alterations to suggest in connection with the draft statement.

THE OFFICER ADMINISTERING THE GOVERNMENT OF THE FALKLAND ISLANDS.

MALING PERMITS ISSUED FOR THE SOUTH ORIGINALS.

Until 1912 it was the practice to issue whaling licences covering all the Dependencies of the Falkland Islands except South Georgia. In 1912 it was decided to issue separate licences for each Dependency. Between 1912-15 and 1914-15 annual licences usually authorising the employment of a floating factory and two steam whalers were issued to the following Companies for the South Orkneys:

1912-13 Season.

Rethval Whaling Company, Christiania.

Haugesund Whaling Company, Haugesund.

Thule Whaling Company, Christiania.

Hektor Whaling Company, Tonsberg.

1913-14 Season.



No whaling was carried on in the South Orkneys from the 1914-15 Season till 1920. As from the 1st of October of that year the Tonsberg Whaling Company were granted a lease for five years at a rent of £250 p.a. of a site for a land station for whaling operations in the South Orkneys with the use of two whale catchers. station was erected in 1921 in Bruce Harbour (named after the late Dr. Bruce, who established the present Meteorological Station in the South Orkneys) in Signy Island which In view of the lies to the South of Coronation Island. poor results obtained from the land station in 1921 the Company were authorised in 1922 to use a floating factory in conjunction with the land station. A further attempt to work the land station was made in 1923 but the physical difficulties proved insuperable and as from 1923 the Company have been authorised to employ a floating factory at the South Orkneys without using the land station, subject to the terms of the Falkland Islands Whale Fishery Ordinance and certain other conditions prescribed by the Secretary of They have also been authorised to employ an additional catcher subject to the usual fee of £100. On its expiry in 1925 the lease was renewed for a further term of 5 years subject to certain conditions including the renewal for 2 years and modification of an agreement between the Colonial Government and the Company providing for the maintenance by the latter of a steamship service between Port Stanley and the Dependencies.

In 1926 the Southern Whaling and Sealing Company and Messrs Chr. Salvesen and Company were granted permission to employ one floating factory licensed for the South Shetlands in the waters of the South Orkneys from December 1926 to March, 1927 inclusive without additional fee. This permission

was subsequently extended in both cases to the end of the season but it was not renewed for the 1927/8 Season.
