We refer to our letter of 13th inst. and have to advise that the 70,000 cubic feet reserved for you in "LOSADA" should be ample to take care of a shipment of 2100 bales on the basis of each bale occupying 30 cubic feet of space, and making a further allowance of 10% for unavoidable broken stowage. 

PASSENGERS FOR PERU.

According to a new Decree just issued in Peru, all passengers for that Country must have their Passports vised by the Peruvian Consul at port of embarkation.

Passengers other than those of Peruvian nationality must present the following documents in order to secure the visa:—

- (a) Medical Certificate of Good Health.
- (b) Certificate issued by a Local Authority at their last place of residence, accrediting their morality, good conduct, and that they do not belong to anarchist or terrorist parties or associations, such certificate to cover a period of at least a year prior to the date on which the visa is asked for.
- (c) Certificate issued by a Bank, or business house of known solvency, that the economic capacity of the Applicant is sufficient to attend to his own living expenses and of those travelling with him.

These documents must accompany the corresponding Passport.

Aliens travelling to Peru in second or third class with the intention of living permanently in the country, or of remaining for a period of more than 60 days, are obliged, in addition to presenting the certificates mentioned in paragraphs (a) and (b), to prove that they are in possession of a minimum capital of two thousand soles GOLD, or failing this, a contract for work with a corporation, or person resident in Peru, of known solvency. This amount must be deposited with us, or with some Corporation which will grant a receipt, so that this may be presented to the Consul from whom the visa is requested. The deposit can be returned to the alien only after having complied with all legal requisites as to residence, and after obtaining the authority of the Direccion General de la Guardia Civil y Policia.

The following are not required to make deposits of funds:-

- (a) Scientific Commissions.
- (b) Students who produce certificates from their country of origin establishing their character as such.
- (c) Members of religious orders who dedicate themselves to social service, free tuition, and missions.
- (d) Tourists who continue their voyages in the vessel which brought them to Peru.
- (e) Aliens resident in Peru and who absent themselves for a period not exceeding one year, and who have previously registered their passports in the Section Extranjeria de la Direction General de la Guardia Civil y Policia.
