

Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your despatch No.24 of the 14th of

February relative to the method you have adopted in order to check the due arrival in the United Kingdom of cargoes of whale oil.

- 2. Your despatch crossed mine, No.5. of the 15th of January, which indicated a slightly different method of attaining the same object. I should prefer reports of clearances of whale oil cargoes to be sent to me by despatch, rather than direct to the Board of Customs, so that means may exist of checking them in this Office; and for the same purpose I have asked the Board of Customs to send reports of arrivals of such cargoes to this Office and not direct to the Colonial Treasurer. Copies of such reports will be sent to you.
- 3. In order to obviate any unnecessary delay, I shall be obliged if you will instruct your officers of customs at out-ports to send reports of clearances direct to this Office under cover of third personal notes addressed to the Under Secretary of State, whenever speedier arrival could thereby be secured.

NOTE.—Section 4 of the Customs (War Powers) Act, 1915, requires that "where a licence to export any goods being goods subject to any prohibition or restriction outwards, authorises the exportation thereof to a particular person or place or to a particular person at a particular place named in the licence, the name of the person or place, or both as the case may be, shall be inserted in all invoices, bills of lading, manifests and other documents, relating to the goods."

Penalties are imposed for any failure to comply with this provision.

A penalty is also imposed by Section 5 of the same Act for any failure to produce evidence as to the ultimate destination of goods exported.
