His Excellency the Governor, makes known to the inhabitants of the Falkland Islands the following extract from a dispatch which he has had the honor to receive from the Secretary of State.

Extract.

Dawning Street 10th January
1844

" I am willing to authorize you
" to allow Mr. Culy, and any others, who
" in like manner had bid for, and purchased
" Town lots at Port Louis at Public sales
" the indulgence of exchanging them for
" equal quantities of land at Port Wil-
" ham, surrendering of course to the
" Crown the lots which they had
" purchased at Port Louis. This
" decision however would of
" course not apply to any settlers
" who happened to have established
" themselves

themselves at Port Louis
previously to your arrival
in the Colony, and to the selection
of Port Louis for the seat of

His Excellency the Governor desires that the following notice may be read and explained to the Civil Artificers and Labourers in the employment of Government.

The settlement at Port William being now established and private individuals being in possession of lands and tenements, it would be no longer justice to grant the indulgence of permitting persons to occupy crown lands or Govt. buildings, huts, or tents unless they are holding situations of a permanent nature independent of any works that may be in progress; nor would it be just to furnish them with rations when there are individuals who publicly prove their ability and desire to open houses for the purpose of furnishing provisions. The Governor therefore orders that from Friday next all these indulgencies are to cease: and those to whom the above remarks apply will seek for accommodation from persons who

who possess the means of making arrangements
with them: either by purchasing or renting
and building houses thereon for themselves, or by
paying for board and lodging.

Although this is the Governour's intention
he assures the above mentioned persons that he
will not lose sight of their interests or comforts and
will protect them to the utmost of his ability from
extortionate demands. He mentions this because
he has noticed that a desire exists among many
extortionate demands for every kind of service and
forces that it is an evil which materially endangers
the welfare of the colony. To all he openly expresses
his determination to oppose such a state of things
whether it exists among the labouring class or
sellers of goods, whatever the result may be.

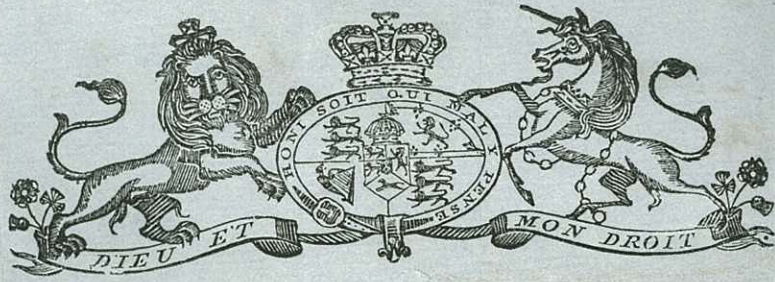
