August 2nd following message will be read simultaneously from the stages of all theatres et caetera in the United Kingdom at nine p.m. August 5th. Every precaution should be taken to avoid premature publication message begins.

The message which I send to the people of the British Empire on the 4th anniversary of their entry into the war is "HOLDFAST".

We are in this war for no selfish ends. We are in it to recover freedom for the nations which have been brutally attacked and despoiled and to prove that no people however powerful can surrender itself to the lawless ambitions of militarism without meeting retribution swift certain and disastrous at the hands of the free nations of the world. To stop short of victory for this cause would be to compromise the future of mankind.

I say "HOLDFAST" because our prospects of victory have never been so bright as they are today. Six months ago the ruler of Germany deliberately rejected the just and reasonable settlement proposed by the Allies. Throwing aside the last mask of moderation they partitioned Russia enslaved Roumania and attempted to seize supreme power by overwhelming the Allies in a final and desperate attack. Thanks to the invincible bravery of all the Allied armies it is now evident to all that the dream of universal conquest for the which they wantonly prolonged the war can never be fulfilled but the battle is not yet won. The great autocracy of Prussia will still endeavour by violence or guile to avoid defeat and so give militarism a new lease of life. We cannot seek to escape the horrors of war for ourselves by laying them up for our children. Having

31st October the following announcement will be made in both Houses of Parliament this afternoon begins. Some days ago General Townshend was liberated in order to inform the British Admiral in Command in the Aegean that the Government of Turkey asked that negotiations should be opened immediately for an armistice between Turkey and the Allies. A reply was sent that if the Government of Turkey sent fully accredited Plenipotentiaries Vice Admiral Calthorp was empowered to inform them of the conditions upon which the Allies would agree to a cessation of hostilities and to sign an armistice on these conditions on their behalf. Turkish Plenipotentiaries arrived at Mudros early this week and an armistice was signed by Admiral Calthorp on behalf of the Allied Governments last night and comes into operation at noon to-day. August 19th Circular question of admission after ratification of peace, of former enemy aliens to Colonies and Protectorates and mandated territory of which this country has been given mandate, has been under careful consideration of His Majesty's Government. They consider it desirable legislation should be immediately passed requiring any former enemy alien to have a permit signed by the Colonial Secretary or corresponding officer of the Colony Protectorate or territory which he wishes to enter before he can enter such country. Former enemy alien should be defined as any one who is a citizen or subject of a state with which His Majesty was at any time during 1918 at war, this definition being specially drawn to exclude subjects of new friendly States. Legislation should be limited to a term of three years. It is essential that this Legislation should be passed before ratification, say first week in September. On passing of such legislation I propose to leave it to your discretion to what persons if any permit should be granted in the particular circumstances of each case. You will no doubt consult me in any case particularly difficulty. Please inform me by telegram as soon as legislation passed.
