Charter Party of the Danish Brig
Oresund Capt. L. C. Nielson chartered
by Murrell Robinson Robinson Esq.
Secretary to the Governor of the Falkland
Islands, bound from the Port of el Carmen,
Rio Negro to the Port of Port Lewis, Be-
ley Sound, Falkland Islands. -

Between the undersigned Murrell Rob-
inson Robinson, Secretary to the Governor
of the Falkland Islands, on the one part,
and on the other L. C. Nielson Captain
of the Danish Brig Oresund of the
burthen of 112 tons, more or less, the
day has been contracted and concluded
as follows: -

Art. 1. The said Captain agrees to charter
the said vessel being tight, staunch and
strong, from the Keel upwards, and in
every way fitted for the voyage in good
condition and supplied with all necessaries
to the satisfaction of the Charterer. Captain
Nielson binds himself to proceed to the
Falklands with a cargo of thirty-five to
forty horses, fifty sheep, and twelve
Goats, and any other minor articles
which the Charterer may wish to.

put on board and which can be conveyed
in the said vessel without risk or damage
to either party. —

Art. 2. — Captain Nielson binds himself
to prepare his vessel for the reception of
the aforementioned cargo within ten days
of the present date, and immediately after
receiving the said cargo, he is to proceed
direct to Berkeley Sound wind and weath-
er permitting. — Captain Nielson binds
himself to lay his vessel along side of the
most convenient and safe place in
Riv. Negro for the purpose of embarking
the said horses, sheep, goats, &c. and the
said Capt. Nielson is to employ his men
on board the said vessel and provide all
gear for the purpose of putting them
safely on board. — The Charterer is to
be at the expense of having them brought
to the said vessel; but Capt. Nielson is
to provide boats if necessary, and to render
every assistance. — Capt. Nielson binds
himself to make pens and provide
every accommodation for the animals
when on board the said vessel to the
satisfaction of the Charterer. —

Art. 3 Six running days are to be allowed to the Charterer to discharge the aforementioned horses, sheep and goats, and if the vessel is detained after that by the charterer he obligates himself to pay twenty Spanish dollars for each day, until the said cargo is discharged. — Upon arrival at Port Louis, Berkeley Sound, Capt. Nielson is to moor his vessel in the most convenient and safe anchorage for the purpose of discharging the cargo; and the said Captain Nielson is to be at no expense in discharging the cargo, but he is to render every necessary assistance. —

Art. 4 All necessary fodder and provisions are to be provided by the Charterer, and liberty given him to put on board whatever quantity he thinks proper and what the vessel can safely carry. — Sixteen hundred gallons of fresh water are to be put on board the said vessel for the use of the aforementioned animals. Captain Nielson is to provide good and proper casks for its safe conveyance. —

Art. 5. — For the freight of the aforementioned animals and goods the Charterer binds

himself to pay to Capt: Nielson or to his
order on the first of April 1843 the sum
of fifteen hundred hard Spanish
dollars, to be paid by English Govern:
ment Bills at the rate of exchange at
that date in Buenos Ayres or Rio de Janeiro.

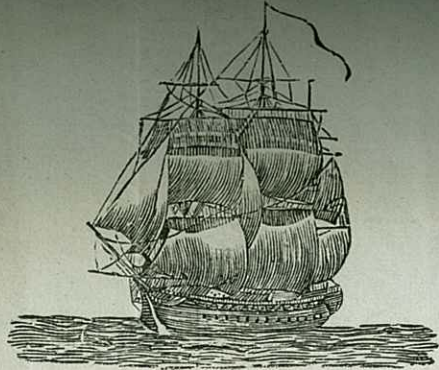
